Explanation of the Articles of the Calendar.

These pages are calculated for Toronto, Quebec, Fredericton and Halifax, and for ordinary purposes will serve with sufficient accuracy for every city in the Dominion of Canada.

The times of the SUN'S RISING AND SETTING are given for the upper limb, and are corrected for refraction for Toronto, Quebec, Fredericton and Halifax.

The civil times both for the rising and setting of the Moon's centre are given for every day for Toronto, Quebec Fredericton and Halifax.

The column SUN ON MERIDIAN gives the time that a watch should shew when the shadow of a sun dial is on the noon mark.

MOON'S AGE.—This column shews to the nearest tenth of a day the Moon's age at Toronto Noon.

The column, MOON ON THE MERIDIAN, gives the mean time at which the moon's centre passes the meridian of longitude 4 h 46 m W. When in the column headed Moon's rising or setting or Moon on meridian the letters A.M. occur, unaccompanied by any number, they denote that the numbers given for the succeeding days relate to the morning, and those for the preceding days to the afternoon, but that the Moon does not rise or set or cross the meridian (as the case may be) on that day.

The MOON'S MERIDIAN ZENITH DISTANCES are given to the nearest tenth of a degree for point in latitude 46° and longitude 4 h. 46 m. W. They are not corrected for parallax or refraction.

The column, UPPER TRANSIT OF POLE STAR shews for every day the mean time at which the Pole Star makes its upper transit across the meridian of longitude 4 h. 46 m. W. It passes in the morning from April 9 to October 9, and in the afternoon for the rest of the year. On October 9 there will be a second transit, occurring at 11h. 56m. 52s. p.m.

The time at which the lower transit of the Pole Star occurs may be found by adding 11 h. 58 m. 2 s. to the time of its preceding upper transit.

The six last columns will serve with sufficient accuracy for the whole of Canada.

From the time of the upper transit of the pole star may be found the time of its greatest western or eastern elongation, by adding or subtracting the constants given in the annexed Table.

MOON'S PHASES.—This Table gives the times for the four meridians when the moon passes the geocentric longitudes of 0°, 90°, 180° and 270° east of the sun. It gives also the times of her greatest and least distance from the earth.

TWILIGHT.—In this table are given the times at which twilight begins in the morning and ends in the evening, &c., the times when the sun's centre is 18° below the horizon.

GREATEST ELONGATION OF THE POLE STAR.—This column gives the greatest azimuth of the Pole Star east or west from the meridian as observed at a place in latitude 46°. When the greatest elongation corresponding to any other latitude is required, the number given in the column should be corrected by means of the following table.

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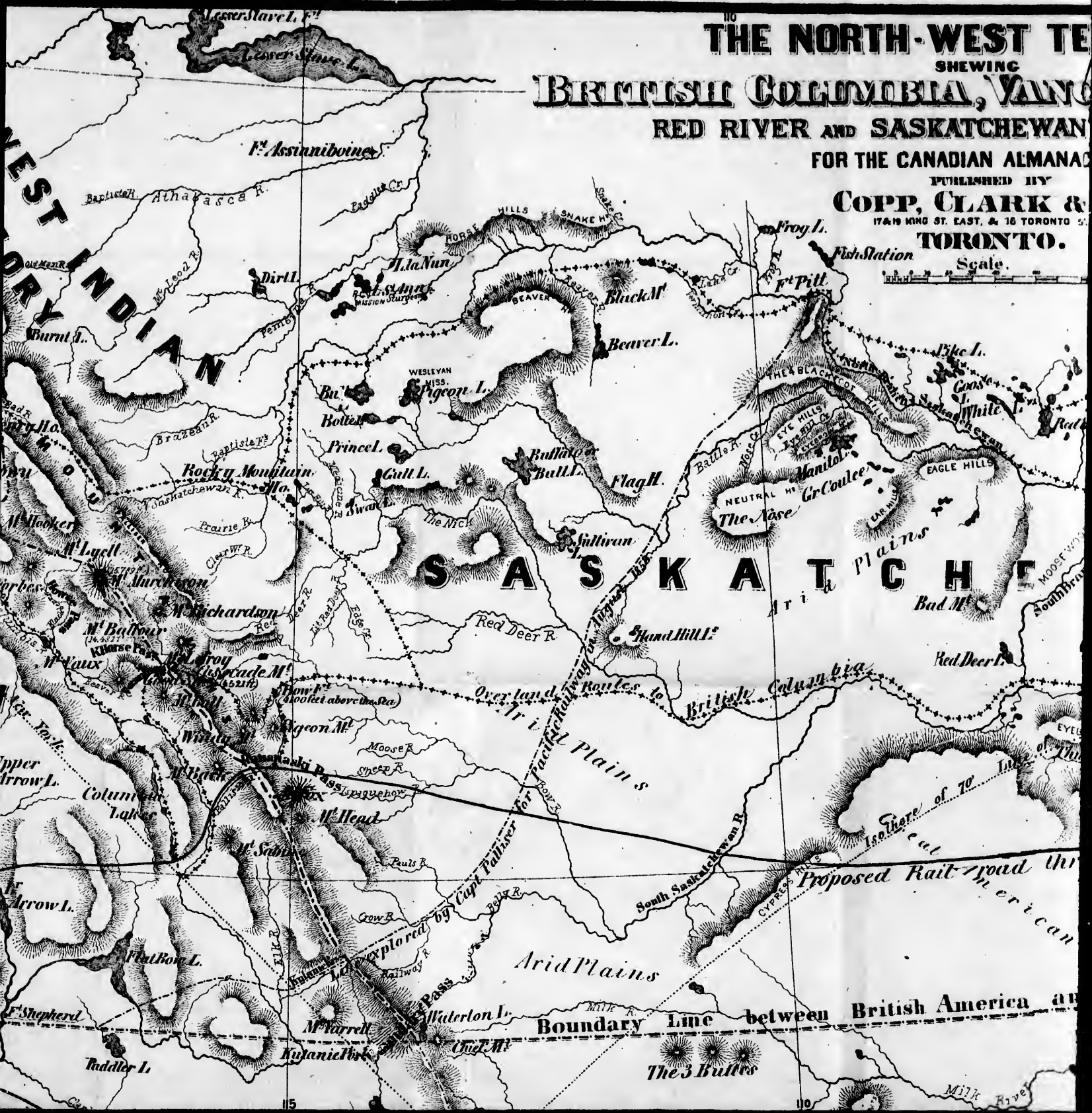

The 1st correction for the degrees of latitude is to be subtracted from the greatest elongation given in the calendar, or added to it, according as the degrees of latitude are less or greater than 45°.

The 2nd correction, which is always additive, is found by multiplying the number given in the third line of the table by the number of minutes in the latitude.

Thus for latitude 43° 20'...1st correction = - 4' 5" 2nd correction + 2.0 × 20 = + 40"

THE PLANETS.—The times of rising and setting of the five chief planets are calculated for Toronto, and are corrected for refraction. The times of culmination, although computed for the meridian of Toronto, will serve approximately for the whole of Canada. The meridian zenith distances, being designed merely to aid in finding the planets, have been given only to the nearest tenth of a degree, as seen from the latitude of 45°.

When the planetary day is shorter than the mean solar day, and commences soon after the midnight of the preceding day, the planet will sometimes arrive a second time on the meridian before the expiration of the actual civil day. From analogous causes a planet will sometimes rise twice or set twice in the same civil day. When two culminations occur in the same day, or two risings or settings, the times of both are registered.

Star Table.

From the times of the upper transit of the Pole Star may be derived, with the aid of the following table, the times of culmination, and of the rising and setting of the principal fixed stars, as seen from the parallel of 45° north latitude.

To ascertain when any star found in the following table will be on the meridian, add the number in the left-hand column of figures to the preceding meridian transit of the pole star given in the calendar. To find the time of rising of a star, subtract the number opposite to it in the right-hand column of figures from the time of its meridian passage. For the setting of a star, add the same number to the time of its meridian passage. Those stars marked (.....) revolve in a circle of perpetual apparition, and do not rise or set at places in and to the north of latitude 45°.

Eclipses.

In the year 1870 there will be four Eclipses of the Sun, and two of the Moon.

I.—A total eclipse of the Moon, January 16-17, 1870.

No eclipse will be visible at Halifax, as the Moon will set before the first contact with the Penumbra. The Moon will also set at Halifax and London and all intermediate stations before the first contact with the shadow. Hence the only phase visible will be the first contact with the Penumbra, which occurs at the local astronomical time given in the following table:—

II.—A partial eclipse of the Sun, January 31, 1870, invisible in Canada.

III.—A partial eclipse of the Sun, June 28, 1870, invisible in Canada.

IV.—A total eclipse of the Moon, July 12, 1870.

The total phase will end before the Moon rises in Canada. The last contact with the shadow will be seen at Halifax and Fredericton soon after the rising of the Moon; and the last contact with the Penumbra will be visible at all the stations in the following table.

V.—A partial eclipse of the Sun, July 27, 1870, invisible in Canada.

VI.—A total eclipse of the Sun, December 21-22, 1870, visible (as a partial one) in some parts of Canada.

From a point in or near Halifax, in latitude 44° 41' N. and longitude 4h. 14m. 44s. W.

The Sun rises partially eclipsed.

The magnitude of the eclipse at sunrise 0.205 (Sun's diameter = 1).

Last contact occurs December 21, 19h 55.5m. mean astronomical time at Halifax.

Angle from the North Pole at last contact 80° towards the East (for direct image).

As seen from a point in or near Fredericton, in latitude 46° 3' N. and longitude 4h. 24m. 52sec. a space of about ten seconds of arc will intervene between the limbs of the Sun and Moon at the time of sunrise.

The eclipse will be invisible at Quebec and Toronto.

EXPLANATION OF LOAN TABLES.

TABLE I. gives the instalment payable at the end of each month, quarter, half-year, or year, to repay a loan of \$1000 in the periods given in the left hand column, interest being reckoned at the half-yearly rates placed at the heads of the columns. These instalments are given exact to the nearest cent above the true value.

The equivalent rates per cent. of interest are as follows:

5 per cent. half-yearly is	10.25	yearly, or 2.46951 quarterly, or 0.81649 monthly.

TABLE II. gives the present value of an instalment of \$1 payable as above during the periods named.

TABLE III. gives the present value of \$1 due at the end of any number of months from one to twelve.

TABLE IV. gives the amount with interest of \$1 for any number of months from one to twelve.

By aid of Table II, the present value of the instalments on a loan for any exact number of years is at once found, and, by aid of Table III, or IV, the same for a broken period of a number of years and some months, can be found—as follows. From Table II, take the present value for the named number of years and discount it for the number of months by multiplying it by the factor corresponding to that number in Table III; then add to it the present value, taken from Table III, of the several instalments payable during the broken period of months. For example, required the present value of a quarterly instalment of \$100, unexpired period being 7 years and 5 months, half-yearly rate of interest being 5½ per cent.

From Table II, present value of instalment of \$100 for 7 years is 1943.95
 Multiply this by the factor for 5 months, from Table III, 0.9363633,

giving	1859.12
and the present value of the instalment due at end of 5 months	98.23
.....	95.64
giving	2052.99

The same may be done by aid of Table IV—as follows. Take the present value of the instalment from Table II, for the whole number of years next greater than the broken period, and find the amount of it for the difference between the given number of months and one year, by multiplying it by the factor corresponding to that difference to Table IV. Then subtract from it the amount (with interest) of the instalments paid during that difference, as given in Table IV. Thus the above example might be worked as follows.

From Table II, present value of instalment of \$100 for 8 years is..... 2120.82
 Multiply this by the factor for 7 months from Table IV, 1.064466,

giving	2257.51
Subtract the amount of the instalment paid 4 months before.....	103.63

(10.) Two cords, one of 6 feet and the other of 8 feet in length, are attached to a weight of 100 lbs. and fastened at their other extremities to two hooks in the ceiling 10 feet apart. Required the strain on each cord?

THE COPYRIGHT ACT OF 1869, THE TRADE MARK AND DESIGN ACT OF 1868, AND THE PATENT ACT OF 1869.*

GENERAL RULES.

1. There is no necessity for any personal appearance at the Patent Office, unless specially called for by order of the Commissioner or the Deputy Commissioner, every transaction being carried on by writing.

2. In every case the applicant or depositor of any paper is responsible for the merits of his allegations and of the validity of the instruments furnished by him or his agent.

3. The correspondence is carried on with the applicant, or with the agent who has remitted or transmitted the papers to the office, but with one person only.

4. All papers are to be clearly and neatly written on foolscap paper, and every word of them is to be distinctly legible in order that no difficulty should be met with in the taking cognizance of, and in registering and copying them.

5. All communications are to be addressed in the following words: "To the Commissioner of Patents, Ottawa."

6. As regards proceedings not specially provided for in the following forms, any form being conformable to the letter and spirit of the laws will be accepted, and if not so conformable will be returned for correction.

The present form, otherwise remaining the same, will be altered in some particulars to meet the circumstances of the case, when the Patent is given to joint inventors, to an assignee or assignees, to legal representatives, or when it is a Patent extending a former Patent to the whole of the Dominion, or as a re-issue, or in any other special case.

17. The models required by law must be neat and substantial working models, the dimensions of which are not to exceed, in any case, eighteen inches in their longest side, unless otherwise allowed by special permission previously obtained; such models must be so constructed as to show exactly every part of the invention and its mode of working. In cases where samples of ingredients and samples of the composition made of such ingredients (neither of which being dangerous or explosive substances) are required by law they must be contained in glass bottles properly arranged. Both models and bottles must bear the name of the inventor, the title of the invention, and the date of the application; and they must be furnished to the Patent Office free of every charge and delivered in good order.

18. All fees required by law shall be transmitted with the application to which they appertain in values not subject to any discount, and be better made, whenever practicable, in Post Office money order, enclosed in registered letters.

19. All applications must be proceeded with and perfected within two years after the lodging of the petition in default of which it will be regarded as abandoned, and all previous proceedings and payment of fees will be held at the expiration of that period as of no avail.

20. Two or more separate inventions cannot be claimed in one application, nor patented in one patent, unless they are so dependent of and connected with each other as to be necessarily taken together to obtain the end sought for by the inventor; and in this latter case the Commissioner of Patents is the judge as to whether or not the pretensions of the applicant are founded in fact and reason.

21. The filing of a protest against the issuing of a patent shall not be taken in itself as a sufficient reason to withhold the granting of such patent to an applicant.

22. In cases of doubt, and in accordance with the letter and meaning of the law, Patents may be issued

for an invention already patented, a trial before a judicial tribunal being in such cases the only means of discovering who is the real or first inventor.

23. A Caveat must be composed of a specification [and drawings], and as long as it remain uninterfered with, and that the filer is not called upon to lodge his application in due form on account of an interfering application, the said proprietor thereof can lodge with it additional papers, provided these papers are relevant exclusively to the perfecting of the same invention in progress of completion.

24. All cases connected with the intricate and multifarious proceedings issuing from the working of a law of Patents of Invention, which are not specially defined and provided for in these rules, shall be decided in accordance with the merits of each case by authority of the Commissioner of Patents, and the decision shall be communicated to the interested parties, through the Departmental correspondent of the Patent Office.

NOTICE.

The correspondence with the Department is carried, through the Canadian Mail, free of postage.

The forwarding of any paper should always be accompanied by a letter, and a separate letter should be written in relation to each distinct subject.

It is particularly recommended that reference should be made to the law before writing on any subject to the Department; in order to avoid unnecessary explanations and useless loss of time and labour; and it is also recommended, and in every case to have the papers and drawings prepared by a competent person, for the interest both of the applicant and of the public service.

A sufficient margin should be left on every paper, and specially on specifications and assignments for the insertion of references, or certificates, and for the affixing of the seal thereto.

Although it is optional for the applicant to annex drawings to the specification of a Caveat or not, still it is important, in the interest of the party, always to attach drawings to the said specification.

It must be remembered that the better papers are executed, the sooner the work is despatched at the office, and the surer the regularity of the proceedings is guaranteed.

It must be remembered, when drawing the Petition for a Patent of Invention that, if a change in the residence mentioned has taken place during the year next to the date of the Petition, the change or changes should be mentioned in accordance with the 12th Section of the Patent Act, of 1869.

TABLE OF STAMP DUTIES.

On every promissory note, draft, or bill of exchange, not less than \$25, 1 cent; over \$25 to \$50, 2 cents; over \$50 to \$100, 2 cents.

On every promissory note, draft, or bill of exchange, executed singly, for the first \$100, 3 cents; for every additional \$100, or fraction of a \$100, 2 cents.

On every draft or bill of exchange executed in duplicate, for the first \$100, 2 cents; for every additional \$100, or fraction thereof, 2 cents.

On every draft or bill of exchange executed in more than two parts, for each part for the first \$100, 1 cent; for every additional \$100, or fraction thereof, 1 cent.

The duties to be paid by stamps affixed to each Promissory Note, Draft, or Bill of Exchange; but the person affixing such stamp shall, at the time of affixing the same, write or stamp thereon the date at which it is affixed, and each stamp shall be held *prima facie* to have been affixed at the date stamped or written thereon, and, if no date be so stamped or written thereon, such adhesive stamp shall be of no avail.

Punish for neglecting to affix stamps, or for wilfully writing or stamping a false date thereon, \$100.

The Governor in Council may direct stamped paper to be prepared for the purposes of this Act.

PRACTICE COURT AND CHAMBERS.—One of the Common Law Judges holds a Court during each Term, called the "Practice Court," for hearing matters relating to the adding or justifying bail, discharging insolvent debtors, administering oaths, hearing and determining matters on motion, and making rules and orders in causes and business depending in either of said law courts. Chambers are held each day in Common Law and Chancery by one of the judges of the said courts, for such business relating to suits therein as may be transacted by a single judge out of court. Routine business in Chancery Chambers, by a recent order, is also taken before T. W. Taylor, the Judge's Secretary. *Clerk, Common Law Chambers*—W. B. Howard. *Reporter in Practice Court and Common Law Chambers*—Henry O'Brien. *Reporter Chancery Chambers*—Charles W. Cooper.

HEIR AND DEVISEE COURT.—Commissioners, the Judges of the Superior Courts, and such other persons as may be appointed by commission under the Great Seal. Their duties are to determine claims to lands in Upper Canada, for which no patent has issued from the Crown; in favour of the proper claimants, whether as heirs, devisees or assignees. *Sittings* at Toronto, first Monday in January and July in each year. *Clerk of Commissioners*, W. B. Howard.

COUNTY COURTS.—Presided over by a resident Judge in each county. Their jurisdiction extends to all personal actions where the debt or damages claimed do not exceed £50; and to all suits relating to debt, covenant or contracts, where the amount is ascertained by the acts of the parties or signature of the defendant, in £100; and to all bail bonds and recognizances of bail given in the County Court, to any amount; but not to cases involving the title to lands, validity of wills, or actions for libel, slander, &c.

con., or seduction. An appeal lies to either of the Superior Courts of Law.

SURROGATE COURTS.—The jurisdiction of these Courts relates to all testamentary matters and causes, and to the granting or revoking of probate of wills, and letters of administration of the effects of deceased persons having estate or effects in Upper Canada, and all matters arising out of or connected with the grant or revocation of probate or administration, subject to an appeal to the Court of Chancery. The County Judges are also Judges of the Surrogate Courts. *Chief Surrogate Clerk at Toronto*—Sir J. L. Robinson, Bart.

COURTS OF GENERAL SESSIONS.—The County Judge in each county, holds a Court of General Sessions in his county semi-annually on the second Tuesday in June and December, except in the county of York, in which county said court is held three times, commencing on the second Tuesday in March, July and December, for the trial of cases of felony and misdemeanor, but treason and capital felonies are exempted from their jurisdiction.

SPEEDY TRIALS OUT OF SESSION.—By the Act of the Parliament of Canada, 32 Vic., cap. 11, sup., any person committed to jail for trial, on charge of being guilty of any offence for which he may be tried at a Court of General Sessions, may, with his own consent, and subject to the provisions of the said Act in that behalf, be forthwith tried by the Judge of the County Court and General Sessions without a jury, and if convicted be sentenced by the said Judge, and the Judge sitting on any such trial for all the purposes thereof, is constituted a Court of Record, and the record in any such case shall be filed among the records of the Court of General Sessions last mentioned.

INSOLVENT DEBTORS' COURTS.—By the "Insolvent Acts of 1864 and 1865," 27 & 28 Victoria, cap. 67, and 29 Vic. cap. 18, provision is made "for the settlement of the estates of insolvent debtors, for giving effect to arrangements between them and their creditors, and for the punishment of fraud." In the Province of Quebec, this enactment applies to traders only. In the Province of Ontario, to all persons whether traders or non-traders. In these courts, the county court Judge in each county presides—the only appointments made in pursuance of this statute being those of "official assignees," who are to be nominated "by the Board of Trade at any place, or the council thereof, within the county or district in which such Board of Trade exists, or in any county or district adjacent thereto in which there is no Board of Trade."

DIVISION COURTS.—For the summary disposal of cases by a Judge; but a jury of five persons may be demanded in certain cases. Their jurisdiction extends to actions of debt or contract amounting to £20; injuries or torts to personal chattels amounting to £10; and personal actions to that amount, if not excepted from their jurisdiction; but not to actions for gambling debts, liquors drunk in a tavern, or notes of hand given therefor, ejectment, title to land, &c., or any toll, custom or franchise, will or settlement, malicious prosecution, libel, slander, crim. con., seduction or breach of promise, or actions against a J. P. for anything done by him in the execution of his office, if he objects to it. Each judicial district is divided into court divisions, and courts are held once in two months in each division, or oftener, at the discretion of the Judge. The Divisions are established by the Courts of General Sessions, and in certain cases by the Judges.

Pleas in their several counties as the present incumbents vacate by death or otherwise.

CLERK OF THE PROCESS.—For sealing and issuing Writs of Summons and other Writs in the Queen's Bench and Common Pleas (alternately)—Alan Cameron. *Assist. Clerk*—C. Ansell Steward (acting). The Deputy Clerks of the Crown in the several Counties are supplied with writs from Toronto, and re-issue the same in their respective counties.

Terms of the Courts.

COURT OF ERROR AND APPEAL.—This Court holds its sittings twice a year at Toronto, in the months of January and June, upon such days as it may by rule or order from time to time appoint, and may adjourn such sitting from day to day, or for any such longer period as it may deem expedient, and may also appoint days for giving judgment or for disposing of business as in its discretion it shall see fit.

LAW TERMS.—Hilary begins first Monday in February, and ends Saturday of the ensuing week; Easter begins 3rd Monday in May, and ends Saturday of the second week thereafter; Michaelmas begins third Monday in November and ends Saturday of the second week thereafter. By the act 29 & 30 Vic. cap. 40, Trinity Term, hitherto commencing on the Monday after the 21st August, is abolished; but the same statute gives power to the Courts of Queen's Bench and Common Pleas, at their discretion, to hold sittings in lane in time of vacation (except long vacation), by virtue of a rule or order of the court, respectively to be made in or out of term, for the hearing of such special cases or rules for new trials as shall be named in a list to be attached to any such rule or order, and for giving of judgments in cases previously argued, and for disposing of such other business as the court in its discretion shall see fit. Notice of such rules to be given in form and manner prescribed by the act, six clear days before the day appointed.

CHANCERY TERMS.—*Examination Terms.*—From 1st Tuesday of February to the Saturday after 2nd Tuesday of April; and from 1st Tuesday of September to the Saturday after 1st Tuesday of November. *Hearing Terms.*—From 4th Monday in April until Saturday of the following week; and from 3rd Monday in November until Saturday of the following week. The Court also sits every Tuesday (except during the regular vacations) throughout the year, for hearing motions for Decrees, motions for or to dissolve special injunctions, and appeals from the reports of the Master or Deputy Masters.

LONG VACATION extends from the 1st of July to the 21st of August.

COUNTY COURT TERMS.—The several County Courts in Ontario hold, semi-annually, terms to commence on the first Monday in Jan. and July and end the following Saturday, except the County Court of the county of York, which holds three terms, to commence respectively, on the first Monday in January and April and the last Monday in August, and ending on the Saturday of the same week.

Circuits of the Courts.

LAW CIRCUITS.—Courts of Assize and Nisi Prius and of Oyer and Terminer and General Gaol Delivery shall be held twice a year in each County or union of Counties, in the vacation between Hilary and Easter Terms, and between that period of the vacation after the 21st of August and Michaelmas Term, except in the County of the City of Toronto and the County of York, in each of which counties there shall be a third such Court in every year, in the vacation between Michaelmas and Hilary Terms. There are six Circuits, as follows, viz:—

The Eastern's—Brookville, Cornwall, Kingston, L'Orignal, Ottawa, Pembroke, Perth. *Midland's*—Belleville, Cobourg, Lindsay, Napanee, Peterboro', Picton, Whitby. *Niagara's*—Barris, Hamilton, Milton, Owen Sound, St. Catharines, Welland. *Oxford's*—Berlin, Brantford, Cayuga, Guelph, Simcoe, Stratford, Woodstock. *Western's*—Chatham, Goderich, London, Sandwich, Sarnia, St. Thomas, Walkerton. *Home's*—Brampton, Toronto.

The Courts in each Circuit shall be presided over by one of the Chief Justices or Judges of the Superior Courts, or, in their absence, by some one Judge of a County Court, or some one of her Majesty's Counsel learned in the law, requested by any one of the Chief Justices or Judges of the Superior Courts to act in that behalf.

MEDICAL INSTITUTIONS AND SCHOOLS.

MEDICAL COUNCIL.—The act under which the Upper Canada Medical Board was constituted was repealed, in 1865, by an Act of the late Province of Canada, which has since been repealed by an Act of the Legislature of the Province of Ontario—taking effect from the 23rd day of January, 1869. This new Act, called "The Ontario Medical Act," incorporates the whole profession of Ontario under the name of "The College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario," and grants certain powers to the College which are exercised by an executive body called "The Council of the College, &c., &c." The profession, through its Council, has the power of establishing a curriculum of studies, which shall be observed by all medical teaching bodies in Ontario, and by all students of medicine.

The act also deprives all universities, colleges or schools of medicine of the privilege hitherto enjoyed, of granting a diploma entitling its holder to legal recognition in this Province, and places the sole licensing power in the hands of a Board of Examiners to be annually appointed by the Council. The degree or diploma of an university or college of any part of the world henceforth only possesses an honorary value in Ontario, unless granted before the 23rd day of July, 1869. Only British or Colonial diplomas confer any rights if granted before that date.

Every person, in order to become legally qualified to practice, is required to have his name registered in the Register kept by the Registrar of the College. At the beginning of each year the Registrar publishes in a book a list of all persons registered, with their names in full, residence, address and the degrees or diplomas possessed by each. This book is called the *Ontario Medical Register*, and is accepted in all Courts of Law and before all Justices of the Peace and others as *prima facie* evidence, that any

person whose name is found therein, is registered according to law. The absence of the name of any person from such Register is also *prima facie* evidence that such person is not registered according to law; and no person, whose name does not appear in that Register, is entitled to charge for any advice, or for any medicine which he shall have both prescribed and supplied. No one can collect fees in court for advice in either medicine, surgery, or midwifery, unless he be registered according to law, and his name be in the "list" of the current year. Nor can any unregistered person be appointed as medical officer, physician or surgeon in any branch of the public service, militia or otherwise, or to any hospital or other charitable institution not supported wholly by voluntary contributions; neither can any unregistered person give evidence (of a professional nature) before any coroner's or other court; nor is a certificate of lunacy valid from an unregistered person, nor any other certificate which the law requires from a physician or surgeon. This Register is sold to the public, and may be obtained by applying to the Registrar of the College.

The Council of the College is composed of thirty representatives of various medical interests. Two-thirds of this number are members of the general profession, or what is commonly called the "regular profession." Twelve being the representatives of twelve Medical Electoral Divisions into which Ontario is divided, and eight representing the Universities, Colleges and Schools of Medicine now existing in Ontario. The remaining third are members of two sects of medical practitioners, five representing the section known as "Homoeopaths," and five representing the section known as "Eclectics." Councillors are elected for a period of three years. No one who votes for a repre-

sentative of a territorial division has a right to vote for either a Homoeopathic or Eclectic representative, and vice versa. The Council is composed as follows:—

Application for admission must be made before sending lunatics. Letters posted in Canada addressed to any place within the Dominion pass, if prepaid, for 3 cents per 1/2 oz., but if posted unpaid such letters are charged 5 cents per 1/2 oz.

On Letters to Prince Edward Island, the rate is 3 cents per 1/2 oz. if prepaid, 6 cents if unpaid.

The rate on Letters to the United Kingdom is, by Canadian Packet, sailing from Quebec, Portland, or Halifax,

Not exceeding 1/2 oz. 12 1/2 cents

Exceeding " and not exceeding 1 oz. 25 "

and so on, increasing one rate of postage for each additional half ounce.

And by Cunard Packet, 15 cents per 1/2 oz., &c.

Letters for the United Kingdom must be prepaid, or they will be charged a fine of 6d. sterling on delivery.

Letters for British Colonies and Possessions beyond Sea, and Foreign Countries, via England, must be prepaid.

The rate on letters for the U. States, is 6 cents per 1/2 oz.

" to Cuba 10 cents per 1/2 oz.

United States letters 6 cents if prepaid, 10 cents if unpaid.

The rate of postage on letters to British Columbia and Vancouver's Island is 10 cents per 1/2 oz., which must be prepaid. An additional charge is made on these letters on delivery, for sea postage on the Pacific side. Newspapers 2 cents each. Books 4 cents per 4 oz.

Red River letters 6 cents per 1/2 oz.; newspapers 2 cents each, or computed rate if from Red River to regular subscribers in Canada. No correspondence can be forwarded to Red River unless prepaid by postage stamp.

MAILS FOR CANADA FROM ENGLAND.

Two Ocean Steamers carrying mails for Canada leave Liverpool in each week, viz.: a Canadian Packet on every Thursday, via Derry on Friday, sailing to Quebec in summer and Portland in Winter, by which the Postage rate is 6d. stg. per 1/2 oz.; and a Cunard Packet every Saturday, via Cork on Sunday, bringing Mails for Canada to New York, by which the Postage rate to Canada is 7d. stg. per 1/2 oz.

A Canadian Packet leaves Liverpool every alternate Saturday for Halifax, calling at Queenstown en route. Postage 6d. stg. per 1/2 oz., same as by Canadian Packet to Quebec or Portland.

The British Post Office forwards letters to Canada by the first packet sailing after the letter is posted, unless the letters bear a special direction—"by Canadian Packet" or "by British Packet"—and in that case they are kept over for the Packet designated. "By Canadian Mail" is not a distinctive superscription; for any Mail for Canada is a "Canadian Mail," by whatever Packet forwarded.

WEST INDIES VIA NEW YORK.

West Indies (British) letters 10 cents per 1/2 oz., newspapers 2 cents each. (Foreign) letters 22 cents per 1/2 oz.,

newspapers 3 cents each. Books (British only) 2 cents per 4 oz.

Letters, &c., prepaid for transmission, via New York, are forwarded direct on New York with every mail made up for that Post Office; whence West Indian mails are despatched as follows:

For Havana and the West Indies, via Havans, every Thursday afternoon.

For St. Thomas, the West Indies, and Brazil, on the 23rd of every month.

Letters for the West Indies, British and Foreign, are also sent via Halifax and Bermuda; postage 12 cents per 1/2 oz., newspapers 2 cents each.

No unpaid correspondence can be forwarded by this route.

REGISTRATION OF LETTERS.

Persons posting Letters containing value, should be careful to require them to be registered, and to obtain from the Post Master a Certificate of receipt for Registration.

The charge for Registration, in addition to the Postage, is as follows, viz.:

On Letters to any other place in Canada, or British North America 2 cents.

On Letters for the United States 5 "

On Letters for the United Kingdom 8 "

On Letters for British Colonies or Possessions, sent via England 25 "

On Letters for France and other Foreign Countries, via France an amount equal to the postage rate.

On parcels, patterns, or samples, in Canada, 5 cents

On book packets and newspapers to United Kingdom, 8 cents.

Both the postage charge and registration fee must in all cases be prepaid.

Registration is not an absolute guarantee against the misappropriation or loss of a Letter; but a Registered Letter can be traced when an Unregistered Letter cannot, and the posting and delivery or non-delivery can be proven. A Registered Letter is thus secured against many of the casualties which, from incorrect address, forgetfulness of the receiver, or other error, may affect an Unregistered Letter.

All book packets must be open at both ends or both sides to allow of the inspection of the contents.

MISCELLANEOUS CHARGES.

The charge on Parcels by the Parcel Post, which is limited to places within the Dominion, is 12½ cents per 8 oz. (with 5 cts. additional if Registered.)

One cent per oz. payable in advance by Postage stamp. Is the rate on Printed Circulars (Printed Circulars, if sent in envelopes, whether sealed or unsealed, are liable to letter postage), Prices Current, Hand Bills and other Printed Matter of a like character, and on Books, bound or unbound, when posted at a Canadian Post Office addressed to any place in the Dominion of Canada, British North America generally, or the United States.

The postage upon Prices Current addressed to the United Kingdom is two cents each, which must be prepaid by postage stamps, or they will be sent to the Dead Letter Office to be returned to the senders.

NEWSPAPERS AND PERIODICALS.

Newspapers published in Canada may be sent by Post from the office of publication, addressed to any place in Canada, at the following rates, if paid quarterly in advance by either the publisher at the post office where the papers are posted, or by the subscriber at the delivering post office:

When the above rates are not paid in advance by either publisher or subscriber, such papers are charged one cent each on delivery.

TRANSIENT NEWSPAPERS.

Transient Newspapers—that is to say, Canadian Newspapers posted otherwise than from the office of publication, and American or British papers posted or re-posted in Canada, must be prepaid 2 cents each, by postage stamp, or they cannot be forwarded—except only *British Newspapers* distributed to regular subscribers by Canadian Booksellers or News Agents—such papers pass free as they would do if received in the Canadian Packet Mails.

NEWSPAPERS BY MAIL FROM ENGLAND OR UNITED STATES.

Newspapers received from England by the Canadian Packet Mails are delivered free.

Newspapers from England by the Cunard Packet Mails are charged 2 cents each on delivery. (This is the American transit charge.)

United States Newspapers, brought by mail into Canada, to regular subscribers, are charged one cent each on delivery, transient papers 2 cents each.

PERIODICAL PUBLICATIONS.

The rate on all Periodicals, other than Newspapers, pass by mail in Canada, save such as may be addressed to or received from the United Kingdom, is one cent per 4 oz. weight of package containing periodical matter, whether the package contain one or more numbers.

Any fraction of 4 oz. to be charged as a full rate.

No periodicals whatever, except exchanges, (i. e. periodicals passing between publishers in Canada, and between publishers in Canada and publishers in the United States, Prince Edward Island, or Newfoundland) are entitled to exemption from postage.

Transient Periodical matter posted in Canada must in all cases be prepaid by Postage Stamp.

The above rate will be payable on delivery on all Periodical matter received from the United States, except that Canadian Editors may receive Exchange Periodicals from the United States free of Canadian Postage.

Periodicals, printed and published in Canada, may be posted addressed to any place in the United Kingdom by Canadian Packet, on prepayment by Postage Stamp of two cents each number.

No package of periodicals can be sent through the Post, if it exceed 4 lb. in weight.

POSTAGE RATES ON MISCELLANEOUS MATTER.

Patterns or samples of merchandise and goods for sale, not exceeding 24 oz. in weight, may be posted in Canada to be forwarded to any place within the Dominion, on prepayment by postage stamp of a rate of 1 cent. per ounce, under the following regulations:

Patterns or samples must be sent in covers open at the ends, so as to be easy of examination. Samples however of seeds, drugs, and so forth, which cannot be sent in open covers, may be enclosed in bags of linen or other material,

fastened in such a manner that they may be readily opened; or in bags entirely closed, provided that they be transparent, so that the officers of the Post Office may be able to satisfy themselves as to the nature of the contents.

The Packet may bear on the outside the address of the sender, in addition to the address of the person for whom it may be intended; also a trade mark and numbers, and the price of the article enclosed; inside, there must be no enclosure but the samples or patterns themselves; the particulars however of the trade marks, numbers and price, may be marked on the articles themselves, instead of on the outside of the Packet, at the option of the sender.

Any sample or pattern Packet containing a letter, or otherwise violating the conditions of the preceding rules, will be rated and treated as a letter.

The rate of one cent. per ounce is to be pre-paid by postage stamp, and, if such rate be not fully pre-paid by the stamps affixed, the Packet is to be rated with the deficient postage and a fine of five cents in addition.

Packets of samples and patterns may be registered on pre-payment by postage stamp of a registration fee of 5 cents in addition to the postage rate, and provided such Packets be duly handed in to the post office for registration.

No Packet of samples or patterns must exceed 24 oz.

These regulations apply only to the transmission of Packets of samples and patterns within the Dominion of Canada, and will not in any manner interfere with the regulations governing the exchange of samples and patterns with the United Kingdom, or with the foreign countries to which the same advantage extends, namely, France, Belgium, Italy, German States, Netherlands, Portugal, Switzerland, and Denmark.

No provision as yet exists for the exchange of such matter with the other British Colonies, with the U. S. or with other foreign countries than those above named.

Book and newspaper manuscript, and printers' proof-sheets (whether corrected or not), maps, prints, drawings, engravings, photographs when not on glass or in cases containing glass, and sheet music (whether printed or written), may pass in covers open at the ends or sides, and provided that no letter, or other communication intended to serve the purpose of a letter, be enclosed therein, on pre-payment, when posted in Canada, by postage stamp of the ordinary printed matter rate of one cent. per ounce; or upon payment of that rate on delivery of such matter when received in the mails from the United States.

POSTAGE OF BOOKS, PATTERNS AND SAMPLES.

Patterns of merchandise, and samples, may be forwarded between Canada and the United Kingdom, France, Italy, German States, Netherlands, Portugal, Switzerland, and Denmark, by the Canadian Packet mails, at book post rates, and subject to the following conditions:

There must be no writing or printing other than the address of the person for whom the packet is intended, the manufacturer's or trade mark and number, and price of the article.

Any infringement of the above regulations will render the packet liable to be treated and charged as a letter.

Samples of seeds, drugs, and similar articles intended for delivery within the United Kingdom, are now allowed to be sent in bags entirely closed, provided such bags be transparent, so that the officers of the Post Office may be able to satisfy themselves of the contents.

The rule which prohibited the transmission through the Post, as patterns, of articles of cutlery, &c., has been rescinded; and scissors, knives, razors, forks, steel pens, nails, keys, watch machinery, metal jubing, pieces of metal or ore, and such like articles, are now allowed to be forwarded by the Post as samples, provided they be packed and guarded in so secure a manner as to afford complete protection to the contents of the mail bags, and to the persons of the officers of the Post Office. Such articles, however, must be so packed that they may be easily examined; and it is made a rule that any packet containing such articles, which may be found to be insufficiently guarded, shall not be forwarded through the Post.

None of the articles named in the next preceding paragraph may be sent as patterns or samples to any place abroad, except Germany, Belgium, and the British Colonies, and not to these places when addressed to France.

PATTERNS, LIMIT OF SIZE AND WEIGHT.

The limits of weight and size are as follows:—
If for Canada, 24 oz.; the United Kingdom, 24 oz.; France, 36 oz.; Germany, 8 oz.; the Kingdom of Italy, 36 oz.; Belgium, 8 oz.; the Netherlands, 16 oz.; Portugal,

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16 oz.; the Azores, 16 oz.; Madeira, 16 oz.; Denmark
 18 oz.; Switzerland, 18 oz.

If for Canada or the United Kingdom, 24 inches in
 length and 12 inches in breadth or depth. If for France,
 Portugal, the Azores, or Madeira, 18 inches in length and
 12 inches in breadth or depth. If for Germany, the King-
 dom of Italy, Belgium, the Netherlands, Denmark, or
 Switzerland, 24 inches in length and 12 inches in breadth
 or depth.

Any infringement of the conditions laid down as above
 will render the packet liable to be treated and charged as
 a letter.

Bags entirely closed, even though they may be trans-
 parent, must not be used for the transmission of seeds to
 foreign parts.

No prints or printed matter will be allowed to pass by
 book post between the United Kingdom and Canada, un-
 less printed on paper, parchment or vellum.

MONEY ORDERS IN ONTARIO AND QUEBEC.

All the Money Order Post Offices in Ontario, Quebec and
 New Brunswick, are authorized to draw Money Orders on
 each other for any sum up to \$100, and for as many Orders
 of \$100 each as the Applicant may require, upon the fol-
 lowing terms, viz.:—In Ontario and Quebec,

On Orders up to	\$10	5 cents.
Over \$10 and up to	\$20	10 do.
Do. 20 do.	40	20 do.
Do. 40 do.	60	30 do.
Do. 60 do.	80	40 do.
Do. 80 do.	100	50 do.

In New Brunswick, the rate of commission is 5c. for each
 \$10 or fraction thereof.

MONEY ORDERS ON THE UNITED KINGDOM.

The Money Order Offices throughout the Dominion also
 draw upon all the Money Order Offices in England, Ireland
 and Scotland, and the Channel Islands, for any sum up to
 £10 sterling, and grant as many Orders for £10 sterling
 each as may be needed to make up the amount to be
 remitted. The terms are as under:—

MONEY ORDERS ON THE LOWER PROVINCES.

The Money Order Offices in Ontario, Quebec and New
 Brunswick, draw also upon the Money Order Offices in
 Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island and Newfoundland.
 The Orders, like those of the United Kingdom, are made
 payable in sterling money, and for sums up to £10 ster-
 ling. The terms are:—

For Orders up to	£5	25 cents.	
" over	£5, and up to	£10	50 cents.

The Money Order Post Offices are furnished with Lists
 of all the Money Order Offices in the United Kingdom,
 Ontario, Quebec, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Prince Ed-
 ward Island, and Newfoundland; and the Postmasters are
 instructed to afford every information in their power, in
 respect of the places upon which they draw, together with
 any other information relating to such issues as the in-
 tending Remitters may desire.

POST OFFICE SAVINGS BANKS.

The Post Office Savings Banks, established by statute
 in the last session of Parliament, commenced operations
 in Ontario and Quebec on the 1st April, 1868.

The direct security of the Dominion is given by the
 statute for all deposits made.

At each Savings Bank Post Office the regulations
 may be read by the public, giving full information with
 respect to the mode of depositing and withdrawing money,
 and these regulations are printed on the cover of the Pass
 Book supplied to each depositor.

Any person may have a deposit account, and deposits
 are received daily, during the ordinary hours of Post
 Office business, of any number of dollars, from \$1 up to
 \$300, the total amount which can be received from a
 depositor in any one year, except in cases to be specially
 authorized by the Postmaster General.

The Postmasters of Savings Banks will act as agents
 for the receipt of the money deposited for transmission to
 the Postmaster General, and for the payment by the
 Postmaster General of money withdrawn by depositors.

Each depositor is supplied with a pass book, and the
 sums paid in, or withdrawn, are entered therein by the
 Postmaster receiving or paying the same. In addition, a

direct receipt for each amount paid in, is sent to the de-
 positor from the Postmaster General, and the Postmaster
 General will issue a cheque, payable at any Post Office
 Savings Bank desired, for any sum withdrawn.

Every depositor's account is thus kept with the Post-
 master General, and a depositor may pay into his or her
 account with the Post Office Savings Bank at any of the
 Savings Bank Post Offices which at the time may best suit
 his convenience, and may exercise the same choice in
 drawing out money, subject only to the obligation of pro-
 ducing the pass book, in proof of identity—whenever pay-
 ing in or drawing out money.

Interest at the rate of 4 per cent. per annum is allowed
 on deposits lying in the ordinary deposit accounts, but
 when a depositor has \$100 deposited, he or she may request
 the Postmaster General to transfer this sum to a special
 account, and will then receive a certificate of such special
 \$100 deposit, bearing interest at 5 per cent. per annum.

Postmasters are forbidden by law to disclose the name
 of any depositor, or the amount of any sum deposited or
 withdrawn.

No charge will be made to depositors on paying in, or
 drawing out money, nor for postage on communications
 with the Postmaster General in relation thereto.

The Postmaster General will be always ready to receive
 and attend to all applications, complaints, or other com-
 munications addressed to him by depositors or others,
 relative to Post Office Savings Bank matters.

Additional Post Offices will from time to time be autho-
 rized to act as Savings Bank agencies.

POSTAGE STAMPS.

Postage Stamps are provided for sale of the respective
 values of 1 cent for small periodicals weighing less than
 one ounce sent singly; 1 cent for Newspapers; 2 cents for
 Prices Current and Periodicals for the United Kingdom;
 3 cents for ordinary Dominion Letters; 6 cents for United
 States rate; 12 cents for Canadian Packet; and 15 cents
 for Cunard Packet.

PENAL CLAUSES.

To steal, embezzle, secrete or destroy any post letter
 shall be felony; punishable in the discretion of the court
 by imprisonment in the Penitentiary, for not less than
 three nor more than five years; unless such post letter
 contains any chattel, money or valuable security, in which
 case the offence shall be punishable by imprisonment in
 the Penitentiary for life, or for a period not less than five
 years.

To steal a post letter bag, or a post letter from a post
 letter bag, or a post letter from any post office, or from any
 officer or person employed in the Canada post office, or
 from a mail—or to stop a mail with intent to rob or search
 the same—shall be felony; punishable by imprisonment
 in the Penitentiary for life, or for a period not less than
 five years.

To open unlawfully any post letter bag—or unlawfully
 to take any letter out of such bag—shall be felony; punish-
 able by imprisonment in said Penitentiary for five years.

To steal, embezzle or secrete any parcel sent by parcel
 post, or any article contained in any such parcel, shall be
 felony; punishable by imprisonment in the Penitentiary
 for a period of not less than three years.

To receive any post letter, or post letter bag, or any
 chattel, money, or valuable security, parcel or other thing,
 the stealing, taking, secreting or embezzling whereof is
 hereby made felony, knowing the same to have been felon-
 iously stolen, taken, secreted or embezzled, shall be
 felony; punishable by imprisonment in the Penitentiary
 for any term not less than five years,—and the offender
 may be indicted and convicted either as an accessory after
 the fact or for a substantive felony, and in the latter case
 whether the principal felon hath or hath not been pre-
 viously convicted, or is or is not amenable to justice. And
 however such receiver be convicted, the offence shall be
 punishable as aforesaid.

To forge, counterfeit or imitate any postage stamp issued
 or used under the authority of this act, or by or under
 the authority of the government or proper authority of
 the United Kingdom, or of any British North American
 Province, or of any Foreign Country,—or knowingly to
 use any such forged, counterfeit or imitated stamp,—
 or to engrave, cut, sink or make any plate, die, or other
 thing whereby to forge, counterfeit or imitate such stamp
 or any part or portion thereof,—or to have possession of
 any such plate, die or other thing as aforesaid, except by
 the permission in writing of the Postmaster General, or of
 some officer or person who, under regulations made in

that behalf, may lawfully grant such permission,—or to forge, counterfeit or unlawfully imitate, use or affix, to or upon any letter or packet, any stamp, signature, initials or other mark or sign purporting that such letter or packet ought to pass free of postage, or at a lower rate of postage, or that the postage thereon or any part thereof hath been prepaid or ought to be paid by or charged to any person, department or party whatsoever,—shall be felony punishable by imprisonment in the Penitentiary for life, or for a period not less than five years, and to such felony all the provisions of any Act respecting Forgery shall apply as if such offences were made felony under that Act. In so far as the provisions thereof are not inconsistent with this Act, and the accessories to any such offence shall be punishable accordingly.

To forge, counterfeit or imitate any post office money order, or advice of such money order, or post office savings bank depositor's book, or authority of the Postmaster General for repayment of a post office savings bank deposit, or of any part thereof,—or any signature or writing in or upon any post office money order, money order advice, post office savings bank depositor's book, or authority of Postmaster General, for repayment of a post office savings bank deposit, or any part thereof, with intent to defraud, shall be a felony; punishable by imprisonment in the Penitentiary for any term not less than two years and not exceeding seven years, and the accessories to any such offence shall be punishable accordingly.

To enclose in or with any letter, packet or other mailable matter sent by post, or to put into any post office any explosive, dangerous or destructive substance or liquid, or any matter or thing likely to injure any letter or other mailable matter, or the person of any officer or servant of the post office, shall be a misdemeanour, unless such offence is or shall be by law constituted a crime of greater magnitude.

To enclose a letter or letters, or any writing intended to serve the purpose of a letter, in a parcel posted for the parcel post, or in a packet of samples or patterns posted to pass at the rate of postage applicable to samples and patterns, or to inclose a letter or any writing to serve the purpose of a letter, or to enclose any other thing, in a newspaper posted to pass as a newspaper, at the rate of postage applicable to newspapers (except in the case of the

accounts and receipts of newspaper publishers, which are permitted to pass *ad libitum* within the newspapers sent by them to their subscribers), or to enclose a letter or any writing intended to serve the purpose of a letter in any mail matter sent by post not being a letter, shall in each case be an offence punishable by a penalty of not less than ten and not exceeding forty dollars in each case.

To remove with fraudulent intent from any letter, newspaper or other mailable matter, sent by post, any postage stamp which shall have been affixed thereon or wilfully with intent aforesaid remove from any postage stamp which shall have been previously used, any mark which shall have been made thereon at any post office, shall be a misdemeanour.

It shall not be lawful for any person other than a post master to exercise the business of selling postage stamps or stamped envelopes to the public, unless duly licensed so to do by the Postmaster General and under such conditions as he may prescribe; and any person who shall violate this provision by selling postage stamps or stamped envelopes to the public without a license from the Postmaster General, shall, on conviction before a justice of the peace, incur a penalty of not exceeding forty dollars for each offence.

If any person wilfully or maliciously injures or destroys any street letter box, pillar box, or other receptacle established by authority of the Postmaster General, for the deposit of letters or other mailable matter, such person shall on conviction be deemed guilty of a misdemeanour, punishable by fine or imprisonment or both, in the discretion of the court before which the offender is convicted, and every person who aids, abets, counsels or procures the commission of this offence, shall be guilty of a misdemeanour and be indictable and punishable as a principal offender.

If any person uses or attempts to use in payment of postage on any letter or mailable matter posted in this Dominion, any postage stamp which has been before used for a like purpose, such person shall be subject to a penalty of not less than ten and not exceeding forty dollars for every such offence, and the letter or other mailable matter on which such stamp has been so improperly used may be detained, or in the discretion of the Postmaster General forwarded to its destination charged with double postage.

COMMON SCHOOLS.—Each Township is divided into School
Sections of a suitable extent for one school; and in each of
these Sections three Trustees are elected to manage its School
affairs. In cities, towns, and villages, the schools are man-
aged by a Board of School Trustees, elected for the Muni-
cipality. There were 4,459 Common Schools, with 419,899
pupils, in Ontario, in 1868.

PUBLIC SCHOOL LIBRARIES.—Each School and Municipal
Corporation, desirous of establishing Free Public Libraries,
is aided by the Educational Department granting 100 per-
cent. on local appropriations, and supplying books from the
Depository in connexion with the Department. Up to the
end of Dec. 1868, about 1,070 Libraries had been thus
established, with 227,610 volumes.

EDUCATIONAL MUSEUM.—Connected with the Educational
Department is a Museum, containing specimens of School
apparatus and furniture; a valuable collection of Italian,
Dutch and Flemish Oil Paintings and Statuary casts and
busts. The Museum is freely open to the public, from
9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

THE TOTAL NUMBER OF EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS of all
kinds reported by the Educational Department as in op-
eration in the Province of Ontario during 1868, was 4,882,
attended by 434,933 pupils, and expending \$2,239,639 in
their support.

Normal School. The Sessions of the Normal School com-
mence on the 8th of January and 8th of August, and close
on the 16th of June and 16th of December in each year.

GRAMMAR SCHOOLS.—Each of these Schools (which form
the intermediate link between the Common Schools and
the Universities) is managed by a Board of Trustees ap-
pointed jointly by the County and Town Councils. In
cities, the Trustees are all appointed by the City Council,
except where there is only one School in the county. The
head master must be a graduate of a British or Colonial
University, unless certificated and appointed before 18th
September, 1865. Besides fees, local rates or contributions
to the extent of half the government grant must be raised
for the master's salary. The grant is payable to those
sch-ols only which attain a certain standard, and is based
on the average attendance of pupils in the prescribed
studies. An extra grant is provided for masters taking
certain Meteorological observations and giving scientific
knowledge preparatory to military instruction. Pupils
attending these schools are prepared for matriculation in
the Universities. There were 101 Grammar Schools, with
5,649 pupils, in Ontario, in 1868. Rev. J. G. D. Mackenzie,
