Another trial of the Life Saving Apparatus of this Company was made yesterday (27th inst.) in the harbor, and the experiments were in every way successful, as the following testimonials from the press will certify:

From the New York Times.

Yesterday the NATIONAL LIFE SAVING AND SHIP BALLASTING COMPANY made a practical trial of a life-saving apparatus invented by Capt. STONER. The President and Secretary of the Company, with a large number of friends and representatives of the Press, left the Battery at 2 P. M., yesterday, in the steamer *Henry Smith*, and, after reaching Fort Richmond, Capt. STONER and Mr. BARRETT prepared the apparatus and at once jumped into the water. Capt. Stoner's invention consists of a cork jacket, or float, which is buckled around the waist, and a water tight India rubber suit, which covers every part of the body except the face. Weights are buckled around the ankles, so that the feet are always kept down, and the body floats upright in the water. Capt. Stoner and his friend having each donned one of these suits over their ordinary clothing, jumped into the water. They sunk up to the arm-pits, and in that position remained, turning themselves round and propelling themselves by the action of their hands. They remained in the water about one hour and a half, and on returning to the steamer their clothing was found to be as dry as when they jumped overboard. In connection with these suits, which can be put on in a few minutes, a tin case can be used to contain provisions, and on the top of this a flag or signal can be hoisted. An apparatus for propelling the body through the water can also be used, consisting of a framework covered with rubber, which can be slipped on the arm and used as fish uses its fins. As the water does not come in contact with any portion of

the body of the person using this life-saving apparatus, no inconvenience is felt from the coldness of the water. The general impression of those who witnessed the experiments yesterday appeared to be that the invention is a most useful and important one.

From the New York World.

Shipwreck, according to Mr. J. B. STONER, may be robbed of its greatest terrors by a combination of rubber cloth and the cork jacket. * * * There have been several exhibitions of this apparatus at our wharves, but none so complete, or in the presence of so many witnesses as that of yesterday. Away down at the Narrows the damned Stoner and his companion jumped overboard and remained in the water an hour and a half, paddling about at ease, to the amazement of some of our coast shipping. Our reporter touched and pressed the garments of Stoner as soon as he took off the life-preserver and found them entirely dry. The protection had been complete, and everybody on board the Henry Smith appeared to be satisfied with the result.

* * * An incident occurred at this moment which showed the true faithfulness of sailors to each other. A little coasting schooner, the *Tariff*, of New York, with a good breeze and sails well filled, seeing two men in the water went off her track and sent a small boat to their rescue, which, on arriving, found that the men were enjoying themselves with Champagne, and no fear of drowning. A cheering reply from the Henry Smith was the response, and with many thanks the boat of the little schooner put back to her home, and allowed the pilgrims of the deep to have their pleasure. These persons clad in all their water armor proved selves strangers to the dangers of the briny deep, and for over an hour and a half sported themselves amid the waves and billows as if they themselves were porpoises or other members of the ilk. The clothing—India-rubber—completely protected the experimentalists, who, after an hour and a half's amusement in the water, presented themselves on board as dry as if they had never seen water or any thing stronger. After landing the gentlemen of sautochone wardrobe the Henry Smith steamed for home, and all on board seemed highly pleased with the results of the day's trial.

2s, imitation. Well calculated to deceive.

5s, imitation. The engraving is fine and well done. The signatures of the President and Cashier are engraved. The Seal of the Treasury is a fac simile of the genuine. Examine the wording of the penalty on the lower corners of the back of the note. The bill is well calculated to deceive.

First National Bank of Lockport, N. Y.
10s, imitation, are in circulation.

Flour City Nat. Bank, Rochester, N. Y.
10, imitation, (second issue.) Well done. The letters *ROO* in the word *ROCHESTER*, at the left end of the words *FLOUR CITY*, are quite indistinct in the counterfeit, but in the genuine they are clear and distinct.

Saratoga County National Bank, Waterford, N. Y.
10s, imitation. Very well done.

Mechanics' National Bank, N. Y. City.
10s, imitation—well done. Same plate as the *FLOUR CITY NATIONAL BANK*, Rochester, N. Y.

Saratoga National Bank of Waterford, Saratoga, N. Y.
10s are in circulation—well done.

Market National Bank, N. Y. City.
2s, imitation—Well done.

Marine National Bank, N. Y. City.
10s, imitation, are in circulation. Well done, and well calculated to deceive. Same plate as *FLOUR CITY NATIONAL BANK*, Rochester, N. Y.

Croton National Bank, N. Y. City
10s, imit., read "Croton National Bank of New York," while the genuine read "Croton National Bank of the city of New York." The letters "N and B," of National Bank in the title of the genuine, are larger than the rest of the letters, while in the counterfeit they are all of the same size.

Lynn Park Bank, N. Y. (No such bank.)
2s. Very well done.

10s, GREENBACKS—New Issue.
Well done. Paper very light, and the green ink of a lighter shade. Dated March 10th, 1862.

First Nat'l Bank of Philadelphia, Pa.
10s are in circulation. They are exceedingly well executed. Better examine carefully all 10s on the National Banks.

First Nat. Bank, Houston, Texas.
10s, imitation; engraving well done—paper poor. String of like kite where it leaves Franklin's hand to pass through the key, not visible.

Concord Nat. B'k, Concord, Mass.
20s raised from 5s. Well done. Vig. of genuine 20 is Battle of Lexington.

Sixth National Bank, Philadelphia, Pa.
2s, imitation. Clouds above the female on left end have a scratchy appearance; the shading under the title of the bank is somewhat irregular, and the engraving on the back of the note is coarse. Better examine all bills of this denomination carefully, as the plate will undoubtedly be altered to other banks.

Nat'l Union Bank, Kinderhook, N. Y.
2s, imitation. The engraving is well calculated to deceive, but is poorly printed. The shading under the title is very heavy.

Merchants' National Bank, N. Y. City.
5s, imit., are reported in circulation.

COUNTERFEIT COUPONS.

The following are the words on the coupons:

"Acts of July 17 and August 5, 1861. The United States of America will pay to bearer fifteen dollars for six months' interest due 1st January, 1867, upon bond No. 785, for \$500. L. E. Chittenden, Register United States Treasury.

FIVE CENT COIN COUNTERFEITS

Are in circulation. They may be distinguished from the genuine by the softness of the metal

DETECTION OF COUNTERFEIT GREENBACKS.

Divide the last two figures of the number of the bill by 4, and if there is no remainder the letter on the genuine will be A; if 2 remain, it will be B; if 3, C. Should there be no remainder, the letter will be D. For example, a note is registered 2,461; divide 61 by 4, and you have 1 remaining. According to the rule, the letter on the note will be A. In case the rule fails, be certain that all is a counterfeit.

The rule is by no means infallible, for the bill may be counterfeit, and the letter correspond to the number indicated by the rule.

NEW COUNTERFEITS. NATIONAL BANK BILLS COUNTERFEITED.

Raised Bills.

10s, raised from 1s. Vig. of 1s, two female figures with hands clasped, one pointing upwards. 10s have figure of Franklin drawing electricity from the clouds, and on back of bill is DeSoto discovering the Mississippi. On back of 1s is the Landing of the Pilgrims. Well done.

50s, altered from a 5. The bills were altered from \$5s to 50s by pasting "50" on the 5 on the corner, and over the "five" in the centre. It will be well to look out for them.

100s raised from 5s on the National Banks are in circulation.

Peoples' Nat'l Bank, Jackson, Mich.

5s, imit., the bill is roughly executed. The signatures of both president and cashier are printed; the neat figure of the two females, sitting, on the lower right, is almost invisible; in the genuine it is very clear and distinct. The back of the bill is still more bunglingly made than the front

10s, imit. This bill is well executed, and a dangerous counterfeit. The Die on the upper right end is very pale and has a speckled appearance in the imitation instead of a dark and lined appearance, as in the genuine; observe the small curved line under word 'United;' in the imitation it connects the letters UNI, the genuine does not. The signatures are engraved, and the bill is $\frac{1}{4}$ inch longer.

Third National Bank, Philadelphia, Pa.

10s, imit., letter B. Observe on upper right margin of the face of the bill the small words "National Currency" between small figures 10. The word "Currency" is spelled "Curreny." The shading of the words "Will pay" and "to Bearer" are heavy in the genuine but very light in the counterfeit. Also, the "P" in "Philadelphia" in imitation, runs below the rest of the letters. Genuine does not.

Merchants' National Bank, N. Y. City.

10s, imit.; The signatures are printed, and poorly done, and the numbering is blotched. The bill otherwise is well done.

National Bank of Commerce, N. Y. City.

Geneseo National Bank, Batavia, N. Y.

Market Nat'l Bank, New York City.

10s, imit.; poorly done. Look out.

Highland Nat'l Bank, Newburgh, N. Y.

10s imit. The green color is as good on the imit. as the genuine, and the dies, figures and lettering on the back well done. The engraving of the pictures are as coarse as wood cuts, particularly the representation of De Soto discovering the Mississippi. The river is black and the canoes scarcely discernible without a magnifying glass, while in the genuine they are plain and distinct.

The female riding on the eagle on the right end face of the bill has neither nose or mouth, and no toes to her feet. There are five curved lines between States and Washington in the gen. but only four in the imit. There are four curves under Treasurer in gen. and only three in imit. Paper thin and white.

Fourth Nat'l Bank, Phila., Pa

20s imit., face of bill is well executed, and will deceive good judges of money. The engraving of the Baptism of Pocahontas is coarse, and the figure 2 on the back of the bill is very much different from the genuine; the one on the left is imperfect, and the 0 is larger than in the genuine. The words "imprisonment at hard labor" at the bottom of note run together, especially the 'd' and 'l,' which are almost in one.

Observe on counterfeit the butt of the musket on lower left corner touches the scroll work around figures "20," and the hand of the female on man's breast, the fingers can scarcely be seen. On genuine no part of the gun touches and the fingers are quite distinct. On counterfeit under: the

words "This note," where it reads "This note is secured," &c., there are but ~~three~~ flourishes—genuine has four, also one between United and States, which is omitted in counterfeit. [Those lines can be added, however, in future impressions]. The letter "a" in "Treasurer" under Spinner's name is larger than the other letters, and while the counterfeit is the same length of genuine it is at least one quarter of an inch narrower. On counterfeit the shield beside the eagle on back of the note contains but six stars, and they are very imperfect—on genuine seventeen stars are visible.

**First National Bank, Indianapolis, Ind.
Chicago, Ill.**

20s, imitation, L. E. Chittenden, Register. 1775 left off the imitation alongside the gun in the Battle of Lexington on the left end of the face of the bill.

**First National Bank, Portland, Me.
Portland, Conn.
New Albany, Ind.**

20s, imit. (2d kind) S. B. Colby, Register, are very finely engraved and well calculated to deceive; the engraving is much darker than the former, and has the following mistakes: the woman's face, arms and neck in the engraving of the Battle of Lexington are black, the genuine are white; the clouds back of the soldiers' heads are heavy and dark in the imit., but scarcely seen in the genuine; the Indian girl sitting on the ground (in the picture of the Baptism of Pocahontas) has a child on her lap in the genuine, but none in the counterfeit. The Indianapolis counterfeit has the child on her lap, and is more correct in design, but not in engraving. Look carefully at all 20s, as the plate can be altered to 1600 Banks by merely changing the name of the town.

First National Bank, Boston, Mass.

20s, imit., (3d kind) the left hand of the soldier holding the gun does not touch "D" in deposited—in genuine it does. Observe on counterfeit the butt of the musket on lower left corner touches the scroll work around figures "20," and the hand of the female on man's breast, the fingers can scarcely be seen. On genuine no part of the gun touches, and the fingers are quite distinct. On counterfeit under the words "This note" where it reads "This note is secured," &c., there are but ~~three~~ flourishes—genuine has four, also one between United and States, which is omitted in counterfeit. [Those lines can be added, however, in future impressions]. The letter "a" in "Treasurer" under Spinner's name is larger than the other letters, and while the counterfeit is the same length of genuine it is at least one quarter of an inch narrower. National Bank of Commerce, New Bedford, Mass.

50s, imit. Well executed and calculated to deceive.

100s, imitation. The only way for the public to protect themselves will be not to take any \$100 National Bank Notes, except they are received from sources of well known respectability: One of the peculiarities of the counterfeit we have referred to is the "T," in the word maintain, on the right hand of the bill, is defective, and looks like the letter "I." The counterfeiter, however, can soon remedy this defect.

**LOOK OUT!
COUNTERFEIT GREENBACKS.**

1s, (1st kind) can be readily detected by the inferior style of the engraving, particularly the head of Chase, The mouth is crooked, the eyes imperfect, and the hair on the top of the head resembles side hair brushed over to cover baldness. The back is of a lighter green than the genuine.

1s, (2d kind) the general appearance is very coarse and may readily be detected; green ink is very pale. On the imitation there is a **BLACK STRAIGHT LINE** under the red figures on the upper part of the bill; none in gen.

2s, imit., well executed. Coat of Hamilton badly done. The shirt bosom of Hamilton is very dark and uneven, but in the genuine white and plain. The shading of the words "UNITED STATES" light and broken.

5s, 10s, genuine notes without the red seal, and others reported without the usual number being printed upon them.

5s, imit., words "United States" heavily shaded. Gen. are clear, lightly shaded and plain. The words "Patented 20th June, 1857," under the words N. York are not on the counterfeit bill. All the counterfeits are letter A, and are $\frac{1}{2}$ inch shorter than the genuine.

On the new series of letter "A," around the figure of Liberty on left end is a plain black line. On the counterfeits, this line along the bottom of the figure running towards the right of the note forms two distinct lines, on gen. only one. But this may be a counterfeiter's dodge to have it described and alter it afterwards.

5s, imit., this bill is well calculated to deceive, and the only difference we can detect is in the die on the right end enclosing the figure 5. The genuine has three black circles enclosing the 5. The imit. has only two, and on lower right end figure 3, and on left end series 90.

10s alt'd from 1s, portrait of Chase on left.

10s imit. There are 16 small Xs on upper right margin, and only 15 on the genuine. The words "Printed by the National Bk Note Co." on lower left margin extends over 9 of the Xs on imit. and 8 on the genuine.

10s, imit., has 14 small x's on upper right margin—16 on left. The gen. has 15 x's each side of engravers name. Portrait of Prest. Lincoln is very coarse and pale looking; imit. are dated Washington, March 19, 1862, letter C.

20s, very close imit. of gen., the engraving is good, in the center figure the foot of the female can scarcely be seen. On the left end bottom are the words "Payable at the Treasury of the U. S. at New York." The A's in payable are too small and uneven. The letter 'm' in the word 'The' is not crossed in the centre. The imprint is defective; the green ink is of too light a color.

50s, alt'd from 2s, portrait of Hamilton on left centre. The vignettes of the two-dollar and fifty-dollar Treasury note are the same. Ingenious persons are counterfeiting the body of the fifties and using the vignettes of the twos, producing a note that deceives experts.

50s, imit. observe the figures 50 on back of the bill around the margin, the 5 in the imit. runs into the 0, gen. does not. The word "FIFTY" around the above 50 can scarcely be read. Words "LEGAL TENDER" is very much blurred. Letter C dated March 8, '63. On the left lower corner the No. 550 instead of 50 enclosed in one circle.

50s, imit., observe the head of Hamilton, upon the face of the note, which represents the line of the waistcoat crossing the white collar at the neck. The acute angle formed by the shape of the collar, so far as it is shown, is perfect in the counterfeit note; but in the genuine the lines of the flesh were drawn by the engraver across the point of the collar at its junction with the waistcoat, for the purpose of relieving the angle of the sharpness it would otherwise have exhibited. This difference is not readily observed unless the notes are perfectly clean. The other discrepancy is in the shape of the ornaments in the border on each end of the face of the bills, and in the whole border on the back. The figures "50" are engraved on a green ground, of which the rim, in the genuine bill, is in octagonal form, rather well defined, though the angles are not sharp. The eight sides of what at first view appeared to be circles, may be easily discerned. In the counterfeit bill the border ornaments, containing the "50" are octagonal in only a very slight degree, and seem to be perfect circles. The general appearance of the counterfeit gives no indication of its true character.

100s, imit. the red figures are much larger than the figures of any Treasury Notes, the wings of the eagle are very coarse—the double rule running from it is heavier, and the curve twice as large, while there is a diagonal shading at the joint of the imprint with the rule, which does not appear on the genuine. On the right end of the back of the bill, the 100 in the circles are inverted, thus, 001. In the genuine this inversion is on the left end. The imprint, American Bank Note Co., is very uneven, and too large.

100s, imit., (2d kind) of the notes issued under the act of February, 1862, well executed. The spurious note is smaller, and the coloring on the back is paler than on the genuine bill. The words "one hundred dollars" on the right hand side of the counterfeit are smaller than on the genuine note.

100s, imit., (3d kind) the note is smaller than the genuine, the spread eagle is very coarse, and the shading of UNITED STATES is badly done. The bill is calculated to deceive.

**COUNTERFEIT
FRACTIONAL CURRENCY.**

Old Issue.

50s, imit., the portraits of Washington differs one from another; in the genuine they are all alike; the green color looks light and pale.

25s, imit., well executed. Look out.

2d Issue.

10s, imitation. All gen. on the top has the word "Depositories," the imitation reads "Depositories."

50s, imit., have a pale slate color. The small barrels on lower right corner are very indistinct. The gen. have six barrels perfectly clear and plain. Three on lower row, two on next, and one on top. The counterfeit barrels are black, and gen. are white.

50s raised from 5s.

3d Issue.

50c, imit.; two kinds of the new long 50 cent currency. The imitation of one kind has DESIGNATED on upper right corner instead of DESIGNATED. The second kind has designated correctly spelt, but on the little American shield, under the Eagle, there is a black line drawn across the upright bars of the Shield. Not so on the genuine.

25s, imit., are very pale and coarse. The letter C in cents on left end is smaller than the other letters, and too far off.

New Issue.

25, imitation. Above the words "Treasury Department," on the bottom of the bill in the genuine there is a fine notched line—the counterfeits have a straight line.

25s, imit., well executed, but may be detected by the absence of a period (.) after the word Treasurer under Spinner's name; the work is better than any we have previously seen and liable to deceive unless carefully examined.

25s, well executed; head of Chittenden; where it reads "Furnished only by the Assistant Treasurers" the Assistant is spelt "Assistatn." In the genuine the shading of the letter "E" in "Five" is unbroken, while the counterfeit has a little notch in it.

50s, well executed. The engraving on the face of the note is excellent. The adverse is slightly blurred. The notes are an eighth of an inch narrower than the genuine.

50s, the "y" in "Colby's" name crosses a line of the coat in the genuine, but not in the counterfeit.

50s, the line of stars on counterfeit between the figures "50" at the top and bottom of the back of the note have white centres, while the entire stars on genuine are in green. The reading in black on the genuine note clear and distinct, while on the counterfeit the bronze is printed on the black, the words "FIFTY CENTS" being almost obliterated.

50s, well done. The last "e" in the signature of F. E. Spinner is omitted in some, and the (.) after print. on one end, and the d. after March 30.

50s. New and dangerous counterfeits of the last issue of the fifty cent fractional currency notes, which bear upon their face the head of Treasurer Spinner, have been detected by the Treasury Department. It can be detected by the absence of a period (.) after the word print on the right end, and also under the letter "d" in "March 3d," on the left end. The paper is thicker than that of the genuine notes, and the general appearance is calculated to deceive unless closely inspected.

Counterfeit Compound Interest Notes.

50s, imit., Compound Interest Notes, have a scratchy appearance, issue of July 15th, 1864. In the imitation the words "three years after date" on the top of the bill nearly touch the words "Treasury Department," while in the genuine there is a space of $\frac{3}{8}$ of an inch between.

2d. In the imit. the last button of Hamilton's coat is $\frac{1}{2}$ of an inch from the lower margin of the small 50s, while in the gen. the button touches the margin.

100s, Counterfeit 6 per cent. Compound Interest Notes. The engraving as well as the paper and the ink stand the comparison to the genuine. The "U" in "United States" touches the die of the "100" on the left upper corner; on the genuine there is a space of $\frac{1}{8}$ of an inch between.

COUNTERFEIT 7.30 BONDS.

FIRST.—The seal is slightly larger than the genuine; the red ink with which it is stamped is a shade lighter, and the points projecting from the seal are blurred and a little longer than the genuine.

SECOND.—The imprint at the bottom of the face of the bond is set different in the margin, there being more space given it than in the genuine.

THIRD.—The borders of the coupon which are attached to the counterfeit bonds are larger, while the red figures are finer than in the genuine.

FOURTH.—The borders of the ornamental lathe work are blurred and somewhat indifferently executed.

FIFTH.—The figures denoting the bond are slightly uneven, while the blue ink in which they are printed is a duller blue and lacks the metallic glossy appearance of the genuine.

SIXTH.—The lines forming the right shoulder of the seal in the central vignette do not come up to the sword, but leave a white space. In the genuine note the lines are not only more numerous, but they come clearly and distinctly up to the sword.

On the back, the cycloid work upon which the words "pay to bearer" are engraved is much darker and heavier on the counterfeit than on the genuine; the counterfeit lines are rough, while the genuine are sharp and clear. In the date of the option the "Th" after June 15th is nearer to the figures 1868 in the genuine, while in the counterfeit the "Th" is some distance from the figures.
