2. The Home Ministry reports on WAKIYAMA, Yoshio, designated
as a Suspected War Criminal in the reference Memorandum, as
follows:

- a. Wakiyama, Yoshio was arrested on 5 December, in Naga-
saki Prefecture.
- b. He became ill with tuberculosis about December 1943,
while serving as Commandant of the POW Camps at Kinkaseki
and at Kagimin Taihoku Province, Formosa, and received
treatment at a military hospital on the spot. The con-
dition of his illness being further aggravated since, he
was sent back to Japan on 22 April 1945 and was allowed
to return to his home from the 1st Military Hospital at
Kurume. He has since been under home treatment, but he
is so greatly debilitated that he cannot take meal nor
ease himself without the help of others, as is shown in
the attached medical certificate.
- c. In these circumstances he cannot be delivered for in-
carceration for the time being.

1. A petition for the acceleration of repatriation of the members of Japanese Labor corps in Malaya, addressed to the Governor of Chiba Prefecture from the "Association of Natives of Chiba Prefecture Working as Members of Labour Corps in Malaya Area", has been forwarded to this office.

2. The purport of the above petition is submitted for your consideration as follows:

"Presently, in South-Eastern Asia area, there still remain Japanese labor corps numbering some 104,500, and they are faithfully doing the hard labour assigned to them by the Allied Forces.

"Many of us have our families left in the war-devastated home land, and naturally we are very anxious about their safety. We are also much concerned about their living because they are deprived of their principal bread-earners.

"On 27 June 1946, the South-East Asiatic Command notified us informally that the Labor Corps would be repatriated at the end of 1946 or by the beginning of 1947. Believing that the British military authorities will keep this promise, and finding therein a gleam of hope for the future, we have thus far borne greatest physical and mental agonies placed upon us by hard labor and domestic anxiety.

"It now seems, however, that the British Forces have an intention of further extending the length of our detention until the end of 1947. So we of the Labor Corps have all been thrown into a state of agonizing distress after such mental anguish, we have made up our mind to file a petition with you, and to solicit your good offices for expediting our repatriation. We appeal to your sympathy and effort in our behalf."
