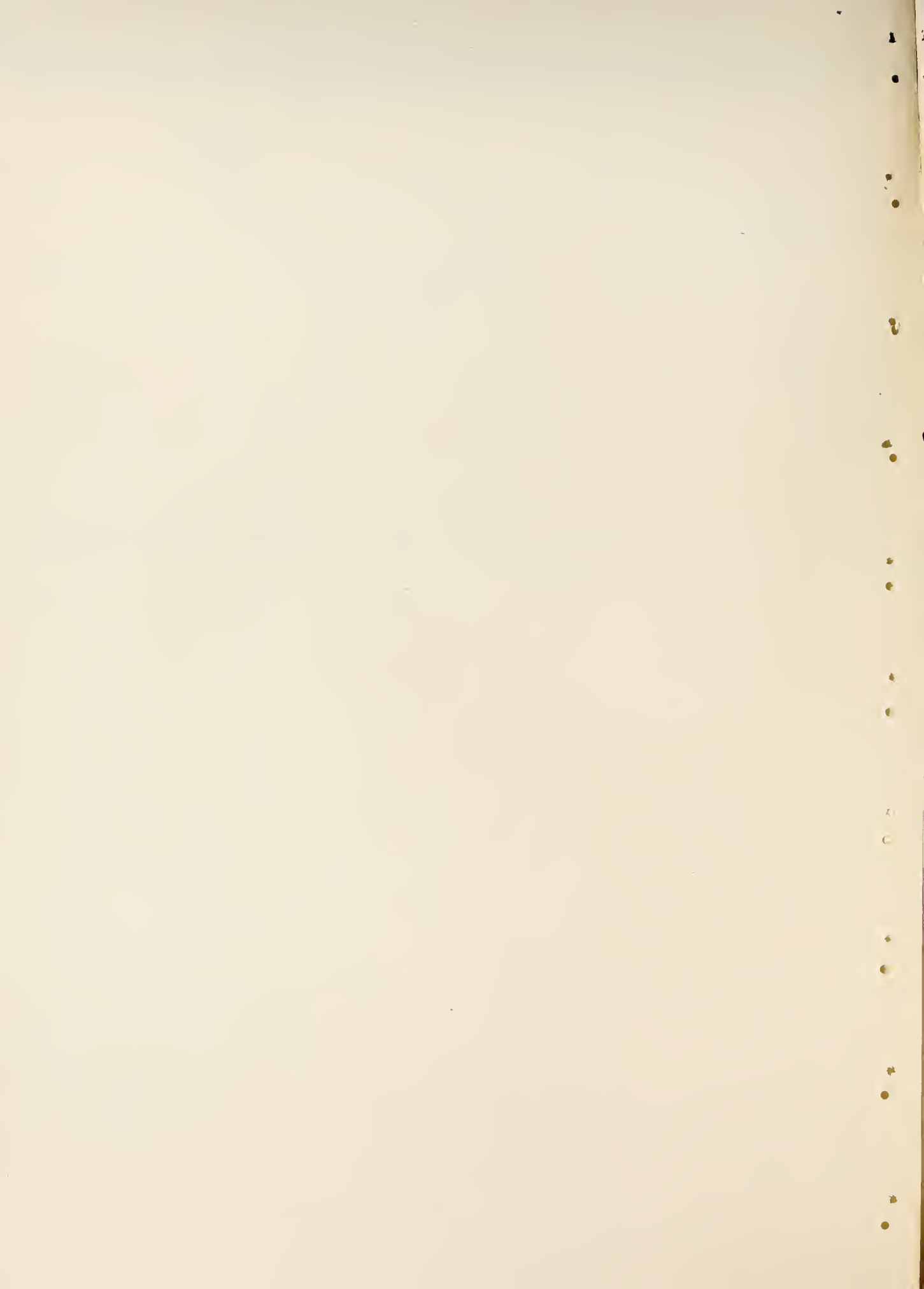

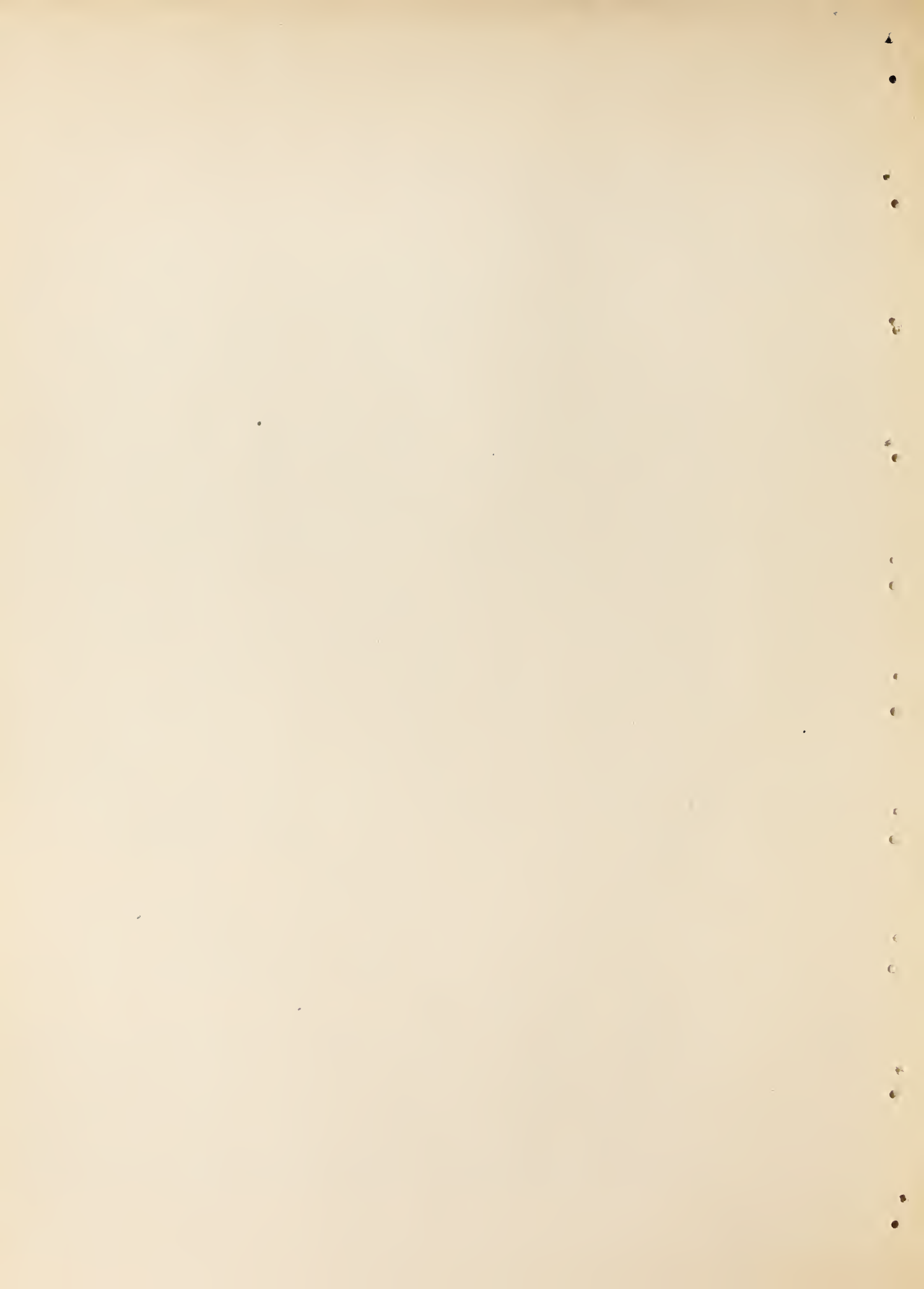

for my school now. I'm so excited about it.

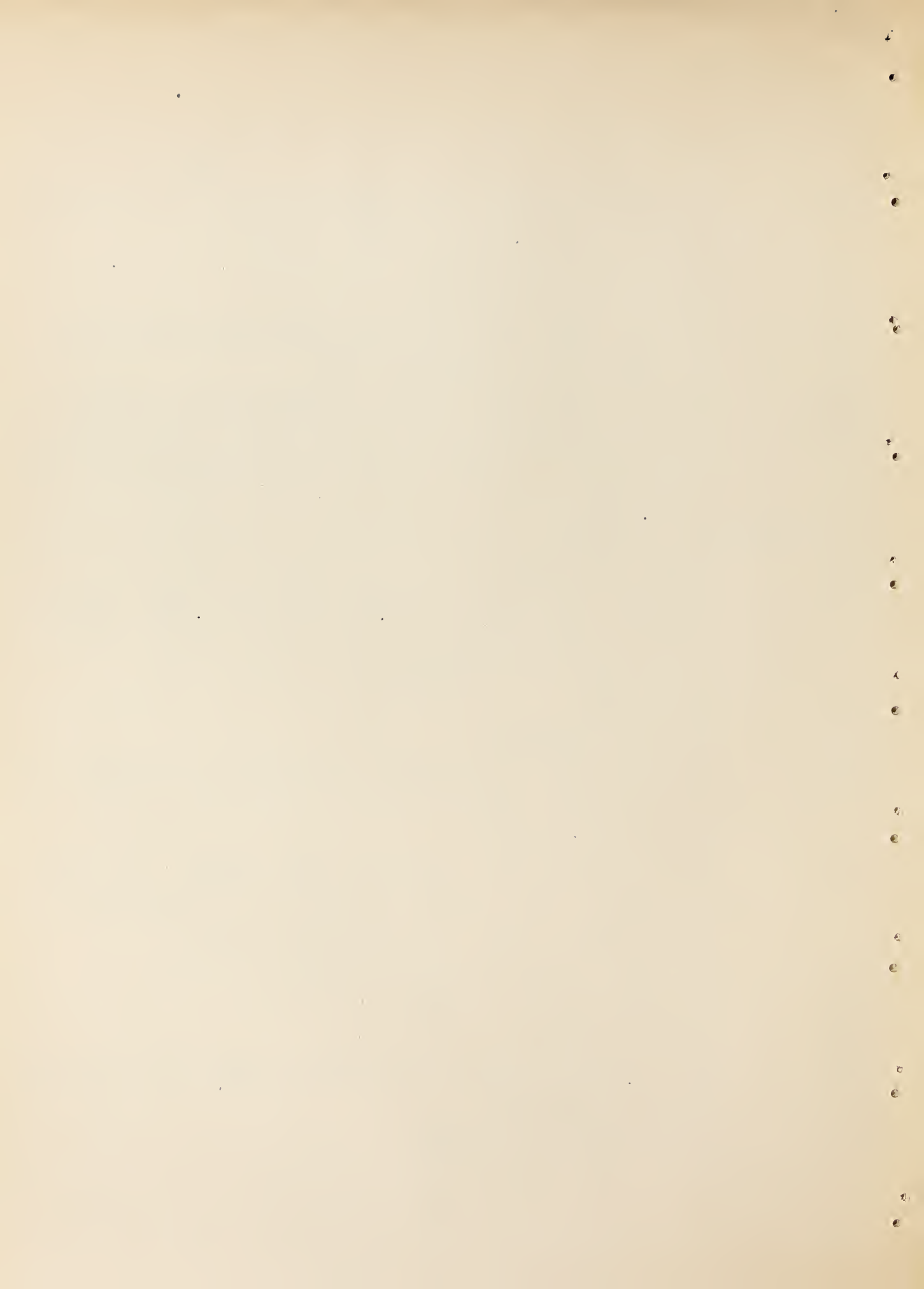

MARY: Hasn't you told them about the good deer?

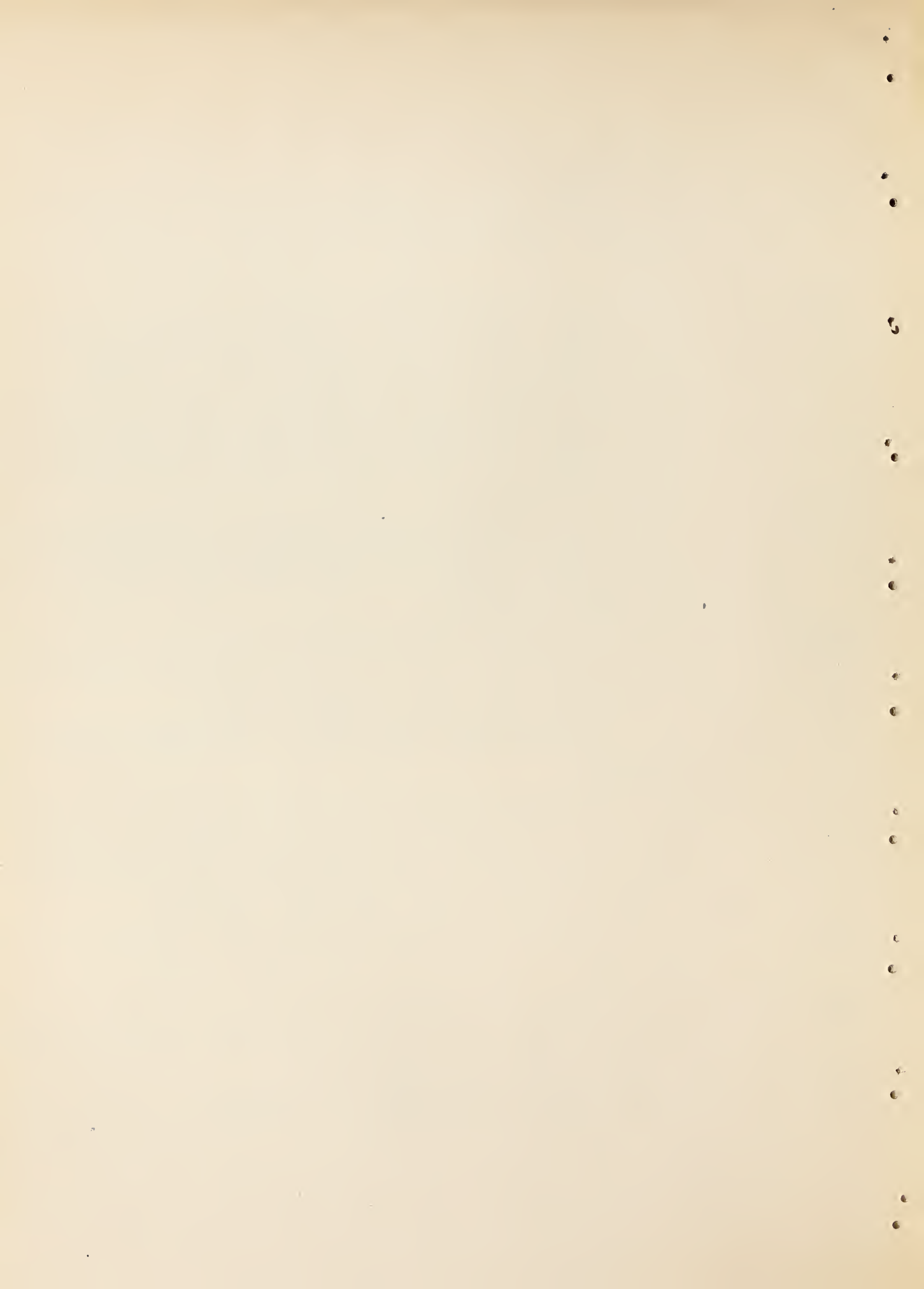
