So they have to wait the further instruction about excess allocation to their plant. Naniwa Seni Kogyosho received no instruction about allocation.

According to the letter of Daiken Sangyo K.K. Kobe Branch, (48, Akashi-cho Ikuta-ku Kobe City) addressed to the Sasamura Seikoshu K.K., the Com. & Ind. Ministry in Tokyo decided to revise the allocation of mexican henequen fibre in compliance with the directive of Miss Montgomery, Textile Goods Section, G.H.Q. So I think you will find complete information about re-allocation from the Textile Goods Section G.H.Q. As for the amount of henequen fibre received by the plants, no change has yet been seen since last report on 8 September 1948.

In answer to your memo dtd 18 Aug. 1948, subject Request For Partial Release of Land and Buildings Kawasaki Zoki K.K. Code No. 32-52. The following report is submitted.

1. The land and buildings in question can be released without jeopardizing the proper maintenance and custody of reparations machinery.
