Commons

- [Wikimedia Commons](#) is a repository for images, videos, and audio (media files).
- Everything is free to use.
- You can upload your own media, including diagrams and animations that explain stuff.
- All media in Wikipedia is stored here.
 - The same image can be used in multiple articles without needing duplicates.

Uploading media

- Only media that can be used commercially and that can be modified is allowed on Commons (CC BY or CC BY-SA).
 - See [here](#) for an FAQ of whether something is allowed or not.
- Upload a file from [here](#).

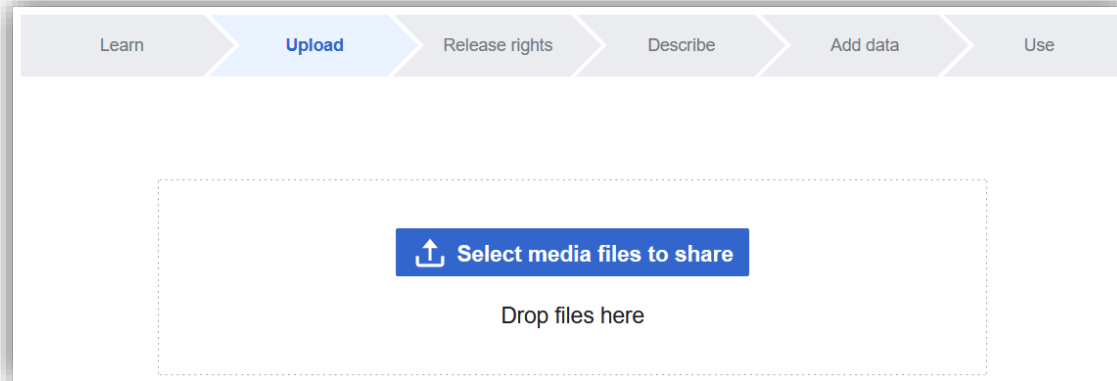

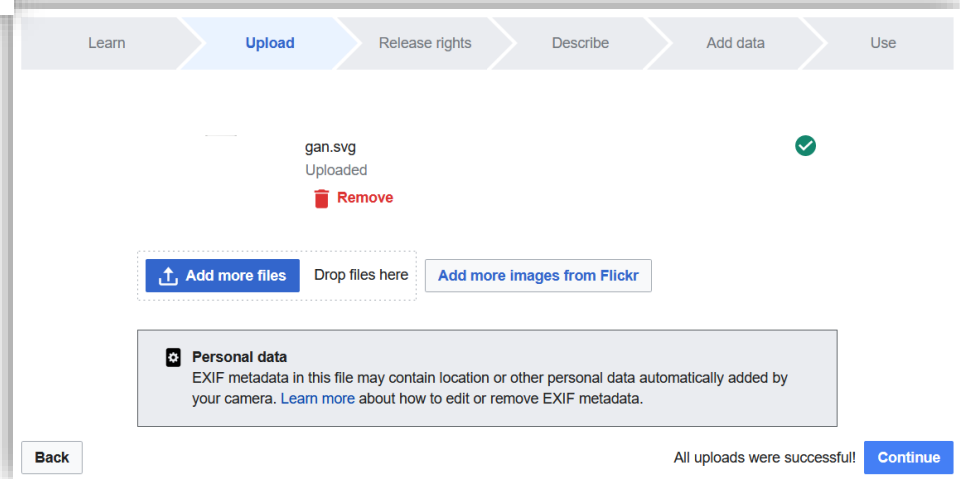




