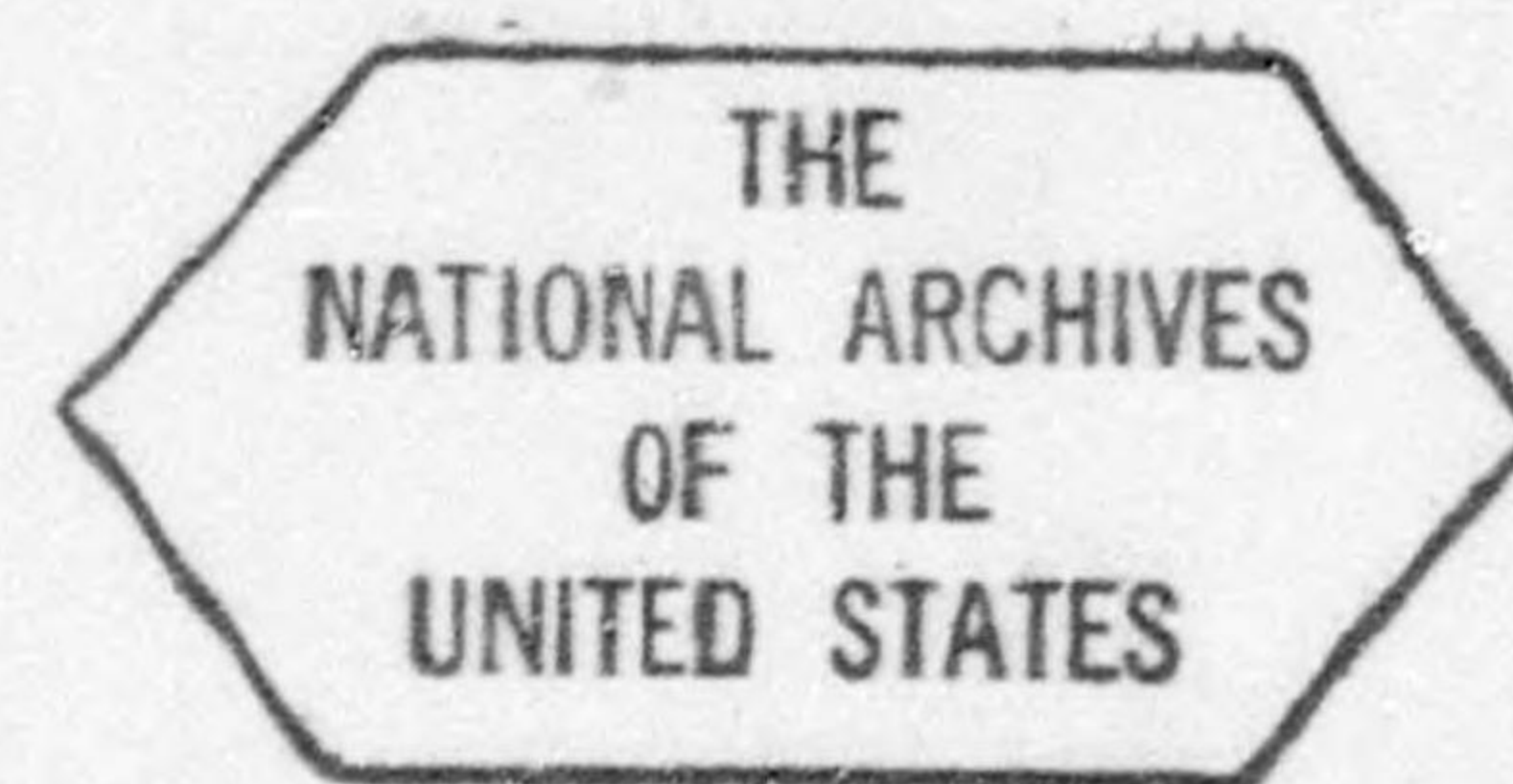

Nature of Examination

Written Test: W15 - 3-hr. 2-part exam, each part consisting of 80 multiple choice items on general intelligence, social science, descriptive science and natural science. W16 & W17 - 4-hr. test with 80 multiple choice items each on the Constitution, Civil Law, Criminal Law, Law of Civil Procedure and Law of Criminal Procedure. W18 - four 3-hr. exams, each consisting of 80 multiple choice items on Criminal Law, Juvenile Law and Criminal Politics in addition to Mental Medical Science (W18-A), Psychology (W18-B), Sociology (W18-C), and Pedagogy (W18-D).

Nature of Examination
