## FALI CARE OE LAVNS

This summer has been a hard one on the lawn and we have a good crop of crab grass. The University of IVimnesota in its builetin "Making the Home Lawn" sugcests tre following treatment for the control of crab grass.
"Crab grass, especially, should De pulled to prevent spreading and forming a dense mat that will smother the permanent grasses. Where it has become very tinick, use an iron-toothec rave to pull up the creeping brancies so the nower will chit tiom. Then make and cut in tre opposite direction. What is left pull out oy hand. Above all, fertilize tho grass vell with sulphate of armonia to srowd out this pest."

Iandelions and other tap-rocted weeds may be destrojed without disturbing the grass by jaboing the crown with an ice pick, dipped in sulphuric aciú.

Earir seckug in the fall is recommended for the Chicaso area, Septemicer 20 th generally proving to be tre latest planting date sefe Irom winter-inlling. O!?r weather is then fatorable for the grass while most weeds lie dormant permitting the formation of a derse, weed-free sod.

The crop of grass seed this year is better than usual, resulting in lower prices for fall planting.

PHRENNIALS: During the summer you probably noticed some perernials that would look better in a different place in the border. It would be well to make a note of these and transplant them to their new locations in October.

Dividing and resetting the old clumps renews their vigor, as well as increasing your display. Leave several shoots or buds with each division and mix bone meal into the bed before resetting.

A good rich soil is essential, using bone meal as a fertilizer. An important point to observe is that the crowns are covered with 2 inches of soil no more.
