Summary:

Plant questionnaire was delivered and completion was promised for 31 Oct. and 2 Nov.. Ground plan and some records were presented for inspection. Salient points of the inxterview:

Dispersal began almost immediately after the first raids and was complete by June 1945.

In the opinion of Mr. Hattori, area raids reduced production more than direct attacks on the plant, because of the damage to the shops of parts manufacturers. General opinion was that the two severe earthquake shocks (7 Dec. and 13. Jan. 1944/45) did more damage than either kind of raid.

Conscripted labor also impeded production.

Experimentation took place on jet-propelled radio-controlled flying bombs; information and dewings of this are at Matsumoto.
