Surveillance of reparations installations in compliance with the above mentioned operational directive.

3. BACKGROUND:

Previous inspection reports.

4. DISCUSSIONS:

a. (11-14) Records were inspected and coordinated with records of this headquarters. Inspection of equipment in both dead storage and "authorized use" revealed that maintenance was unsatisfactory. Company officials were advised to improve their standard of maintenance and have agreed to do so. Security and fire protection measures are adequate.

b. (11-28) Toyo Kogyo K.K. Company records and records of this headquarters were compared and found to be correct. Maintenance and custody of reparations equipment both in dead storage and "authorized use" was found to be satisfactory. Security and fire protection provisions were found to be adequate.

d. In accordance with the reconversion permit as above this company was authorized to operate. Consequently Company was advised that the use of every items stored in Machine Tool Plant designated as an integrated facility is permitted without additional permission of GHQ, SCAP.

e. Company was ordered to submit a Production Report to C.C.A.R. every three months by 5th of next month beginning from the first of January 1950.

f. Application for A.U. of 49 items (48 items in T.O. - 1 item in D.S.) stored in Munition Plant has been submitted to G.H.Q. SCAP. through Japanese channel on 22 December 1949.
