This report has been prepared from a study of aerial photographs and a consideration of evaluated ground information supplied by the Joint Target Group.

2. FUNCTION:

This target, which is called Military Works, is part of TOKYO "ARSEMAL AREA" but the general planning of the area and the buildings suggest a Workers Training School.

3. LOCATION:

MILITARY WORKS is situated approximately & mile due W from OJI station on the TOHOKU line, TOKYO.

SERVICES:

The target has direct road leading to target 206; ground information says that all parts of "ARSENAL AREA" have electric train communications, but the poor quality of cover does not allow this to be proved.

6. DISCUSSION:

No definite information exists about this target, except that it is a

Military Works belonging to TOKYO "ARSENAL AREA".

The target is situated beside target 206 and not far from targets 205 and 1135 and has good communications with them. The grouping and types of buildings suggest that they have been built for different purposes. Each group looks like a self-contained unit but the manufacturing quantity cannot be very great. The N part of the target looks more like a training school

and the S part is given up to dormitories and recreation. Ground information mentions that the TOKYO "ARSENAL AREA" has a Workers Training School (Ginosha ' Yoseijo) but does not specify where.

ACTIVITY: 7.

The cover of the target is poor and no signs of steam or smoke can be seen at time of photography but the target, if a training school, might quite well be fully active without much outward signs of activity.
