The Siamese Ambassador presents his compliments to His Excellency the Secretary of State and has the honour to state that the Siamese Organization for the Relief of War Veterans desires to send Lieutenant Udom Sangkasaba to Japan to purchase implements and machinery for fishery industry. If permission is granted for him to enter Japan for the said purpose, Lieutenant Udom Sangkasaba proposes to leave Bangkok by air towards the end of May, 1948.

Under instructions from the Siamese Government, the Ambassador has the honour to request the State Department to be so good as to submit the matter to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers with a view to the grant of the necessary permission to Lieutenant Udom Sangkasaba to enter Japan.

The Secretary of State presents his compliments to His Excellency the Ambassador of Siam and has the honor to acknowledge the receipt of his note No. 742/2491 of May 10, 1948 in which permission was requested for Lieutenant Udom Sangkasaba to enter Japan.

The Department has received a communication from the military authorities stating that Lieutenant Sangkasaba has been granted permission to enter Japan any time between June 15 and July 15, 1948, for a stay of sixty days after his entry. Lieutenant Sangkasaba should carry with him to Japan two standard size passport photographs.

It is assumed that the Ambassador will request his Government to insert into Lieutenant Sangkasaba's passport a statement in English to the effect that he has been cleared by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers for entry into Japan. Such a statement is required

My dear Colonel Scott:

The Department of State is in receipt of a note dated May 10, 1948 from the Embassy of Siam, acting upon instructions of the Siamese Government, requesting the Department to present to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Tokyo the request of Lieutenant Udom Sangkasaba, a Siamese national, for permission to enter Japan. It is stated in the note that it is the desire of the Siamese Organization for the Relief of War Veterans to send Lieutenant Sangkasaba to Japan for the purpose of purchasing implements and machinery for the fishing industry. It is further stated that if permission is granted for Lieutenant Sangkasaba to enter Japan for the purpose stated he proposes to leave Bangkok by air toward the end of May, 1948.

The Military Permit Section is requested to communicate the substance of this request to the Supreme Commander for consideration and to inform the Division of Protective Services of any decision reached by the Supreme Commander concerning it.

Should the requested permission be granted it will not be necessary for you to send to this Division a military permit in Lieutenant Sangkasaba's name. A memorandum from your office stating that he has been granted Theater clearance will be sufficient.

Upon receipt of Mr. E.O. Taunton's military permit to enter Japan, Mr. Corkran found in the case file a letter from Mr. Taunton saying he is booked to sail from New Orleans on May 16. In view of the shortness of time, it was decided to try to reach Mr. Taunton by telephone. A call was placed to Mr. Taunton's office in Memphis, Tennessee, but was transferred to the Houston office. Mr. Hoffmeister said that Mr. Taunton is in Houston but not at the office; he agreed to talk for Mr. Taunton and to transmit a message to him.

Mr. Corkran informed Mr. Hoffmeister that a military permit has been received for Mr. Taunton and asked for directions as to how the permit might be sent to him. Mr. Hoffmeister said that the permit may be mailed to Mr. Taunton, Care of George H. McFadden and Brother, Foreman Building, Houston, Texas. Mr. Corkran said that the permit would be mailed immediately.

4. Passport is issued valid for travel in Japan, China, The Philippines, with the proviso that the validity only stands good if such countries are under Allied occupation and a permit is received from the occupation authorities to be attached to the passport.
5. I have completed the vaccinations required by the Military Authorities and have a certificate to that effect dated April 20th, 1948.
6. I have passage booked on the S/S Tillie Lykes, due to sail on the 16th of May from New Orleans to Yokohama.

Should you require any other further details which would expedite the obtaining of the SCAP permit, I will be only too glad to furnish you with same and trust that it will be obtained in time to fit in with my sailing date.

Mr. Banrerji called with regard to the case of Mr. D.C. Matthal. Mr. Corkran informed Mr. Banrerji that the Department has already obtained a military permit document for Mr. Matthal and has mailed it to him in care of the American Express Company office in San Francisco.

Mr. Banrerji said that he was very pleased to know that Mr. Matthal's permit has already been obtained. Reference is made to a recent telephone conversation between the undersigned and your Mr. Corkran of your division, and to your registered letter, reference DS, dated April 29, 1948 in connection with Military Permit No. 12443 for entry into Japan issued to our agent, Mr. Nessim Frangi.

We have been in cable communication with Mr. Frangi during the past few days. He is now on the way to India, Ceylon, The Netherlands East Indies and Australia. Because of urgent business reasons, Mr. Frangi will not be able to go to Japan during the month of May. His visits to the above named countries are essential and must precede Mr. Frangi's trip to Japan. We regret these circumstances, but we did not imagine that a military permit was issued for such a short period of time and that it would be granted so soon after our original request was made.



With reference to the aforementioned application, the Department has recently been informed by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers that a request for the clearance of an individual for travel to Japan may be submitted by the country of which the applicant is a national through the diplomatic mission in Japan of another country, in accordance with the formal "protective Power" agreement between the two countries, provided, however, that the Supreme Commander has already been informed of the protection arrangement. Mr. Jesse Briegel called Mr. Corkran this morning and said that he is most anxious to obtain permission for six British nationals to enter Okinawa on business. Mr. Briegel said that he had visited the Military Permit Office and talked with Captain Rawls, who informed him that entrance into Okinawa is at the discretion of the commanding officer there. Captain Rawls pointed out to Mr. Briegel the fact that Giacomo Mensace had been refused permission to enter Okinawa on the grounds that he is not an American citizen. Captain Rawls informed Mr. Briegel, however, that the Military Permit Section would be glad to cable to Okinawa the application for the six British subjects provided they were requested to do so by the State Department.

Mr. Corkran told Mr. Briegel that the Department does not submit applications to the military authorities on behalf of foreign nationals unless it is requested to do so by an Embassy or Legation in Washington. Mr. Corkran asked Mr. Briegel whether he had investigated the possibility of forwarding the six applications through British channels. Mr. Briegel said that he had, and that both the British Embassy and Captain Rawls had informed him that much quicker results could be obtained by the use of American communication facilities. Mr. Corkran then asked Mr. Briegel if he could obtain a letter from the British Embassy requesting the Department to make the application, and Mr. Briegel said that he could.

Later today Mr. Briegel visited DS in person and handed to Mr. Corkran a letter from the British Embassy, signed by Mr. F.V. Cross, Attache, requesting DS to present the applications to the military authorities.

On April 16, 1948 the American Embassy at Karachi, Pakistan sent a telegram to the Department referring to the desire of several Pakistani nationals to travel to Japan. In reply the Department informed the Embassy that since the United Kingdom is the protecting Power for Pakistan in Japan (see Yokohama's A-6 of January 8, 1948 to the Department), Pakistani applications for permission to enter Japan should be forwarded to SCAP through British channels. This was in accordance with the request which has been made to the Department on a number of occasions by the Military Permit Section of the Army Department, namely that in cases where an applicant's government's interests in Japan are protected by a third Power the applicant should be advised to submit his application to SCAP through the diplomatic channels of the protecting Power.

The Embassy of Chile begs leave to refer

to the Memorandum of the Department of State of April 23, 1948 (894.111/3-148) with reference to the departure from Japan of the Chilean national, Hiroshi (Enrique) Yamada Yashiro, in which certain items of a documentary nature, as well as information, were listed as required of Mr. Yamada to enable a permit to be issued to him for his departure from Japan.

This Embassy is now in receipt of a dispatch from the Chilean Foreign Office advising that the father of Mr. Yamada had furnished proof of the payment of passage on the President Line from Yokohama to San Francisco for his son, and that he had previously exhibited proof of payment of passage by airplane from San Francisco to Santiago, Chile. At the same time, the Pacific Mail Order Company, 340 East First Street, Los Angeles 12, California, has been instructed to supply to Mr. Yamada the money required for his stay in the United States while in transit to Chile.

In addition, the Embassy received a copy of the Birth Certificate of Mr. Yamada, in due form, which is attached, herewith.

In view of the fact that Mr. Yamada was only 9 years of age when he left Chile there was never issued to him an identification card (cedula de identidad), required of all adult Chileans.

The Embassy should appreciate it very much if the Department of State would be good enough to transmit this information, together with the Birth Certificate, to its representatives at Yokohama, to be used in applying for a permit for Mr. Yamada's departure for Japan, and for the issuance to him of the necessary documentation for his journey to Chile.

MEMORANDUM

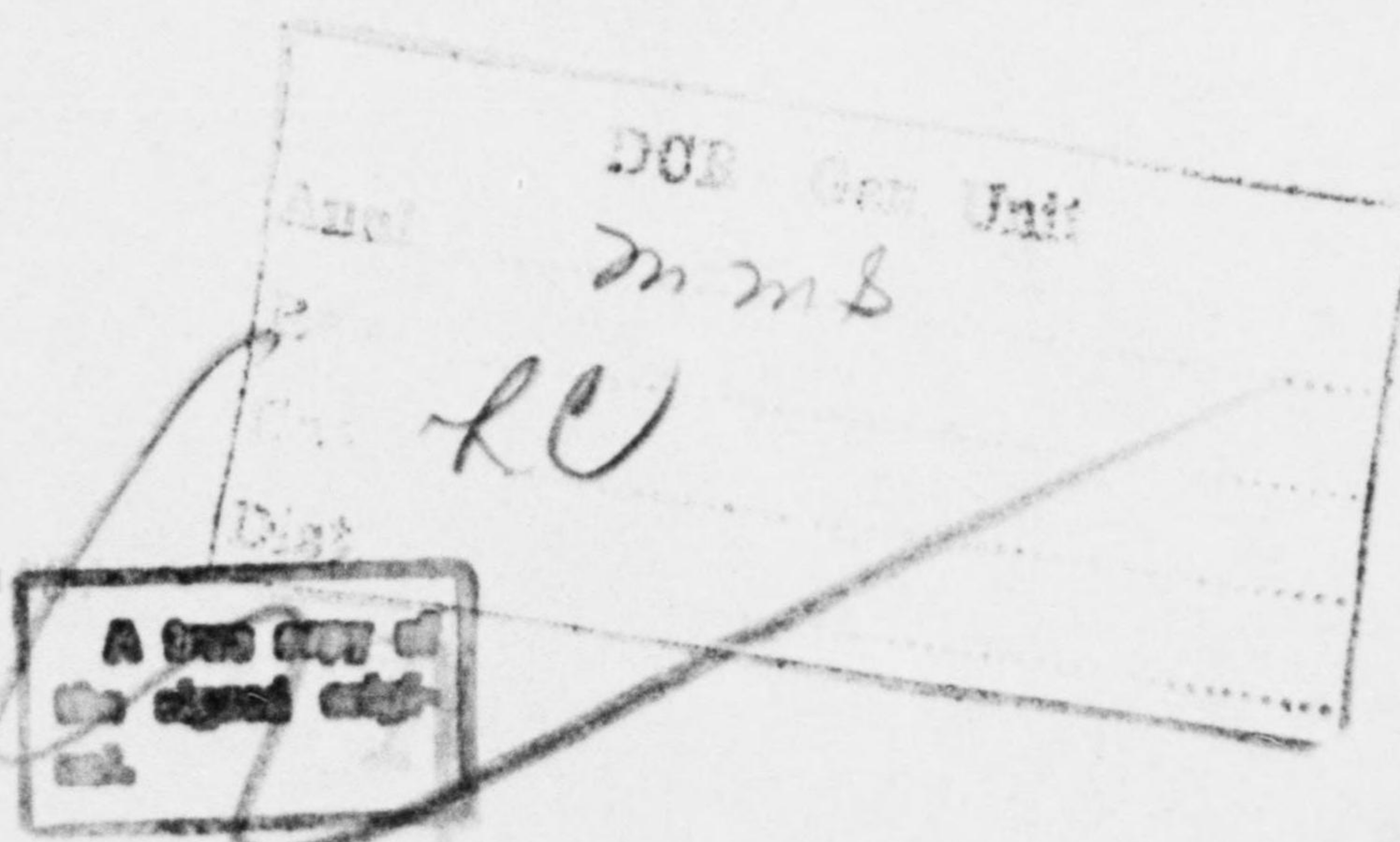

MEMORANDUM FOR THE FILES

On May 5, 1948 DS prepared telegram 116 to Bombay stating that Walter Schapiro had Theater clearance to enter Japan between May 5 and June 5.

On May 13, telegram 122 was sent to Bombay stating that the period during which Schapiro may enter Japan had been changed to June 1 to June 30.

On May 21, Mr. Joshua J. Schapiro called from New York and obtained the consent of the Military Permit Section to change the clearance period for his son once again, to the period May 20 to June 20. Accordingly, a telegram was drafted to Bombay on May 24. Mr. Corkran of DS was informed by telephone today that this telegram was despatched on May 25 and was numbered 132.

Mr. Joshua Schapiro called from New York today to state that his son is no longer in Bombay but has moved on to Calcutta. Consequently the last telegram which the Department sent to Bombay will never reach him. Mr. Schapiro requested, therefore, that the message be repeated to Calcutta immediately.
