In the course of time other companies were either bought or acquired. Subject see up a number of mining companies, and SUFINDUS in in possession of one of the most comprehensive mineralogical surveys ever made in Spain. HISLE became the largest and probably the most important single factors in the economy of Mazionalist Spain. In 11/38 it was replaced by SOFINDUS, an organization virtually controlled by the German Government under the direction of subject. As a condition to his cooperation with the Allies, s bject has stipulated that, as he is personally indebted to many persons in Spain in high places, no trouble he caused these persons. Subject reiterated that under no circumstances would be compromise the poeple who had assisted him in his work. A British expert in Madrid considers that, although a deferred enemy national, subject is still a forceful personulity and a potent factor in Spanish politics. He is said to be responsible for Spain's present government, more than any other individual. Has more influence with Franco than the British and American Embassies combined. It is doubtful that the Spaniards would ever agree to hand subject over to the Allies.



The American Embassy in Medrid reported on May 17, 1945 that Serrano SUNER, a lawyer for Marion (Franco's brother-in-law?), asked Barber to choose someone to go to Lisbon in order to obtain some secret Axis funds from the Fortuguese Minister of Finance and bring the money back to Spain.

In April 1945, BARBER was reported to be organizing two cover firms for the concealment of Marion physical assets. G. Pasch Hermanos is the association for Karl A., and Wilhelm Pasch, two Germans acting as independent commercial agents in Spain. It appears that Karl, or Carlos, Pasch is generally in Bilbao and Wilhelm, or Guillermo, in Madrid. ENGAGED IN UNDERCOVER GERMAN LETIVITIES

The firm is engaged in two principle fields of commerce, the exploitation and shipping of or a for and to German consumers, and the development of Spanish hydroelectrical projects using German capital, equipment, and personnel. Since December 1944, their activity in mining and shipping has almost ceased.

The two brothers came originally from Germany.

It is known that Wilhelm was born in Hochdahl, Germany, in August 1889. Hochdahl is about ten kilometers away from Dusseldorf and about thirty kilometers from Oberhausen, the two main centers for Gutehoffnungshuette and the Haniel family, the most important Pasch customers. This may be coincidence, although it is hardly likely that both Pasch and his customers have not discovered the fact.

Quillermo Pasch is believed, by many sources, to be very strongly engaged in espionage activities. It has been recently reported that the U.S. and British Embassies requested his expulsion from Spain. He was reported interned in February 1945, but in May, 1945, another report said that Wilhelm/Pasch was negotiating for the purchase of a valuable piece of property on the outskirts of Torrelavega (Santander) which belongs to a local businessman, Jaime Diestro. Diestro is said to have asked 1,000,000 (pesetas?) and Pasch seemed ready to agree.

The Pasch brothers have been, in various ways, connected with Sociedad de Minerales y Metales, a Lipperheide y Guzman-I. G. Farben subsidiary; with the Banco de Vizcaya; SOFINDUS; and Sociedad Espanola de Construcciones Electromecanicas. Most of their Spanish associates in business are of the group that has always been strongly pro-Nazi and is suspected of continuing their efforts to gain control and cover for German individuals and assets in Spain. The Pasch brothers seem to be undoubtedly engaged in undercover German activities, and, as such, are a known security problem. In addition, their company may already have provided a channel for the escape of large investments or accounts from Germany to Spain.

On April 20, 1945, it was reported that Bachi was sold to Rafael ARRANCUDIAGA on behalf of German interests to cover the real ownership. Most of the vessels of the firm are still in operation.

In 1941 or 1942, Leza visited the United States and upon returning to Spain announced that he had been named President of the International Commission on Fluorspar. Negotiations were opened with the American Purchasing Commission with Juans Mans Cardoni acting as enegotiator between the Commission and Fluoruros. During these negotiations de Bordegaray and Mariano Elorna (Florza?) resigned from the company and were substituted for by Rodolfo Carneal and Carmelo Eguigures. and Carmelo Eguigurea.

Between July 1942 and August 1943 Leza sold large quantities of fluorspar to the USCG. Just before delivery of the last lots, Leza told Mr. Walser, then Chief of USCG, and Mr. Barrel, Chief of the fluorspar section, that a new and Mr. Barrel, Chief of the fluorspar section, that a new contract must be signed immediately. The Commission of contract must be signed immediately. The Commission offered a temporary request for 3,000 tons, pending advice from the American Government, but the offer was refused in favor of the Germans.

Brugarolas and Mans Cardoni resigned, apparently with the approval of Mr. Henry Ellison. They turned in their shares of stock, amounting to 10% of the company.



(None of the above American names, facts or figures have been checked by OSS in Vashington.)

Leza made an agreement with Buttellier, Furchasing Delegate of the Jermans, for the supply of minerals. The British Embassy reported at this time that negotiations were under way for the acquisition by SOFINDUS of Fluoruros. Were under way for the acquisition by SOFINDUS of Fluoruros. The negotiations were apparently conducted by someone named Muller, De Leza and Perez G. Salvador. The purchase was made reportedly at 20,000,000 pesetas, part of the payment being made in Swiss francs. Perez G. Salvador renounced his shares in Fluoruros, because of fear of allied black-listing. Perez de Leza then liquidated all shares In the company but his own, basing the redemption price on the profit made from the sale to SOFINDUS. The payment from SOFINDUS was made through the Banco Germanico, and the payment by Leza to the shareholders through the Banco Viscaya.

A different report stated that Leza worked with the Bilbao company, Importacion de Minerales, supplying the Germans with wolfram and other minerals. During this period he is supposed to have made several trips to Galicia on behalf of the Germans. It was thought that he made a profit of several millions, particularly through an alleged illegal acquisition and re-sale to Germans of valuable mines in Leon or Asturias.

During the Spanish Civil War, Leza belonged to the S.I.M. and is now thought to belong to the Gestapo. It is believed that he has assisted the Germans in hiding capital. Apparently, he has made or stolen large sums of money, and may also have had money entrusted to him by German interests for placing in Argentina or other South American companies.

Leza was reported in Pebruary 1944 as a Falange exterior agent in Argentina.

In June 1945, it was reported that Leza was the head of a company known as Sociedad Americana de Fomentos Comercial y Industrial, which is also known as the Grupo Financiero de la Safoci, with offices in Madrid and Buenos Financiero. He is believed to be connected with Juan OLASO.





During this period of accounting, the Institute apparently did two things:

- a. it took a census of existing Jerman arrearages in respect of the Spanish State and/or its nationals, and

This subject should be developed with Bernhardt toward the end of ascertaining exactly what happened and how. - 5. The Anschluss between Germany and Austria occurred during the Spanish Civil Gar, and during the tenure of the HISEA-ROBAK clearing. Bernhardt should be queried, accordingly, on his knowledge of any Austrian arrearages to Spain or Spanish arrearages to the former Austrian State which may have been involved in and settled through the clearing.
- 4. Bernhardt unquestionably knows as much as any German in Spain about the Baerprograms. The armaments investigations being conducted by kr. Noel and myself indicates that F. Bethke (head of NUBAK) was the principal negotiator; the only other name identified in the German commission which negotiated the program in Eadrid is that of a German naval officer named FLUSS.

You will recall Becker's statements to the effect that the delivery of RE 160 million involved in this program did not affect the German overdraft in the clearing, and gave rise to a claim of RE 4 million on behalf of the Spanish Mar Ministries. - 7. Bernhardt's opinion on the final clearing balance and the amount of any German deficit which he acknowledges should also be sought.
- 8. The matter of the "consolidated clearing debt" of RM 7c million (later consolidated into Ptas. 300 million) should also be explained. Moenning's testimony on this point is somewhat confused in that he indicates that Germany may have been granted a corresponding credit, whereas all other information in our possession indicates that this "consolidated debt" was no more than an earmarking of a portion of the German overdraft into a final debt running between the German clearing house and the Spanish clearing house, and that its due date was originally fixed as November 30, 1944 and subsequently extended to November 30, 1945.
- 9. We are considerably ignorant in respect of the mechanics of the clearing and the number of accounts comprised therein. Bernhardt should be asked to explain this matter, and the usual procedure employed in transmitting capital sums from one country to the other. This is an important point in connection with pending claims of Dofindus against the Institute Español de Moneda Extranjera, as you are aware, and it remains a mystery why the Institute did not apparently enter a corresponding

The sense of this inquiry should be to ascertain whether the German overdraft in the clearing is reflected in Spanish bank credits which may still be outstanding, or whether it consists of an obligation running from the Instituto or some other official or semi-official adjunct of the Spanish State.

- ll. Inquiry should be made into what, if any, effect the change in the exchange rate of the Reichsmark vis-a-vis the peseta had in calculating the Civil war debt and the arrearages in the commercial clearing.
- 12. Koenning states that parts of the trade agreement of 1945 provided that Spain should pay 185% of the pre-war price for certain German goods (principally military material) and reduce the sales price of certain Spanish articles sold to Germany.

Hernhardt should be queried on this toward the end of

- a. ascertaining in more detail the true state of facts and the type of goods involved, and
- b. ascertaining who ther the arrangement—which was not reflected in panish trade figures may have in an way reduced the German overdraft in the clearing.

C. with headquarters in Salamanca, a company virtually controlled by the German Covernment under HERNHARDT's direction. World War. Source believes the factory has some relation to a Diesel engine factory which is being put up in Valencia. - 6. A soap factory at Maliano in the Province of Gantander. FERNHARDT provided all the capital. Doctor YOST, a former teacher of the Colegio Aleman in Madrid, is manager and persons de confianza in this undertaking.
- 7. BERNHARDT is believed to have recently purchased a big finca somewhere near Madrid. Source does not know at all if this is true. BERNHARDT is known to have a finca in Denia, near Valencia, which includes a large orange grove, and owns still another finca, location unknown.
- 8. Secret funds left in BERNHARDT's custody. Source states that Hens Thomson, Nami Party Chief in Spain, who was repatriated at the end of the mar, turned over to BERNHARDT some 1,700,000 pesetas. At the same time about 2,000,000 pesetas of SS funds were put in subject's custody.

From the end of the war until recently subject made monthly payments to some (not many)widows of Gennan soldiers in Spain. He recently stopped these payments to the widows, although source believes he could not have used up more than 5% of these funds. When there was some adverse comment about subject's failure to continue the payments, he resumed some of the payments and source believes he is making the payments at the present time.

Source stated that the above sums are really "small potatoes"; that the German underground in Spain has hundreds of millions of pesetas which is not being used at the moment, some of it in the form of jewels.

9. Source states subject tries to give people the impression that he needs money. He is now negotiating for a loan from the government branch (el syndicato) which supervises the Spanish film industry. He is asking for a loan of three million pesetas. Source believes subject is doing this in an attempt to cover up his true financial status. He has sent large amounts of money to Argentina. According to subject's friends, he has two or three business enterprises in the Argentine. Recently he complained that one of his enterprises in the Argentine was costing him money in tead of making money.

Subject's secretary, Mrs. Scheaffer, has made two trips to Switzerland in the last two years. She also made one trip to Portugal and another to Argentina. Source believes she assisted in moving some of SERNHARDT's money from Switzerland to Argentina. Mrs. Scheaffer travels with a Spanish passport.

She was a German up to the end of the war, when she suddenly became a Spanish citizen. Her husband was the bunner bearer of all Mazi parades, and an official of the Party. He was previously a chauffeur and she previously worked in SEPU, Madrid. The explanation given by BERNHAMDT for the trip to Argentina by his secretary was that she was assisting his mife who visited the Argentine for six or eight months in 1947.

Source states that BLETHANDT has a good contact in Argentina in the person of the Spanish Ambassador AREHIZA. He states that AREHIZA was bribed several times by BLETHANDT during the war, when AREHIZA held a high post in the Spanish Foreign Office. One favor he did for BETHANDT was to convince Spanish frontier authorities that they should "look the other way" when German supply trucks arrived at the Spanish-French border. AMERICA was paid 500,000 pesets for each of his favors for BRETHANDT.

10. HERNHARDT chose a Spanish manager and director for his film company, <u>Secitario Films. 3.A.</u>, since it was not advantageous to operate in his own name. The manager is a former Gobernador Civil of Salamanca. BERNHARDT hired two German employees to work with the Spanish manager in the belief that their nationality and friendship would naturally make them loyal to him (Bernhardt) and they could be depended on to report to him any irregularities in the procedures of his Spanish manager. One of the German employees was Clara ZEPP, former secretary to MOSIG, BIENHARDT's righthand man in Gestago affairs, and the other was Adolf MCHE, former <u>Sofindus</u> employee.

BERNHARDT recently dismissed eight employees from Sagitario Films and Cine Arte, and all eight have filed suit against the companies. Among the eight were the two German employees mentioned above. BERNHARDT personally called the two Germans by telephone and attempted to persuade them to call on him to talk the matter over, and offered to pay them indemnization, which he had at first refused. He later sent his secretary, Mrs. Enrique Scheeffer, to persuade them from taking action, but they stood firm. Source states the two were fired when BERNHARDT began to suspect that they were more loyal to the Spanish manager than they were to BERNHARDT. This matter was to be settled at the session of the Special Court for Labor Affairs on 7 October 1948.

The Spanish manager of the film company, who is an old time Falangista, is trying to persuade the Spanish government to take action against BERNHARDT, based on the belief that BERNHARDT has been giving information to the British concerning relations of high Spanish officials with the Maxis during the war. In this regard the Spanish manager has contacted Spanish Minister GIRON and also the secretary to the Minister of Justice, Fernando or Francisco CUESTA. Source states that an official of the Spanish secret police, one LASCANO, who lives on Serrano, is investigating this matter. LASCANO is convinced of BERNHARDT's guilt, but will not take any steps until he has absolute proof.

11. Source stated that BERNHARDT was on very friendly terms with William Bilton of the British Imbassy. The latter spent several afternoons in BERNHARDT's office having tea and talking for several hours at a time.



This Embassy has thoroughly investigated this matter, utilizing the facilities of a controlled American source, normal oredit agencies, and available files.

It is found that Empresas Reunidas Comercio Exterior, S. A., is unquestionably controlled by or serving in the interests of Johannes unquestionably controlled by or serving in the interests of Johannes Bernhardt. The management has changed hands at least twice in the last two years. All three of the present Spanish directors are known to have been former pro-Hazis. Two of them, Gregorio PEREZ Huidobro, an have been former to be intirected and smallered of Rombardt. The officer of been known to be intimates and employees of Bernhardt. Evidence is available indicating that Bernhardt owns all of the capital of the company.

With regard to any financial or business connections between Bernhardt and Victor Oswald or his firm, the Embassy has been unable to secure any evidence. Oswald is known to be acquainted with Bernhardt and readily admits such acquaintance, but disclaims any connection or and readily with him whatever. From evidence at hand, it is my opinion that Oswald is too intelligent and too well-connected to either wish. or need to have any dealings with Bernhardt.

It is recommended that the firm of Empresas Reunidas Comercio Exterior, S. I certainly do not suggest condoning Bernhardt in any way, but if for any reason the adding of this firm's name to the list, when in the past we have been deleting names as rapidly as possible, appears incomsistent with present policy, I do not feel that any significant accomplishment will be lost by leaving matters as they are.

- Johannes BERNHARDT has brought a patented device to Spain from Germany which the Spanish Army has been using very successfully. This piece of equipment, called the DEZ IMETERGERAET, reportedly sends out micro waves of a decimeter in length. The Spaniards have set the equipment up on mountain-tops, inasmuch as the waves cannot pass over mountainous terrain.
- 2. BKRNHAEDT holds the patent on the davice. Although the Spanish Army wishes to obtain more of this equipment, it is not known if they intend to manufacture them in Spain or have more sent from Germany.
- 3. BERNHARDT is married to an Argentine woman of German extraction and travels frequently between Spain and Argentina. His wife is reportedly quite wealthy.





- 1. Reference is made to your request dated 4 August 1972 concerning Subject. The files of this Office contain the following information concerning Subject obtained in the course of his interrogation by the 7707 European Command Intelligence Center.
- 2. Subject joined the Prussian Criminal Police in 1934 as a Kriminalkommissar candidate for the Police Headcuarters in Berlin. In the period from 1934 to 1935, he took various courses of instruction for the position of Kriminalkommissar and also joined the Nazi Party. He was assigned to the Criminal Police, Berlin in early 1936.
- 3. Due to his past experience as a salesman in Spain, Subject was sent to Spain by the Criminal Police on 1 October 1936. Ostensibly, he was traveling as a private citizen on a two-year leave to study the Spanish police and courts system and to perfect his knowledge of the people and language. However, his real assignment was to act as an informal observer for the German Criminal Police. While in Spain, Subject established contact with the commander of the Guardia Civil, with a regional chief of the Spanish Intelligence Service (SIPM Servicio de Informacion Politico-Militar), and with the director of a German Company in Spain. Through these people he developed further

- 4. Subject was given if free herd in his studies of Spanish law enforcement agencies and received the full concertion of every Spanish agency with which he came in contact. He worked very closely with the SIFM in attempting to counter the influence of the Third International which was being directed from the USSR. In the latter part of 1937, he became regionally ill with undulant fever and was unable to continue his association with the Spanish Nationalists. He finally returned to Cermany in February 1936.
- 5. After his recuperation period ended, Subject was assigned as Kriminalkommissar to the Criminal Police in Karlsbad, Sudeton in November 1938. He was later transferred in February 1940 to Kassel, Germany, where he was accepted into the Gestapo with the rank of Kriminalist and the equivalent Schutzstaffel (SS) rank of Sturmbannfuchrer. Following a course in sabotage prevention at the Fuebrerschule in Berlin, Subject served at the Gestapo headquarters in Breslau, Germany.
- 6. While serving in Breslau, he came to the attention of Walter SCHELLENBERG, who, as chief of Amt VI of the Main Office of Reich Security (RSHA), was attempting to recruit for his foreign intelligence section of the RSHA.

  8CHELLENBERG brought Subject to Berlin and placed him in charge of the Iberian section of Amt VI in February 1942. In early 1943, during the visit of Brigadefuebrer Johannes

  BERNHARDT, director of the Sofindus firm in Spain,

  8CHELLENBERG agreed to send Subject to Spain to gather political intelligence using BERNHARDT's Sofindus organization as a cover.
- 7. Subject worked at various police and intelligence tasks in Spain until the end of World War II. He, subsequently, was employed by a Spanish Service as an advisor in the investigation of Bolshevik subversive activities in Spain.
- 8. On the basis of Subject's work against the Communists in Spain, the Spanish authorities hoped to convince the Allies that he should not be returned to Germany. At the insistence

of the Allies, however, he was arrested on 17 August 1946 and repairiated to the United States zone of Germany. After his interrogation, it was recommended that Subject be evacuated to a civilian interament camp to face departication proceedings and eventual interament as an automatic arrestee.
