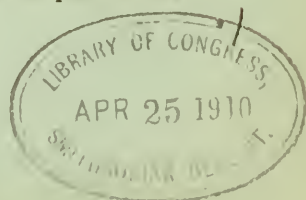

RICHARD HUSSEY AND HIS DESCENDANTS.

THIRD GENERATION.

[Continued from Vol. VI, page 103.]

10. RICHARD³ HUSSEY* (*Richard*,² *Richard*¹), born in Dover, N. H., August 12, 1722, married before 1745, Phebe, daughter of Benjamin Varney, of Somersworth, N. H. (*Ham's Dover, N. H. Marriages.*) He is described in deeds as a "husbandman." August 31, 1765, he deeded to Moses Roberts, of Dover, his homestead farm in Dover, the same deeded him by his father, for £500. (*N. H. Prov. Deeds, 96: 207.*) In this deed he is described as of Dover, but he soon afterwards moved to Lebanon, Me., whither his brother Reuben, and perhaps his mother, had preceded him. August 31, 1768, Richard Hussey, of Lebanon, in the County of York and State of Massachusetts, conveyed to Ebenezer Clements, for £15 15s, "the Pew in Dover first Parish meeting house Number four." (*N. H. Prov. Deeds, 94: 398.*) May 20, 1776, he was chosen one of the Committee of Safety. (*Diary of Rev. Isaac Hasey.*) The diary also contains the following entries: "1777, Feb. 3. Richard Hussey's wife died last night." "1786, Aug. 7. Rich^d Hussey died." "Aug. 9. Sac. Lec: Rich^d Hussey from y^e meeting house." Mr. George W. Chamberlain says:—"The meeting house then stood at South Lebanon about one-half mile north of Richard Hussey's home."

A correspondent assigns to Richard and Phebe Hussey the

11. REUBEN³ HUSSEY (*Richard*,² *Richard*¹), was born in Dover, N. H., and moved to Lebanon, Me. He married Anna Young of Madbury, N. H. She died "of y^e Measles" March 5, 1784. (*Husey's Diary*.) He was living September 18, 1788, as Hasey mentions a deed from him to "Zac. Hussey" of that date.

12. ROBERT³ HUSSEY (*Job*,² *Richard*¹), married in 1757, Mercy Hanson, widow of John Hanson, and daughter of William Horne. He died in Somersworth, N. H., in 1797. His will, dated February 9, 1791, proved January 30, 1797, mentions wife Mercy, sons Job and Benjamin, and daughters Betty Austin and Rachel Randel. The two sons were executors. The widow appears to have soon married a Tibbetts, as there is a deed, dated Sept. 23, 1797, from Job to Benjamin Hussey of "20 acres of land out of the lands that was set out to Mercy Tebbetts our Mother for her thirds out of the estate of Robert Hussey late of Somersworth, deceased."

13. JOHN³ HUSSEY (*Job*,² *Richard*¹), moved from Somersworth, N. H., to Damariscotta, afterwards Newcastle, Me., as early as 1753, as is evidenced by a deed, dated July 5, 1753, in which "John Hussey of Damariscotta so called in the County of York" joins with Robert Hussey and others in

quitclaiming their interest in the estate of Joseph Tibbetts. Damariscotta was a general name applied to the locality before the incorporation of Newcastle in 1753. It was not used as the name of a town until 1847. July 14, 1756, Job Hussey of Somersworth, "in Consideration of the Natural affection which I have & Do Bear unto my Son John Hussey of New Castle in the County of York," conveys to him two tracts of land in Rochester, N. H., comprising about one hundred acres, with his interest in undivided lands. (*N. H. Prov. Deeds, 50: 398.*) May 29, 1759, "John Hussey of New Castle Gentleman" conveys the same to Ebenezer Horn of Dover. (*N. H. Prov. Deeds, 65: 57.*)

Cushman's "History of Ancient Sheepscot and Newcastle" says that John Hussey came from Scituate, Mass. I have lately inquired among John's descendants for the origin of this statement, and am informed that it sprang from a vague notion that he was connected in some way with a Robert Hussey who was enrolled in Duxbury, Mass., in 1643, and therefore must have come from that vicinity.

John Hussey of Newcastle married Jane Rollins, born 1736. She was the fifth child of John Rollins of Exeter, N. H., from which place he removed to East Bradford, now Groveland, Mass., and thence with most of his family to Damariscotta, Maine, in 1736, where he died in 1776. (*Rawlins or Rollins Genealogy.*) John Hussey was living September 16, 1795, as is shown by his acknowledgment of a deed on that date. His wife Jenny joins in the deed, but does not sign.

Her gentle ministrations at the bedside of the sick and suffering gave a peculiar significance to the name her parents bestowed on this Quaker, 'sister of mercy'."

22. PAUL³ HUSSEY (*William*,² *Richard*¹), born 1730; married early as 1760, Mary, daughter of Joseph and Peniel (Bean) Hall. Joseph Hall and Peniel Bean were married December 19, 1731. Mary was their second child, and was baptized May 23, 1736. Joseph Hall, born March 26, 1706, died November 14, 1762, was the son of Ralph Hall and Mary Chesley, his 2d wife, whom he married May 26, 1701, and the grandson of John Hall, who was born in England about 1617, and first appears, with his wife Elizabeth, on the church records of Charlestown, Mass., at the baptism of their son John, in 1645. He removed to Dover, N. H., in 1648 or 1649, and was deacon of the first church in Dover as early as 1655. (See Rev. David B. Hall's "*Halls of New England*." The name of the husband of Mary Hall is erroneously given as "Hessey" in this work.)

Paul Hussey died November 22, 1796; his wife died in 1813.

The following is from the files of the Probate Court of Strafford County, N. H.

"We the subscribers the widow and eldest son of Paul Hussey late of Dover, husbandman, deceased intestate, hereby certify that we decline taking upon ourselves the administration of his estate and pray that the Judge of Probate would appoint Elijah Hussey, the second son of the deceased, administrator on his estate.

Timothy Hussey and Elizabeth, Dec. 11, 1821, conveyed to Isaac Wendell, for the Dover Cotton Factory, one acre of land 'at a place called Eelware falls', together with the falls. This was on the easterly side of the river. Elijah Hussey and Jane, that same day, conveyed to said Wendell one acre on the west side of the falls, including all the water privilege adjoining said lot."—(Landmarks in Ancient Dover, p. 47.)

Elizabeth Hussey was appointed administratrix of the estate of her husband Timothy, March 29, 1824. There was a partition of his real estate, June 8, 1830, to Thomas Snell in right of his wife Mary and to Hannah Hussey.

IN MEMORIAM.

[The following memorial addresses were delivered by HON. JOSEPH BURBEEN WALKER, of Concord, N. H., September 2, 1909 at the Annual Court of the Society of Colonial Wars in the State of New Hampshire and are published at the request of the said society.]

Two valued members of the Society of Colonial Wars in the State of New Hampshire passed from earthly life during the last year:—GEORGE FREDERICK EVANS, of Portland, Me., on the 10th day of January, 1908, and HENRY OAKES KENT, of Lancaster, on the 21st of March, 1909.

GEORGE FREDERICK EVANS.

GEORGE FREDERICK EVANS, son of Elias and Mary (Pierce) Evans, was born in Concord on the 11th day of March, 1845. He was educated in the public schools of his native city and graduated from its High School in 1862, as the Salutatorian of his class.

He soon afterwards entered the office of Col. J. M. Maccomb, of the United States Army Corps of Engineers, at Portsmouth, where, for the next four years, he devoted his attention to the study and practice of civil engineering, with the exception of a brief service as timekeeper in the machine shops of the Northern Railroad, at Concord.

In 1867, he went west, where he gave himself to professional work. From this, he was diverted, in 1881, by appointments to the offices of Secretary and Treasurer of the Louisville, Evansville and St. Louis Railroad. Three years later he was made manager of its operating and traffic departments. All these positions were, at this time, owing to the condition of the road, of unusual importance, demanding great ability on the part of the incumbent and accompanied with large responsibility. In 1885, he was also made its Receiver and General Manager by Judge Gresham of the United States Circuit Court. By his exertions, and to his high credit, as well as to the satisfaction of its stockholders, he succeeded in relieving this important thoroughfare from its embarrassments and in making it self-sustaining. Later, in 1892, his attachment to New England seems to have led

to his return thereto. Here he served for a time as Assistant General Manager of the Boston and Maine Railroad and as Superintendant of its Southern Division.

The railroads in Maine, as elsewhere, originally consisted of independent lines, constructed generally by local enterprise to meet local wants. They were built with little reference to each other, or to afford, by combined efforts, general accommodations to large sections. Their operations were largely governed by limited considerations, at times in sharp competition with one another, and not unfrequently with little, if any, pecuniary profit to their stockholders.

To improve this undesirable condition, a combination of neighboring lines was proposed. It was begun in 1862, by the consolidation of the Androscoggin and Kennebec and the Penobscot and Kennebec corporations, into one general system, since greatly enlarged and now known as The Maine Central Railroad. In 1896, this consisted of four separate lines owned by this railroad, and of nine leased lines; the thirteen having an aggregate length of a little over eight hundred miles.

Upon the retirement of Mr. Payson Tucker, in 1896, from the position of General Manager of this important system, a successor, competent to the discharge of its arduous, complicated and at times delicate duties, was sought with no little anxiety. To persons conversant with the high reputation as an organizer and manager of such property which Mr. Evans had brought with him from the west, it seems natural that early attention should have been focused upon him; that he should have been appointed General Manager of the System, and elected, a little later, one of its Vice-Presidents.

In this action, the Directors of the Maine Central Railroad system made no mistake. In addition to high integrity, courage, reliable judgment and kindness of interest in the welfare of all with whom he had to deal, he possessed a rare faculty of clearly comprehending and remedying the intricate and adverse conditions so often experienced in the reorganization of extensive systems of railway transportation. By the patient exercise of these qualities for a continuous period of a dozen years, he gained and held the confidence of his superior officers, the respect of the public and the loyalty of the large corps of employees who co-operated with him in making his administration a success.

On the 10th of January, 1908, Vice-President and General Manager Evans was at Vanceboro, Maine, having just com-

pleted a careful inspection of several sections of his road. While reading a paper which he held in his hand, quick as a lightning flash he fell upon the floor in instant death. The report of his unanticipated demise caused a painful shock to thousands who had known him personally or by reputation. As the car which bore his lifeless body to his home in Portland proceeded on its way, it was given mournful welcome at each successive station by companies of employees and citizens, who manifested by low tones and sad looks their high regard, and a deep sense of their loss, of a valued friend and fellow citizen.

A little later, on the day of his obsequies, the whole Maine Central System by a general impulse gave mute expression of its sorrow for the loss of its chief executive officer. Precisely at eleven o'clock, A. M., and for a limited time thereafter, the revolution of every wheel in all its machine shops was arrested; every office connected with it was closed and every engine and car, wherever at that time it chanced to be,—in village, open country or densest forest—stood still, all the way from the Piscataqua to the St. Croix and from the head waters of the Penobscot and the Kennebec to the Atlantic shore; while, during the same period, the several financial institutions of Portland with which he was connected manifested a like regard by a suspension of their usual business.

Although the earthly activities of Vice-President and General Manager Evans have ceased, his achievements still live, in accordance with the Divine law, whereby "God buries his workmen but carries on their work."

COL. HENRY OAKES KENT.

COL. HENRY OAKES KENT was of the seventh generation in descent from Thomas Kent, who came to this country and settled at Gloucester, Mass., at some time prior to 1643. His father was Richard P. Kent, who came to Lancaster in 1825, where he served for a time as a clerk in a store of Royal Joslyn and subsequently became one of the town's most enterprising and influential citizens. Of his three sons, the subject of this sketch was the oldest and was born in Lancaster on the 3rd day of February, 1834. He received his preliminary education in the schools of his native town and went thence to Norwich, Vt. (now Northfield) University, at which he graduated in 1854. Soon after returning to

Lancaster, he became a student of law in the office of the Hon. Jacob Benton and, upon completing the required course of study, was admitted to the bar in 1858.

Here, in his native town, Col. Kent established his home and set up his household gods. Possessing a taste for journalism, he soon became the editor and publisher of the *Coos Republican*, a position which he held for the succeeding twelve years. This brought him into close touch with the various interests of the town. To the promotion of these he contributed liberally of his time and sympathy. In 1861 and 1862 he served as moderator of the town meetings. For a time, he was clerk of the Lancaster Fire Engine Company, and, from 1869 to 1871, was a fire warden. He was also, for a time, treasurer of the Lancaster Bridge Company and of the Coos Agricultural Society. In 1884 he was made chairman of the committee in charge of the Soldier's Park. He was prominent in Masonry, and in 1898 was chosen a warden of St. Paul's Episcopal Church. In larger measure, however, than to any of these, his attention was given to the responsible duties attaching to the Presidency of the Lancaster Savings Bank and of the Lancaster Trust Company.

But multifarious as were these home duties he found time to render important service to the State. He was Assistant Clerk of the House of Representatives in 1855 and 1856; Clerk, from 1857 to 1859; and in 1862, 1868, 1869, and 1883, was a Representative of his town in that body. He was twice the Democratic Candidate for Governor and several times for Member of Congress from his district.

All through the Civil War, Col. Kent was an active friend of the Union cause, and was commissioned Colonel of the 17th New Hampshire Regiment. He later became a Liberal Republican and supported Horace Greely for President in 1872. Still later, he joined the Democratic party and served as United States Naval Officer, at Boston, from 1885 to 1890.

He was also interested in American history and was a valued member of the Sons of the American Revolution, of the Society of the Cincinnati and of the Society of Colonial Wars in the State of New Hampshire, being Governor of the latter from 1894 to 1900.

Col. Kent possessed an attractive personality and a wide knowledge of mankind and of affairs. His business life was of continuous activity for half a century. He died on the 21st of March, 1909, at the mature age of seventy-five years.

THE ORIGIN OF THE NAME PINKHAM.

While it has been said that "the sources from which names are derived and the circumstances which dictated their taking are so numerous as to be beyond all knowledge" yet the origin of a great many have been discovered as the result of careful study and prolonged research.

A number of theories have been advanced relative to the origin of the "Pinkham" name, for the most part these theories are of a superficial nature being based on its modern orthography.

Probably the most striking fact about the name is that its orthography and phonetics are at variance which suggests that the name has not come down to us in its original form.

The early records of Dover, N. H. contain the following variants of the name: (a) Pinckum, (b) Pinckhame, (c) Pincham, (d) Pinkom.

The fact that the name was apparently pronounced like Pinkum or Pinkom by the Dover ancestor and his contemporaries and that "c" or "k" or both were used without discrimination suggested the probability of Pinkum, Pincum, Pinkom, or Pincom being the original form.

Investigation, along the lines suggested, developed the fact that the name "Pincomb" is mentioned by several authorities; one of these states that it was derived from articles of dress; another, the Herald's Visitations of Devonshire shows conclusively the evolution of the name from "Pyncombe" in 1485 to "Pincomb" in 1620, and mentions the following variants of the "Pyncombe" name:—(e) Pyncombe, (f) Pincomb, (g) Purcomb, (h) Bincomb.

It will be noted that variants (a) and (d) very closely resemble variant (f) and that the first syllable of variant (c) in conjunction with the last syllable of variant (d) forms "Pincom" which is identical with variant (f) except that the silent "b" is absent.

A careful study of the orthographic and phonetic principles involved, will it is believed, lead to no other conclusion than that "Pyncombe" is the ancient form of the "Pinkham" name.

Variant forms of family names are common, since in those

early days, it was not unusual that a man should write his name in three or four ways, due possibly in some degree to the prevailing lack of education, but in a greater degree to the fact that the orthography of the English language was as yet variable and unsettled.

Writers have classified surnames variously according to their origin as local, official, occupative, baptismal and sobriquet, and the "Pyncombe" name would come under the class entitled "local" as the name was undoubtedly derived from "Pyne" the ancient form of "pine" and "combe" which is "that unwatered portion of a valley which forms its continuation beyond and above the most elevated spring which enters into it," or as another authority has it "a valley or amphitheatre like spot in a hill side," or still another "a cell or hollow in a hill side."

It is said to be typical of the manner in which such surnames first came into use, that if, for instance the given name of the first "Pyncombe" was John, his neighbors would speak of him as "John at the pyne combe," having referenee to his hill side home among the pines, soon this would be shortened to John Pyncombe, then as his descendants became scattered they would lose sight of the origin of the name and while retaining the phonetic principle, variant spellings would become common.

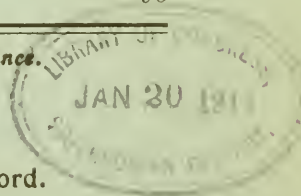

IN MEMORIAM.

DR. HENRY RUST PARKER.

DR. HENRY RUST PARKER, First Vice-President of the New Hampshire Genealogical Society, died at his home in Dover, on the twenty-ninth day of December, 1909, after a brief illness of pneumonia, aged 73 years, 6 months and 5 days.

Were it permitted us, in mortal guise, to penetrate "the blind cave of eternal night" and glance adown futurity's misty reaches, is it not probable that, enchanted with the supernal grandeur of the scene, we would hail with glad acclaim, the dawn of that sempiternal day whose effulgent glory reaches to the sable borderland of death? In the bright aurora of that dawning shall we not meet again the friends who have gone before? While no voice has ever reached us from beyond the sunset's bourn, yet the heart is bouyed with loving faith that communion will be again restored "when the mists have cleared away."

The possibilities of moral and material achievement were conspicuously evidenced in the life-work of our departed friend and colleague.

Orphaned at the age of twelve, he was the architect, in large measure, of that ethical superstructure which won and held the admiration of his friends and acquaintances of later years, whose towering pinnacles gleamed in crystal brightness high above the mists of ordinary ambition and desire. From the bench of the artisan he rapidly ascended, by dint of painstaking study and self-training, to the position of instructor of others, teaching for some time in the academy at Wolfborough, N. H., his native town.

Supplementing his academic training by a course in the Dartmouth Medical School, he received the degree of "M. D.," making his initial appearance as a practicing physician in the place of his nativity.

In the year 1881 Dr. Parker moved to Dover, N. H., where he continued an uninterrupted residence until his death.

Endowed with a studious and analytical mind, Dr. Parker

became not only eminently successful in the practice of his profession, but refreshed and broadened his essentially wide range of human experience by frequent incursions into the realms of science and of letters. Although singularly free from the ordinary errors and foibles of life, he was, nevertheless, eminently human in all his relations with his fellow-men. Tenacious of purpose, yet free from dogmatism; assertive, yet unofficious; dignified, yet never austere, he won and held the entire confidence and respect of all who came within the radius of his vigorous personality, by the exercise of those excellent qualities which form the basis of earnest, honest, conscientious manhood.

On the seventh day of January, 1891, Dr. Parker was formerly inaugurated Mayor of his adopted city. He enjoyed the distinction of being the first Democrat, after more than two score years of uninterrupted Republican supremacy, to wield the gavel as Dover's Chief Executive, having been elected to that high office by a substantial majority in one of the most memorable political contests in the city's history. He was re-elected in the campaign of 1891, serving two full terms as the official head of Dover's municipal government.

Dr. Parker served as president of the board of Examining Surgeons for Strafford County, an office under the jurisdiction of the Department of Pensions, during the administrations of President Cleveland; he was a member of the Dover Medical Society, Strafford County Medical Society and the New Hampshire Medical Society, and also one of the consulting physicians and surgeons on the staff of the Wentworth Hospital. He sought relaxation and diversion from the exacting demands of professional life by uniting with kindred spirits in philanthropic and charitable movements, as well as in the fellowship and cheering amenities of fraternal association. He was a member of Moses Paul Lodge, A. F. & A. M., Belknap Chapter, Royal Arch Masons, St. Paul Commandery, Knights Templar, and A. and A. Scottish Rite.

He was one of the incorporators of the New Hampshire Genealogical Society and a faithful servitor upon its directory. He was also connected with the Northam Colonists, the Society of Colonial Wars of New Hampshire and the Sons of the American Revolution. He was a member of St. Thomas Episcopal church, and evidenced a deep interest in its spiritual and material advancement.

Dr. Parker was united in marriage on the twenty-seventh day of May, 1866, with Miss Ella M. Thompson of Wolfborough, and by this union there were three children: Nathalie S., who married George B. Harper, of Montreal, Canada; Alberta T., wife of Harry P. Henderson, of Dover, N. H.; and Henry R. Parker, Jr., who died December 27, 1894, aged 19 years.

"With silent obsequy and funeral train" all that was mortal of our lamented friend was laid at rest in the family lot at Pine Hill Cemetery, on the dawning day of the new year, Saturday, January 1, 1910, business of all kinds being suspended throughout the city during the hour of service.

The following is the genealogical line of Dr. Parker:

WILLIAM¹ PARKER, born in England about 1662; married February 26, 1703, Lady Zerviah Stanley, daughter of the Earl of Derby, and took up his residence in Portsmouth, N. H., soon thereafter.

HON. WILLIAM² PARKER, of Portsmouth, born in 1704; died April 29, 1781, aged 77 years. He was admitted to the bar in 1732; served as clerk of the commission appointed to settle the boundary line between New Hampshire and Massachusetts in 1737; was appointed Register of Probate by Governor Belcher; afterwards became Judge of Admiralty; served in the General Assembly from 1765 to 1774, and held the position of Judge of the Superior Court from August, 1771, until the office was vacated by reason of the Revolution. He married Elizabeth Grafton about 1726.

MATHEW STANLEY GIBSON³ PARKER, born in 1747; died in 1787; removed to Wolfborough; married Anna Rust, daughter of Col. Henry and Ann (Harvey) Rust. She was born November 4, 1751, and died at Wolfborough June 17, 1786.

HENRY RUST⁴ PARKER, born February 6, 1778; died September 18, 1848; married Hannah, daughter of Henry and Hannah (Horne) Rust. She was born December 21, 1784.

JOHN TAPPAN⁵ PARKER, born September 5, 1804; died September 25, 1848; married Sally L. Seavey.

DR. HENRY RUST⁶ PARKER, born in Wolfborough, N. H., January 24, 1836; married May 27, 1866, Ella M., daughter of Moses and Hannah Marble (Rust) Thompson; died December 29, 1909.

He invites correspondence in regard to the matter. New Hampshire furnishes a large field for genealogical and historical research and the "Record" should be enlarged and placed on a permanent basis. We believe such will be the final outcome of the situation.

BOOK NOTICES.

THE BREWSTER GENEALOGY—1566—1907. *By Emma C. Brewster Jones, Cincinnati, Ohio.* Printed by the Grafton Press, New York, 1909. Cloth, 8vo., 2 Vols., pp. lxxviii and 1415. 52 Illustrations.

The Brewster Genealogy contains a record of the descendants of William Brewster of the "Mayflower," Ruling Elder of the Pilgrim Church which founded Plymouth Colony in 1620. Elder William Brewster was born in the latter part of 1566 or early in 1567, probably at Scrooby, Nottinghamshire, England. He was the son of William and Prudence Brewster of Scrooby. His father died in 1590 and for many years had been receiver of Scrooby and bailiff of the manor house of that place; also had held the office of "Post," which office had previously been held by his father, the grandfather of Elder William. December 3, 1580 at the early age of fourteen, Elder William matriculated at Peterhouse, one of the colleges forming the University of Cambridge, England, but does not appear to have remained long enough to receive his degrees. He was next appointed assistant clerk to William Davison, Secretary of State to Queen Elizabeth and accompanied that gentleman on his embassy to the Netherlands in August 1585 and served him at court until his downfall in 1587. Elder William then returned to the manor house at Scrooby and three years later was administrator on his father's estate. He was soon appointed "Post" which office he continued to hold until September 30, 1607.

At an early age he became a convert to the doctrine of John Robinson, the founder of Congregationalism, and after his return to Scrooby his residence, the manor house, became the place of worship for the members of the new church in that vicinity. At length the government began to enforce the strict laws against the new religion, when in 1607 Elder William and the other members determined to flee to Holland. He, with others, was arrested at Boston, England, and detained there for a month. He finally reached Leyden, the rendezvous of the new church. Here for twelve years he resided, during which time he was engaged in teaching school

and in the printing business. Finally it became necessary to secure a new home for the growing church and it was decided that a part of the members should emigrate to America and Elder William was chosen Ruling Elder to head the party. A big mistake was made in sending out the colony on the eve of the approaching winter, which cost the lives of half the company, but in spite of the cold, inclement weather and scant provisions, through the foresight and indomitable courage of Elder William the colony succeeded. He died at Plymouth, Mass., April 16, 1644.

The work contains a record of more than twenty thousand of his descendants. It is well written, concise, clear, and its general arrangement is excellent. It is a great credit to the writer, and she can well be proud of her life's work, for a work like this takes and represents the greater part of one's life. It has a complete index of names. Reference authorities are given for the first seven generations, which is a very nice feature and not usually found in genealogies. We have long thought that all genealogies should give their reference authorities. The time will come when every genealogy will be tested, time and again, by the future generations and if it can be easily verified it will stand the test, if not then it will not be long in finding its way into the waste basket and some other work better written for reference will take its place.

He was a fisherman and had a grant of land located between Goodman Jackson and William Cotton with convenient landing 12 September, 1653. He died at the Isles of Shoals, and the inventory of his estate was filed July, 1664, amounting to £433. 12. 8. The genealogy is arranged on the plan of the genealogies published in the "New England Historical and Genealogical Register" which has become the standard system now in use by most genealogists in this country. The work shows much research and care in the collecting of

31. MORSE.—The Rev. John Morse had letters of dismissal and recommendation from the church at Wells, Me., and was ordained at Blackberry Hill, Berwick, Me., 30 April, 1755. He died in November, 1764; his daughter Mehitable married Vincent, son of Vincent and Lois (Pinkham) Torr, 30 March, 1783. Vincent was a soldier of the Revolutionary army, 1775-77; he joined the West Society, Baptist, of Newfields, 2 March, 1784; bought pew No. 47 in 1791, and was active in parish affairs 1791-8-9. His Tax was abated 13 March, 1804, on account of a sick son; he died 11 May, 1829. Mehitable was the earliest member on the church roll, now extant, 1814. She died 9 February, 1821.

John Morse Torr, born 25 September, 1783; died 4 September, 1806.

Sarah, born 17 March, 1785; married 29 November, 1804 Ebenezer Doe of Durham; died 26 January, 1846. She was enrolled on Newmarket church records 1814.
