#### PETITION

We earnestly desire that our factory be designated by the Occupation Authorities as the shoe repair shop for the army and dependent personnel. Attached herewith is the brief sketch of the factory. Your kind consideration will be very much appriciated.

Following is the brief outline of our business.

The undersinged had engaged in Shoe Repair Shop business since 1924 at Nishikikoji Teramachi Nakakyoku Kyoto.

The undersinged planned and started the manufacturing of shoes at #2 Bojocho Chudoji Shimokyoku Kyoto (Main Factory) and at #34 Tanaka Kamiyanagicho Sakyoku Kyoto (Branch Factory), in June 1940, the retail business being gradually contracted to the very inactive state by the Gov't control of industry started in 1938.


In March, 1945, we were forced to remove our main factory by reason of air defense. We have concentrated our efforts on the branch factory, which was in due course designated by both Industrial Ministry and Kyoto Prefectural Office as the manufacturing factory of leather shoes and cloth shoes for people's consumption. We have sent the shoes into the market in accordance with the Gov't directives, and have never violated the official price. We are proud of our factory as one of the biggest in Kyoto.

At present we have four (4) power-machines, total 16.5 horse power, three (3) bottom sewing machines, four (4) cutting machines, three (3) heel cutters, two (2) finishing machines, one (1) sccop sewing machine, two (2) out sewing machines, one (1) bottom levelling machine, one (1) lathe, nine (9) sewing machines No. 18, one (1) sewing machine No. 31, and two (2) leather machines. In case of cloth shoes, we have the productive power of 500 pairs of shoes per day, and in case of leather shoes, 350 pairs.

The recent rationalization of production has given us one fourth of existing facilities not employed. It has been our heart's desire that our factory is utilized as the shoe repair shop for Army and Dependent personnel. It is observed that the soldiers are having their shoes repaired at the small Japanese shoe shops. There seem to be much inconveniencies on the part of the soldiers in the matter of time and expenses.

In addition, let it be submitted that, for some time in the past we have been repairing shoes for the Occupation soldiers, in particular, those of the Military Police officers. We are very glad to add that we have given them complete satisfaction. Your Servant,

- 1. 5. Remerke:

- (a) General Affairs, Welfare and Savings Sections moved to the building at No. 30 Shimo Tonotecho, Shimokyoku, Kyoto, which was offered to us in exchange for the office we had rented, which the owner wented back.
- (b) The nature of our business requires all the sections to be housed in the same building, so we are considerably handicapped by the present separate location of our sections.
- (c) Accounting work, especially calculation on the abscus, becomes less efficient in winter in the absence of heating.
- (d) Proquent suspension of power supply affects efficiency; miscalculations and misentries cannot be avoided in the unsatisfactory lighting system.
