M. le Ministre, Referring to your letter of 29 January, No. 22/T3, in which Your Excellency informed me that the Imperial Government would apply mutatis mutandis to American prisoners of war the Geneva Convention of 27 July 1929, on the treatment of prisoners of war, I have the honour to bring the following matter to Your Excellency's notice: The Government of the United States of America has been informed that the Japanese Government had agreed as far the treatment to be accorded to British prisoners of war to take into consideration as to food, and clothing, the national and racial customs of the prisoners. The Government of the United States of America has requested my Government to bring to the notice of the Japanese Government that it will be bound by the same principle for prisoners of war as for Japanese civil internees in conformity with Articles 11 and 12 of the Geneva Convention. It expects in consequence that the Imperial Government will equally conform to the above-mentioned provisions of the treatment of American prisoners of war and civilian internees.
