Summary:

The legal headquarters of this railroad is in Darien, but actually it is in Hsinking, capital of Manchuria. The railway is headed by Mr. Yamazaki, who reports to the Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Japanese Government, and the chief of the Kwantung Army.

The road is of standard gauge, double track between Harbin and Darien, Shankaikuana and Antung, Harbin and Botanka, remainder, single track.

The five principal ports in order of their importance 5. Antung are:

1. Darien

3. Port Arthur

2. Rashin

4. Inkoo

Coal was exported from Darien and Port Arthur before the war, but due to the submarine blockade, was diverted by rail through Korea to Fusan drastically reducing tonnage reaching Japan.

No operating records of any value were kept in Tokio, but are believed to be available in Hsinking.
