III. Counter measures taken by Pref. School Board against T. B. teachers.

1. At present:

- a. Early discovery. Physical examination is given to teachers so that they can get early adequate treatment. This is not easy to do because of the shortage of money and personnel concerned, but it is pretty effectively done with the co-operation of "The Public Health Section" of the prefecture.
- b. Individual guidance of T. B. teachers. We have a plan, but it is not well carried out, because of the shortage of money and personnel concerned.
- c. Guidance of teachers in general, students and PTA members. It is always given whenever possible, not sufficient. Lack of understanding on their parts.

2. Plan for 1951:

- a. Administering of physical examination for early discovery. (Teachers and students)
- b. Early treatment so that they can recover at least within 2 months.
- c. Individual guidance by means of documents, visitation and others.
- d. Enlightenment of teachers, students and PTA members, and strengthening of the guidance and the spreading of preventive education.
- e. Budget submitted to fight against T. B. and for the special physical examination.
