Most of the Daffodils offered here are new and standard varieties of the better kinds. They comprise the best of the European originations, and many are here listed for the first time in an American catalog. A few of the older sorts are offered because of their popularity and superior merit. By planting a suitable selection, including the earliest and latest varieties you can have Daffodils blooming in your garden for six to eight weeks. Maryland-grown Daffodil bulbs will bloom from one to two weeks earlier than either imported or Pacific-coast bulbs. Favorable climate and excellent soil favor the production of healthy, heavy bulbs. Double-nosed bulbs will be supplied, and prices are per bulb unless otherwise stated. Bulbs will be shipped in September and should be planted four to five inches deep.
