SMITH VS. EMPRESS OF JAPAN. Case Opened in Admiralty Court This Morning—Officers of Abbey Palmer Examined.

In the Admiralty court this morning the case of Smith vs. Empress of Japan, arising out of the collision between the liner and the bark Abbey Palmer on November 6th, was opened.

The witness, a typical son of the sea, gave evidence similar to that adduced at the preliminary hearing. It was in effect that the collision occurred at about 2.40 o'clock in the morning, and at the time the bark was on the starboard tack, making about six or seven miles an hour.

The remainder of the evidence in the application for a writ of habeas corpus for Fong Yuk was taken before Mr. Justice Walker this morning. Sun Tong testified that Fong Yuk was known under four different names.

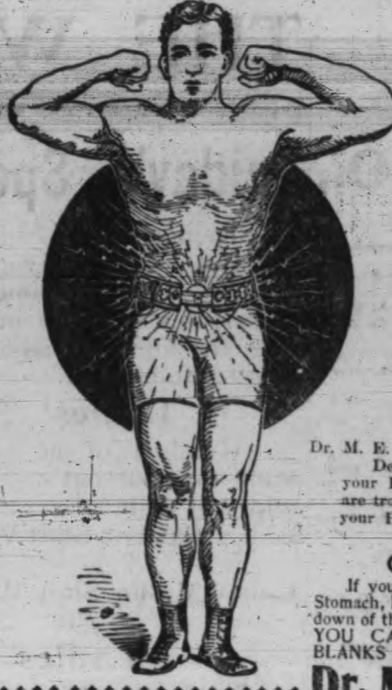
