



Recipe for Mocha Fresting

Mrs. Vaughn was then requested to give a recipe for mocha frosting, the kind you see used so often on French pastries. She advised as fol-

Begin by using one-half cupful of very strong coffee infusion. into that one-third pound of butter. Butter substitute will not take the place of butter as it will not harden again. To that add as much 4x sugar (powdered sugar) as it will take up. It will require about three and three-fourths cups of the sugar. Beat it in rather slowly. Do not stir it, but beat it. When stiff, add the extract. If desired, the unbeaten white of an egg-may be added to the coffee and butter before adding the


