



Ottawa, May 10.—(Canadian Press). —Canada's imports for consumption during the twelve monuths ended with March, 1920, and upon which duty had to be paid, show an approximate increase of \$169,000,000 in value over the previous twelve months. For the year just ended, the total was \$693,-643,211, as against \$524,475,717 for the previous year, and \$542,319,623 for the fiscal year of 1918. 





The estate of the late Sir William Osler has wealth nowadays. It cannot properly be desig-nated a fortune. Sir William delivered from death and suffering many people whose incomes were equal to that amount a month, and some whose incomes exceeded \$50,000 a week. Sir William Osler was a world-renowned figure in medical science. But he was talented beyond that and was, in fact, a great intellectual force who would was, in fact, a great intellectual force who would have been an important factor in influencing the mind of his generation in other ways if he never had followed the medical profession. If he had devoted his great mental gifts to the accumula-tion of wealth he could have amassed millions so easily that much of his time would have hung heavily upon his hands; as easily, in fact, as he often saved the life of some multi-millionaire whose wealth in itself could not gain for him one moment's respite from suffering, and could not even purchase preference in the consideration of his case above the case of the poor man who beat him to Sir William Osler's consulting room. But if Sir William had devoted his great intellect to the accumulation of money he would have any of its people to take all the advantages of spoiled it, and the world would have been vastly eitizenship and give nothing in return.
