Proposes take with him if feasible in something nature Secretary China Ting-chih previously refused permission proceed in connection with Yuan Tung Company affairs. Says would plan return China or Hong Kong on his next ship.

On July 5, 1949, the Department sent the following airgram to USPOLAD Berlin:

"On June 10, 1949, one Hans FRIEDEL, 33, Gartenstrasse, Ludwigsburg, Württemberg, Germany, addressed a letter to Senator Joseph McCarthy of Wisconsin, as follows:

He lived in Japan from 1933 to 1947, working as a baker and as an instructor to Japanese bakers. In 1935 he married a Japanese national in accordance with Japanese rites, but this marriage not recognized by German consul at Yokohama, since it conflicted with existing racial laws of Nazis. Friedel states that he never was a member of the Nazi party or affiliated organizations; in fact he claims to have been arrested and imprisoned in 1945 for his anti-Nazi activities. In August 1945, after an imprisonment of three months, he was set free by US troops. Under orders issued by Headquarters Eighth Army, Friedel, his wife, and minor child were forcibly repatriated to Germany aboard American vessel Marine Jumper in February 1947. Friedel feels that he and his family were dealt with unjustly, since he, an anti-Nazi, was forced to leave Japan while certain known Nazis were permitted to remain in that country and carry on their businesses. He requests Senator McCarthy to assist him in returning to Japan.







The Secretary of State presents his compliments to His Excellency the Ambassador of Uruguay and has the honor to acknowledge the receipt of the Embassy's note No. 758/949 C. 204.2/949 of October 6, 1949 regarding the return to Japan of Señor D. Carlos Hounie Fleurquin to resume his functions as diplomatic agent of the Uruguayan Government.

Upon receipt of the Embassy's note under reference the Department communicated its contents to the Pacific Military Permit Branch, Department of the Army, for transmission to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers at Tokyo. In reply the Department has received a cablegram from the Supreme Commander stating that there is no information available to indicate that Señor Fleurquin has returned to Japan, nor has a request for his entry into Japan been received. It further states that Señor Felurquin departed from Japan in March, 1948 but in the absence of any official notification to the contrary from the Uruguayan Government since that time he is still considered as being accredited to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers at Tokyo.

REDEPTEL 691, October 6 Chuang Pao-ching says Hua Feng Company business in Japan has been conducted on basis business relations with Yutoku Company, Ginza, 4 Chomei, Mitsukoshi Building, Tokyo and Kohoki Company address unindicated with negotiations already begun with Mitsubishi. Trade to date comprised following Chinese exports mostly via Hong Kong: 30,000 tons salt, 18,200 bean cake, 5,000 soya bean, 2,000 bean oil, 2,000 vegetable seeds, 14,000 coal. Chin Ting-chin reports that Hua Feng Company already has credit in Japan approximately half million US dollars from trade. Chuang desires make trip Japan to further business connections and purchase materials in Japan thus stepping up bilateral exchange of goods.

Believe it highly desirable give Communists taste fruits Sino-Japanese trade, for political purpose diverting their interest from USSR and emphasizing to them the profit which lies in good relations with USA and other non-Soviet countries. Recommend strongly therefore trade be facilitated and procedures made easier. (Such trade would presumably also profit Japanese economy.)

Chuang has another salt shipment departing approximately October 20 from Tientsin for Japan. Recommend early action on request himself and Chin (who in past has proved useful this office) for permission proceed Japan.

Dear Mr. Madill:

At the time of my visit at your office last September 1 on behalf of my mother, Mrs. Anna Slenkina, you gave me a faint ray of hope in saying that it might be possible to have her come to the United States on a boat scheduled to leave the Far East the latter part of September.

In the meantime two letters were received from my aunt, Mrs. V.N. Shepitkovsky (sister of Mrs. Anna Slenkina). Mrs. Shepitkovsky resides in Harbin, Manchuria, China, and her two letters came via two of her friends, one of whom was traveling to Poland and the other to Tientsin.

Mrs. Shepitkovsky wrote that my mother, Mrs. Slenkina, had her visa to the United States and also an exit visa from U.S.S.R. to leave Dairen, and that she also had money and a passage arranged for her via air from Japan to the United States. From the dates of her letters we could tell that Mrs. Slenkina must have been all set to leave Dairen sometime around the middle of June. Still at this time we have no further news.

Is there some possible way that we could establish the reason for the delay and whether there is anything further that we can possibly do to expedite things a bit.

In regard to Mrs. Shepitkovsky, her daughter Mrs. L.O. Larson of Minneapolis, Minn. is acting on her behalf and is equally anxious to be of some further help in having her mother come to this country.

It seems that Mrs. Shepitkovsky was granted a "preference status", sometime ago, and that this status is no longer in effect since Mrs. Shepitkovsky was not able to get to a Consulate of U.S.A. to make her application for a visa. If there is anything that I can possibly do on behalf of Mrs. Shepitkovsky to help Mrs. Larson have her preference status reinstated, I would be only too happy to do so.

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
