

The plants are of a strikingly vigorous, healthy growth, and attain a height of close to  $4\frac{1}{2}$  feet.

The large flowers which cluster around the stalk, open extremely wide, and are of a broad, flat shape. They cling very closely to the stalk, and thus each single blossom shows up well, which helps to make the impression of their being in very full bloom from whichever side they are seen, the spikes being nearly 2 feet long. The color of the flowers is a pure white. Only the throat, which is distinctly visible on account of the peculiar shape of the flowers, is slightly sprinkled with carmine-pink. It is moderately early, which is a great advantage, as the blossoming is then at its height when other sorts are partly over. Another point is that each plant develops one or two side shoots through which the time of blossoming is extended considerably.



The buds are of pure canary-yellow shading to a soft sulphur-yellow when opening; the dark golden yellow center is blotched with a brilliant brownish carmine. Our strong bulbs produce two to three flowerstalks, each of them throwing out a side branch so that the flowering period is very long. The foliage is extremely large and vigorous, dark green. Grand for groups. The brownish blotch being very deep in the throat the entire golden effect is not reduced.
