TO THE TRADE.

We are prepared to furnish for the Fall of 1874 an unusually extensive and well grown stock of both Fruit and Ornamental Trees, and we wish it understood that the Price List herewith presented, represents stock grown upon our grounds. All Nurserymen, Dealers and Planters, wishing to purchase in quantity, are invited to examine our prices.

To save correspondence and to facilitate shipments, we ask attention to the following explanations;

ORDERS.

should be plainly written on a separate sheet, and should state particularly the size, age and varieties of the stock desired. If information is needed respecting quality or price, we will promptly answer. Since we must fill our orders in rotation, those wishing early shipments should be sure to order EARLY.

FALL PACKING.

We shall commence digging and packing about September 20th if the season opens early. For packing a charge is made only sufficient to cover cost of bales or boxes, except cost of extra labor in assorting orders charged to agents and dealers. We consume thousands of feet of pine lumber in boxes, and make them strongly, and price them according to size.

SHIPPING DIRECTIONS, &c.

Parties should state exactly how they wish their stock forwarded, by what route, or by what line if by fast freight. We always endeavor to send by the speediest and most direct route and precisely as directed. To mark goods properly we must have plain directions. We deliver all stock at Raliroad, Syeamboat or Express, free of drayage, after which our risk ceases All demands for errors in filling orders must be made in ten days after the receipt of the stock. We forward by the New York Central east and west, and south by Geneva, Ithaca & Athens Rairood and by boat on Seneca Lake and Northern Central Railroad, and Erie Railroad. Geneva, N. Y., is equi-distant (50 miles) from Rochester and Syracuse. Our location being on the N. Y. Central Railroad (Auburn Road) and connecting with southern lines, it will readily be seen that our facilities for shipping are abundant.
