

#### **TERMS**

Orders are accepted subject to prior sale. All over \$1. are sent prepaid. As we begin planting gladioli about April 15th, it is advisable to order by April 1st. Isises may be transplanted at any time, but early spring is excellent for the North, as they make better increase then, and get well established for winter. Lilly bulbs can only be planted very early in the spring, or late in the fall. Tulips, fall only. All other plants, in spring up to June 1st, and in fall, from late August, all thru September.

Most lilies thrive best in cool, moist ground, with shade at least part of the day. These named will do best without lime, tho Tigrinum and Candidum will endure a little. Any of these may be planted in spring, except Candidum, which must be planted in autumn, as early as possible, as it makes a fall growth, which remains green all winter. Autumn planting is equally adapted to the others.

### HARDY PERENNIALS

Following hardy plants may be set out in either spring or fall, except as noted. Spring planting seems best for our northern climate. Prices are 25c each for single plants, \$1.50 per dozen except as noted:

Achillea, the Pearl, clusters of very double, small white flowers.

Aquilegia, long spurred columbine, mixed colors, light or dark.

Aquilegia, Coerulea, splendid large light blue. Aquilegia, Canadensis, showy red and yellow.

Anchusa, Italica, true Dropmore variety, lovely gentian blue flowers, blooms all summer, brilliant in the sun, height 3 to 7 feet, \$1. per doz. Canpanula, medium, (Canterbury bells) bien-

canpanula, medium, (Canterbury bells) biennial, must be set out in spring. Mixed colors only, pink, blue, lavender, lilac and purple.

Carnations, Grenadin white or red. Perfectly hardy, grow as large as hothouse ones, if well cared for and disbudded.

Delphiniums, Gold Medal hybrids, all shades of light to dark blue and mauve.

Delphiniums, Pudors Glory, 25c each, \$2.50 per doz. Nothing finer than these.

Hartje & Elder daisies, early, bloom May and

June, 2 ft., wonderful cut flowers.

Lupines, mixed only, tall, hardy plants, fine for backgrounds. Beautiful foliage. Many shades

of pink and blue to deep purple.

Lily of the Valley, needs no description. small clump will soon spread over large space. Partial shade and plenty of water at blooming time, are required for finest blooms.

Myosotis, Palustris (forget-me-not), blooms all summer, spreads into large plants, completely covered with

Oriental poppies, gorgeous red flowers, with black center, each blossom lasting several days. 3 ft.; late June. Can be planted only when dormant. Aug. or Sept. If moved in spring, will not bloom that year. Physostegia, mixed pink and white, tall growing plants with large flower-heads composed of tiny florets. Also called False Dragonhead.

Pyrethrum Roseum, Rose-pink daisies, 2 to 3 inch in diameter, 2 ft. tall, bloom in June. Charming cut flower.

Physalis franchetti, Chinese Lantern plant, has large orange pods, which are dried for winter bouquets.

Pansies. These are the finest pansies to be found, being Vaughan's International. Large flowered, long, sturdy stems. A bed of them is a joy. 50c per doz., postpaid.

Phlox, mixed hardy phlox, white, lavender and pink

shades, \$1.50 per doz.

Phlox, Miss Lingard, early white. Viking, deep cherry pink. . . Eclaireur, very large heads.

. ( brilliant carmine.

Rhinelander, deep salmon pink, lighter eye.

Caron d'Ashe, deep cherry red. Mrs Jenkins, later white.

Sweet Williams, (dianthus barbatus) mixed, all colors, single and double, 60c per doz.

Scotch Roses, small white roses, completely covering the plant, fine foliage, 40c each, 2 year plants.

All plants above listed are two years old except Canterbury bells, pansies and sweet williams.

#### DARWIN TULIPS

These are ready by September 15th. Must be planted in fall. Bloom late in May. All are tall, the Darwins being the finest tulips grown. These were imported direct from Holland, and I buy more there every year. Large double-nosed bulbs, many producing two blossoms. 60c per dozen, except as noted.

Clara Butt, pink, 50c per doz.

Farncombe Sanders, carmine-rose.

Asa Gray, fine red.

The Sultan, black-maroon.

Dream, early lavender. Bronze Queen, (Breeder) same height and season, but a shade that does not come in Darwins. 90c doz. Combines beautifully with Dream.

Mixed Darwins or double Early, 50c doz.

#### SEEDS

Seeds of Anchusa, Aquilegia Canadensis, Oriental poppy, Sweet William, Delphinium, and Giant red annual poppy, with black center, 10c per pkg. Vaughan's International pansy seed, 15c pkg. Sown in May, blooms in July. Sow Oriental poppies on the last snow, and every seed will be a plant.
