Hall was at Troy a

few days since which was the first
knowledge we had of a lot of flour (402 lbs)
being at that place subject to our order.
Western flour is now worth from 5 to 5 1/4 Cts
and our impression is in favour of improvement
rather than decline, we would therefore prefer
yours remaining where it is if you think
there is no risk of lowering, of this you
are better able to judge than ourselves.
we will defer doing anything until you
give us some instructions concerning
it. Wheat is scarce, indeed there is no
parcel at present in market, the last lot
brought 108 1/2 and a sale to deliver has been
made at 9/- this price would be with diffi-
culty obtained even for the best quality,
