

Core content policies of Wikipedia

- Neutral Point of View (NPOV)
- Verifiability
- No original research (No OR)



What is NPOV

All encyclopedic content on Wikipedia must be written from a neutral point of view (NPOV),


which means representing *fairly*, *proportionately*, and, as far as possible,

without editorial bias, all of the significant views

that have been published by reliable sources on a topic.

Flat Earth

- Astronomical systems of ancient peoples was based on a "flat Earth".
- Pythagoras & later Aristotle found evidence that Earth was round & popularised the concept of the "spherical Earth".
- Belief persisted till medieval ages & dispelled in the Renaissance.
- Modern day science-deniers exist & have formed "Flat Earth societies". They based their beliefs of 19th century pseudo-scientists, & deny evidence of all kinds.





How should it be represented?

- So how should flat Earth concept be portrayed in Wikipedia?
 - As part of the Main Article?
 - Totally ignored?
- With intelligently discussed consensus on relevance based on Wikipedia principles.



Actual representation

- Main article "Earth" "Initial belief in a flat Earth was gradually displaced in the Greek colonies of southern Italy during the late 6th century BC by the idea of spherical Earth".
- "Flat earth" article informs all the occurrences of this belief in history—from ancient Greeks to modern day deniers.
- "Modern flat Earth Society" to discuss the modern day adherents of the flat Earth theory.
- "Flat Earth Society" to inform about the most important society of the modern flat earth believers.



Techniques to achieve NPOV

- Naming.
- Article Structure.
- Good research.
- Impartial Tone.
- Due & Undue weight. Balance. False balance.
- Reliable sources. Bias in sources.
- Words to watch & weasel words.

Due and undue weight

- If a viewpoint is in the majority, then it should be easy to substantiate it with reference to commonly accepted reference texts;
- If a viewpoint is held by a significant minority, then it should be easy to name prominent adherents;
- If a viewpoint is held by an extremely small minority, it does not belong on
 Wikipedia, regardless of whether it is true or you can prove it, except perhaps
 in some ancillary article.

Handling a POV Dispute

- Differentiate between opinion & fact.
- Understand underlying assumptions.
- Remove all logical fallacies.
- Provide references to all facts & opinions.
- Separate out the issue with biased POV.
- Discuss NPOV variants on talk page.
- Develop consensus.
- Refer disputes to the NPOV noticeboard or its equivalent.
