The Hokuriku Kogyo K.K. (Code Number: 15-1, Location: To-100, Izumihon-machi, Kanazawa-shi) filed the application attached hereto requesting grant of permission to use a reparations-designated machine. Up on investigation by prefectural authorities concerned, it is held that the machine desired is necessary to rationalize the manufacturing process of the plant. Your authorization is requested, with details of the circumstances involved given below.

1. Gear cutting machine (Code Number: 15-1-130)

This machine is planned for use in cutting gears for knitting machines now being produced at the Hokuriku Kogyo K.K. Each knitting machine is equipped with 13 gears ranging from 792 to 40 mm. in diameter, and the monthly output of knitting machines from the plant being five on an average, a total of 65 gears are required every month.

The capacity of the requested gear cutting machine is four gears a day at a 65 per cent operation rate.

With the authorization of the Ishikawa C A T obtained earlier, the plant used the same machine from 9 June to 31 August this year. But due to the commencement of remodeling work and change in its design, the plant went out of operation temporarily, and now upon resumption of production, the plant has filed the application in the hope of producing gears at its own hands.

2. With no gear cutting machine held in its possession, the plant is presently having gears made at the Hokuriku Kikai Kogyo K.K. (Location: Gojunin-machi, Sansha, Kanazawa-shi), but the cost charged is high. To reduce the production cost of the knitting machine, therefore, the plant is required to turn out gears at its own hands.



Therefore, it is requested that your authorization be granted.

1. Gear Cutting Machine (Code No.: 15-1-130)

This machine is planned for use in cutting gears for knitting machines, which are being produced by at this plant. The knitting machine is equipped with 13 gears ranging from 792 to 40 mm in diameter, which at the request of this plant were once turned out temporarily at the Hokuriku Kikai Kogyo K.K. main plant.

The average monthly output of knitting machines from this plant is five, which require 65 gears. The gear cutting machine in question is capable of turning out four gears a day on the average.

With the authorization of the Ishikawa CAT obtained earlier, the plant used the machine from 9 June to 31 August this year. But due to remodeling and change in designs, the plant suspended production temporarily, and upon resumption of operation, the work of cutting gears was entrusted, as already mentioned, to the Hokuriku Kikai Kogyo K.K. For the rationalization of production, however, it is this time planned that gear production be re-started at the plant.

2. The gear cutting machine was found well maintained upon inspection during the suspension of operation.
3. If authorized, the machine will be operated without being moved from where it is installed at present.



6. The reason for application for disposal.

- (1). This factory's reparational machines are so much widely distributed for security, covering eight buildings upon the area of 3/11 tsubo, that particularly we are making utmost efforts for their safety custody, however we should like to attain the cutting down of the operating expenses and at the same time the further perfect security, by reducing the above controlling area, in view of your advice given to us once or twice in the past.
- (2). Under such widely distributed condition, some unefficiency is unavoidably caused even on the employed shops, and therefore we should like to attain the raising up of efficiency on the working process and the increase of production, by concentrating those isolated reparational machines, for custody.
- (3). If realized the gathering together, then those empty buildings will be available to more effective productive purposes, and it is more useful to cover the present extreme shortage of shop-buildings.

7. Relation between the establishments to be disposed of and the whole reparational equipments.

Among those establishments now being applied for permit for disposal, the both shop buildings, No. 14 and No. 15 are in use after your permission, warehousing the reparation machines as in the annexed.

However, for further safety custody, the reparational machines will be perfectly isolated as in attached sketch, from the reparations plants by a board fence after being removed to other buildings, and so they will have no influence upon the custody of reparations equipments, nor upon the production of the essential civil consumption materials, thus more safety managing can be attained.

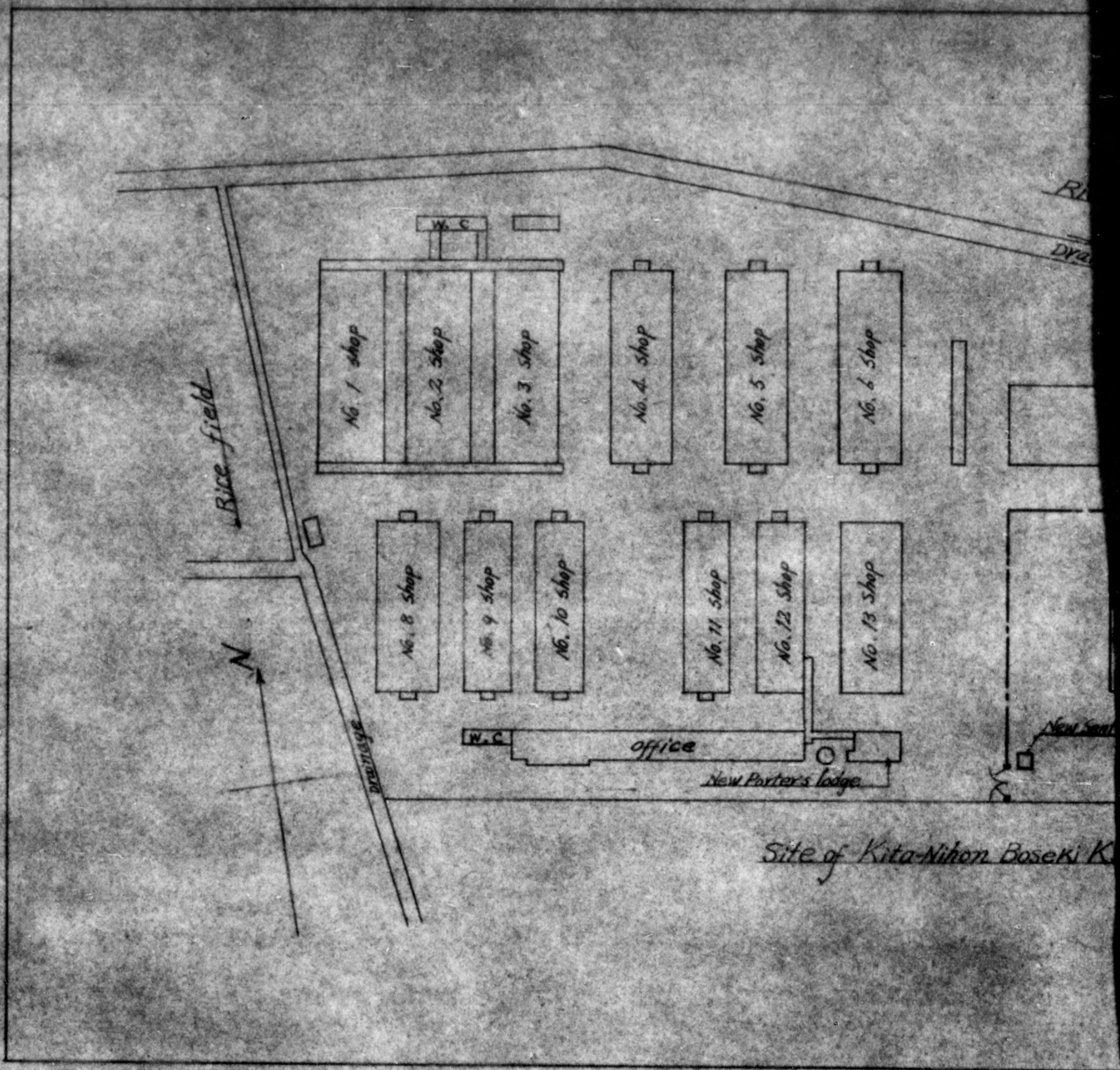

6. The reason for application for disposal.

- (1) This factory's reparational machines are so much widely distributed for security, covering eight buildings upon the area of 3411 tsubo, that particularly we are making utmost efforts for their safety custody, however we have now an intention to gather them together in few places, in view of your suggestions given to us for further perfect custody.
- (2). Under such widely distributed condition, some unefficiency is unavoidably caused even on the employed shops, and therefore by gathering those isolated reparational machines together, the raising up of operational efficiency to a great extent and also the rationalization on the working process may be expected.
- (3). If realized the gathering together, then those empty buildings will be available to more effective productive purposes, and it is more useful to cover the present extreme shortage of shop-buildings.

The Kanagawa Sangyo K.K. submitted the attached application under date of 26 February this year requesting the installation of 2 non-reparations machines. In this connection the ken authorities concerned made investigations, which revealed the desirability of installing the machines for operating the company better. The reasons are given below in detail, and your permission is requested.

1. Blower

The furnace which the company now has in use for making or processing bus-body rivets and sheet iron and duralumin has air supplied by means of a compressor. But this is very low in efficiency, constituting a bottleneck in the way of production increase. If a blower is installed, production will be boosted.

2. Bench-type drilling machine.

Three bench-type drilling machines are all the company now has in use, and they are far from meeting the needed capacity for processing the quantity of sheet iron presently handled by the company. Therefore, installation of another bench-type drilling machine will contribute towards overcoming the bottleneck from which the company is suffering.
