**ORNAMENTALS ONLY**

As announced last season, we have discontinued the growing of Fruit Trees and heavy Shade Trees. With these items eliminated, we can concentrate our efforts on the production of our special lines—Shrubs, Hedge Plants, Roses and Evergreens. It is our aim to produce these items in quantity and of the highest quality.

This is an age of specialization. After more than thirty years' experience in Alabama, we have learned that our soil, climate and long growing season combined make just the right condition for the growing of this line of stock; that we can produce it at as low cost as stock of the same quality can be grown anywhere in the United States; that better rooted, stockier, cleaner, brighter plants with more "pep" cannot be grown anywhere in this country than right here in North Alabama; that our cold winters (zero or below) serve to ripen this stock perfectly, while not too severe for almost uninterrupted digging and shipping from October to April. With this knowledge and under these most favorable conditions, we believe we are on the right road when we specialize on these items in quantity production.

We sell nothing at retail. We do not pack dealers' orders. Our organization is not overloaded with many lines of endeavor; it is focused on the doing of one thing and doing it well—the serving of the Trade with the four main items of ornamentals. Our work is simplified, the grading, packing and shipping are handled without undue strain on man or beast, all of which means greater efficiency, better service, quicker service and satisfaction all around.

With both Western Union and Postal service, post office, two lines of railroads and both express companies right at our doors, we give the quickest possible action on "Rush" orders.

We deeply appreciate the confidence of the trade and the fine business given us for more than thirty years.

Usual terms to parties of known responsibility. We will not accept orders until we believe the buyer is good for the account. Cash before shipment required from parties unknown to us, or references with sufficient time for investigation before shipment.

### PRICES

We quote prices per 10, per 100, per 1,000, as our stock warrants, and will supply nurserymen and dealers at prices named regardless of the size of the order, except in cases of long assorted lists of small quantities, when an additional charge will be made to cover the extra labor involved. Prices are subject to market changes.

### GRADES

We grade liberally. All shrubs of specified sizes are well furnished and well rooted. Culls are as rigidly excluded from the lightest grades listed as from the heavier stock. Our rule is, "WHEN IN DOUBT, PUT IT IN THE LOWER GRADE" Detailed information as to our method of grading Hedge Plants and Roses are given elsewhere in this list.

### LIABILITY AND CLAIMS

We are not liable for injury to stock from frost, hail, fire, or other causes beyond our control, and book all orders with this understanding. While we use every means at our command to secure prompt delivery, we are not liable for delays in transit; our responsibility ends upon delivery in good order to railway company. Remedy for loss must lie between the buyer and the railway company, but we will gladly render all the aid we can. Any other claims must be made immediately after receipt of stock.

## DIRECTIONS FOR FUMIGATING NURSERY STOCK WITH HYDROCYANIC ACID GAS

The necessary equipment consists of an air-tight chamber (box or room), a glazed earthenware vessel, a measuring glass graduated to ounces, and a set of accurate scales. The necessary chemicals are either Cyanide of Potash (98%) or Sodium Cyanide (96-98%) and Sulphuric Acid (specific gravity 1.83). Care should be taken to secure either the 98% Cyanide of Potash or 96-98% Sodium Cyanide, otherwise an insufficient amount of gas would be generated. This chemical must be kept in air-tight containers and so packed will keep indefinitely. It is a deadly poison and should not be left where it will fall into the hands of children or careless persons, and should never be handled by a person having open sores, cuts or bruises on his hands. The gas is colorless and if inhaled in quantity is fatal; smaller amounts induce headache or dizziness.

The best commercial grade of Sulphuric Acid should be used. This acid must be kept in a glass or earthenware vessel tightly stopped with a glass or lead stopper. Be sure that your fumigating box or room is air-tight or gas-proof.

The standard formula for fumigating each 100 cubic feet of space contained in the fumigating house is as follows:

One ounce Cyanide of Potash (98%) or  $\frac{3}{4}$  of one ounce Sodium Cyanide (96-98%).

Two Fluid ounces Sulphuric Acid.

Four Fluid ounces Water.

The glazed earthenware vessel should be somewhat larger than is necessary to hold the chemicals. A one or two-gallon jar is perhaps the best container.

The trees as dug and brought from the field should be placed in the fumigating house, care being taken to see that they are free from any considerable quantities of mud or dirt. The trees should not be fumigated when they are wet, as it has been shown that in this condition they are likely to be injured by the gas. When the compartment is full of stock, close all openings except the door. Place the jar on the floor near the middle of the room, pour in the required amount of water, and then slowly pour in the acid. The cyanide, previously weighed and inclosed in a tight paper bag, is now dropped into the jar and the operator leaves immediately and closes the door tight. The steps in this operation should never be varied. If water is poured into the acid, a violent action takes place and may be the cause of injury to the operator. Inclosing the cyanide in a paper bag makes it convenient and safe to handle and retards the generation of the gas for a moment after being dropped, thus allowing time to leave the room and close the door securely.

Keep the door closed for forty minutes, at the end of which time the door and window should be thrown open, care being taken to avoid the outward rush of the gas. After fifteen minutes of airing, the room may be safely entered and the stock removed, being now ready for packing or heeling in. After fumigating the contents of the jar should be buried.

Buy chemicals of your local druggist if you can secure Merck's cyanide in unbroken, original packages, and sulphuric acid that has been kept in a glass-stoppered bottle.

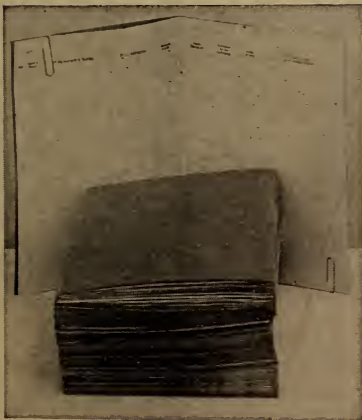
