An Excellent Work of Art.

One of the best pure line engravings we ever saw, if not in fact the best, is LITTLEFIELD'S PORTRAIT OF GEN. GRANT. It is indeed Grant himself—not a poetically distant resemblance, nor an ideal cloud behind which the man's features are indistinctly and vaguely visible. Grant's face, unluckily for the ideal painter, is one of those that cannot be idealized. Washington's could; so could Lincoln's. Their features were altogether unlike those of anybody else. Nobody ever saw a man who resembled either Washington or Lincoln. Their features were as different as two faces well could be, but each so entirely unique that a picture bearing even a slight resemblance is at once recognized. Hence they are defied with safety and facility by the brush and pencil of enthusiastic genius.

But a likeness of Grant must be a *perfect* likeness, or it becomes at once as much a likeness of ten thousand other men as of him. Hence the engraving from Marshall's portrait of Grant looks like a photograph from a basswood bust.

We have not seen the original painting by Littlefield, but of the engraving we hardly know what else to say than that it is Grant exactly, Grant precisely, Grant in every lineament. This engraving is certainly a superior production, and possesses a high value for all such as want a picture of Grant just as he is. We refrain from discussing its artistic merits in technical terms and from a professional standpoint, as that is a department of the subject about which the general public has no concern.

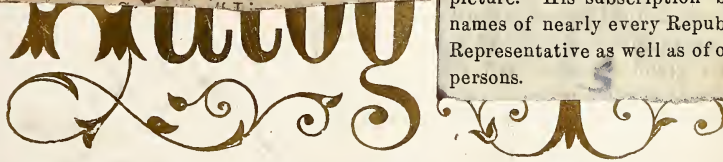
