SUBJECT: Release of Export Wool Textiles for Domestic Use

1. Reference is made to memorandum, Economic Stabilization Board, 24 October 1949, subject: Request for Release of Textile Goods in Stock of Textile Foreign Trade Kodan.

2. The International Trade Bureau is directed to release the following export stocks of wool textiles for domestic consumption:

Woolen Yarn	220,000 lbs
Woolen Fabric	45,000 lbs
Worsted Fabric	495,000 yds

3. The above textiles, which are subject to allocation or ration control, will be distributed under the supervision of the Textile Bureau of the Ministry of International Trade and Industry.

4. Export contracts will be permitted against these stocks from date through 31 December 1949. However, the release and movement of these fabrics from warehouses will not be retarded by the anticipation of export contracts.

5. Request that a report be submitted to Textile Division, ESS, on the 1st and 15th day of each calendar month stating the quantities which have been delivered for domestic use from subject release and the balance which remains until full delivery has been accomplished.

SUBJECT: Imports for the Japanese Government

1. References are:

2. Recissions are:

a. Memorandum to the Board of Trade (Boeki Cho) Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Tokyo, 091.31 (25 Jan 49)ESS/FC, BTFC - 49 - 6, dated 25 January 1949, subject: Preparation and Submission of Quantitative Receipts and Supporting Documents Covering Imports into Japan.

b. Paragraphs 1 and 2 of reference 1c above.

c. "and the number of the Board of Trade memorandum" from paragraph 3 of reference 1c above.

3. The Ministry of International Trade and Industry will take delivery of imports

a. From the carrier or its agent of all commercial cargo consigned to the Japanese Government;

b. From the Army authority at the port of delivery of all government aid cargo, such as TOG, SIM, SX and GARIOA.

4. All imports will be declared to customs officials.
5. In the case of 3a, a set of documents will consist of:
 - a. One (1) quantity receipt for imports;
 - b. One (1) manifest;
 - c. One (1) cargo receipt;
 - d. One (1) draft survey report, when applicable;
 - e. One (1) condition inventory on SIM shipments when applicable;
 - f. One (1) hatch survey report, when applicable;
 - g. Other documents as required.
6. Documents will be prepared and distributed by the Ministry of International Trade and Industry as follows:
 - a. One (1) set to ESS Programs and Statistics;
 - b. One (1) set to ESS Foreign Exchange Funds;
 - c. One (1) set to Japanese customs;
 - d. One (1) set for file.
7. In the case of 3b above, in place of a cargo receipt a receipt in the form required and countersigned by Army authorities will be prepared and added to each set of documents. Documents in this case will be distributed as follows:
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 - e. Three (3) copies of receipt required by the Army to the Army authority at the port.

8. All documents will be marked with contract, TOG, program or other number, as appropriate, in addition to any other identifying marks, such as package numbers, etc. clearly identified. Information on shipments will be obtained from programs, contracts and/or shipping arrival notices furnished by ESS. All shipments to which the counterpart fund is to be applied will be clearly indicated on the documents.

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
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
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
