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INFORMATION

Your official 1984 primary election Voters' Pamphlet is divided into separate sections for MEASURES and DEMOCRATIC, REPUBLICAN and NONPARTISAN CANDIDATES. Page numbers for these sections are listed under CONTENTS on this page, where you will also find a page number for the alphabetical INDEX to candidates.

Material in the MEASURES section includes each state and county (if any) ballot title, the complete text of the proposed measure, an impartial statement explaining the measure and its effect, and any arguments filed by proponents and/or opponents. Where applicable, the ballot titles and complete texts of certain district measures also appear in this section. Oregon law allows the legislature to submit one argument in favor of each measure it refers to the people. Citizens or organizations may also file arguments on state measures by purchasing space for \$300 or by submitting a petition signed by 1,000 electors. No arguments supporting or opposing ballot measures can be printed by the Secretary of State unless they have been submitted by one of these methods. This year no arguments in opposition to Measure No. 1 or Measure No. 2 were submitted.

The order for candidate material alternates with successive primary elections. This year the DEMOCRATS appear before the REPUBLICANS. All space is purchased; statements and photographs are submitted by the candidates or their designated agents. The information required by law—pertaining to occupation, occupational and educational background, and prior governmental experience—has been certified by each candidate. Some spaces are blank because Oregon law does not allow the placement of material relating to candidates for different offices on the same page in the Voters' Pamphlet.

The fourth section contains material provided by candidates for NONPARTISAN office. An unopposed candidate for the office of district attorney is automatically nominated and the unopposed candidate's name will not be printed on the ballot until the general election. Otherwise, two candidates will be nominated at the primary election unless one candidate receives a majority of all votes cast for the office, in which case that candidate alone is nominated. Similarly, two candidates will be nominated at the primary election for the office of judge of the Supreme Court, Court of Appeals, circuit or district court, or the Oregon Tax Court. However, when a candidate for one of these offices-other than a candidate to fill a vacancy-receives a majority of all votes cast at the primary election for the office, that candidate is elected. When a nonpartisan candidate for Metropolitan Service District Executive Officer or Councilorin Clackamas, Multnomah and Washington Counties onlyreceives a majority of votes cast at the primary, that candidate is also elected.

Although this is a combined Voters' Pamphlet, in the primary election only registered Democrats vote the Democratic ballot and only registered Republicans vote the Republican ballot. All electors, however, including Independents, vote on measures and nonpartisan positions.

Miscellaneous voting aids—including district maps, precinct and polling place lists, voting instructions, a complete listing of state-certified candidates, and an absentee ballot form—follow the fourth section.

The Voters' Pamphlet has been compiled by the Secretary of State since 1903, when Oregon became one of the first states to provide for the printing and distribution of such a publication. In 1909, the Legislative Assembly passed a law requiring pamphlets to include information on candidates.

One copy of the Voters' Pamphlet is mailed to every household in the state. Additional copies are available at the State Capitol, post offices, courthouses and other public buildings.

VOTING REQUIREMENTS

You may register to vote by mail or in person if:

- 1. You are a citizen of the United States.
- 2. You will be 18 or older on election day.
- 3. You are a resident of Oregon.

IMPORTANT: You may **register** to vote if you meet the above qualifications, but you must be a resident of Oregon **20 days** before you may vote. (The one exception to this provision occurs during a presidential primary or general election. The 20 day requirement is waived when a Certificate of Registration marked "Presidential only" is obtained from your county clerk.)

You must reregister to vote if:

- 1. Your address changes for any reason, even within the same precinct.
- 2. Your name changes for any reason.
- 3. You wish to change political affiliation.

 IMPORTANT: You cannot change political

IMPORTANT: You cannot change political party affiliation within 20 days of the primary election.

YOU MUST BE REGISTERED 20 DAYS BEFORE THE ELECTION FOR YOUR NAME TO BE INCLUDED IN THE POLL BOOK.

You may register to vote within 20 days of election day if:

- 1. You have been a resident 20 days prior to the election date.
- 2. You deliver to the appropriate county clerk or a person designated by the county clerk a completed voter registration form and obtain a "Certificate of Registration."
 - IMPORTANT: If the county clerk receives your application more than ten days prior to election day, your certificate will be mailed to you. During the final ten days before the election you must obtain the certificate in person. Certificates are issued by the county clerk or designated representatives until 8 p.m. on the day of the election.
- 3. You present and surrender your certificate to your new precinct on election day and sign it in view of the election board clerk. The certificate shall be considered part of the poll book and your name will appear at the next election.



HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 27—Referred to the Electorate of Oregon by the 1983 Legislature, to be voted on at the Primary Election, May 15, 1984.

BALLOT TITLE

STATE MAY BORROW AND LEND MONEY FOR PUBLIC WORKS PROJ-

QUESTION-Shall the state be allowed to borrow and lend money for public works projects for community development?

PURPOSE-Measure amends state constitution. State may now lend its credit and incur debt not to exceed one percent of the true cash value of all taxable property in the state. Purpose must be to loan funds to municipal corporations, cities and counties for waste treatment facilities. Measure expands state's ability to loan funds to include other public works facilities for community development.

Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:

PARAGRAPH 1. Section 1, Article XI-H, Oregon Constitution, is amended to read:

Sec. 1. In the manner provided by law and notwithstanding the limitations contained in sections 7 and 8, Article XI, of this Constitution, the credit of the State of Oregon may be loaned and indebtedness incurred in an amount not to exceed, at any one time, one percent of the true cash value of all taxable property in the state:

(1) To provide funds to be advanced, by contract, grant, loan or otherwise, to any municipal corporation, city, county or agency of the State of Oregon, or combinations thereof, for the purpose of planning, acquisition, construction, alteration or improvement of facilities for the collection, treatment, dilution and disposal of all forms of waste in or upon the air, water and lands of this state and of other public works facilities for community development;

(2) To provide funds for the acquisition, by purchase, loan or otherwise, of bonds, notes or other obligations of any municipal corporation, city, county or agency of the State of Oregon, or combinations thereof, issued or made for the purposes of subsection (1) of this section.

PARAGRAPH 2. The amendment proposed by this resolution shall be submitted to the people for their approval or rejection at the next special election held throughout this state or at the next regular primary election, whichever occurs first.

This measure amends Article XI-H of the state constitution. This measure changes the purposes for which debt may be incurred by the state. The state government is now allowed to sell bonds and incur debt under Article XI-H only for waste disposal and pollution control purposes.

This measure allows money raised by the sale of state bonds to also be used to finance other public works facilities for community development.

This measure does not provide new bonding authority. It allows a different use of existing bonding authority.

If this measure is approved, then chapter 532, Oregon Laws 1983 (Enrolled House Bill 2002) also takes effect. House Bill 2002 carries out the intent of the constitutional change. The bill describes what public works facilities for community development are. It also establishes the procedures and conditions under which state agencies, cities, counties and other public corporations may receive funds for such facilities.

The bill limits the principal amount of bonds issued to finance public works facilities for community development to no more than 50 percent of the bonding limit now authorized under Article XI-H which is \$870,000,000. The bond proceeds would be advanced to state agencies, cities, counties and other public corporations in the form of loans, grants or the purchase of their bonds or other secured obligations. The proceeds would have to be spent for improving obsolete, deteriorated or inadequate public transportation, roads, sewage treatment works, water supply works and for constructing new basic facilities needed for the industrial or commercial development of a community. The state may grant up to 30 percent of the cost of the project.

Preference must be given to public works projects located in low income areas or in economically lagging areas.

If financing of public works facilities is done by means of loans or the purchase of municipal bonds or other obligations, repayment of money advanced by the state is required. In event of default, the state guarantees the full payment of the bonds.

House Bill 2002 creates the Community Development Finance Corporation. This state agency is charged with adopting policies, priorities and criteria for financing public works facilities for community development. The corporation will be managed by a twelve-member board of directors. The directors shall be three state officers and nine other members appointed by the Governor.

ARGUMENT IN FAVOR

A healthy climate for economic development in Oregon requires that we protect existing properties as well as lay the groundwork for future growth and jobs. The Community Development Finance Corporation will accomplish both objectives by providing low cost loans for city and county water systems, sewer systems, roads, public transportation and other public works aspects of community development.

Without a healthy infrastructure substantial economic recovery and community development are impossible.

Existing economic activities require ongoing support in the form of good access roads, sewage treatment facilities and water supplies to accommodate present needs and allow for future expansion. New industries are unlikely to locate in an area where such facilities are lacking or inadequate.

Ballot Measure 1 would provide for the use of the state's bonding authority to generate funds for public works projects aimed at community development. These projects will promote stability and orderly economic growth. The measure will establish the Community Development Finance Corporation and make community development in Oregon a reality — not just a goal.

Preference will be given to areas where there is the greatest need. Areas with a low average income, experiencing an economic emergency or are considered lagging economically, will receive first priority when applications are filed for the loans. Projects producing the most jobs per dollar will receive the next priority for funding.

That is economic development where it will have the most impact.

BALLOT TITLE

2 INCREASES FEES FOR LICENSING AND REGISTRATION OF MOTOR VEHICLES

QUESTION—Shall the fees for the licensing and registration of motor vehicles be increased?

PURPOSE—Increases minimum registration-fee by \$10; keeps present moped, motorcycle and "disaster unit" fees.

Increases "farm truck license" fee by 20¢ per 100 pounds and fees for trailer-fleets for hire.

Increases by \$10 licensing fee for: certain trucks, tractors, buses, ambulances, trailers for hire; truck trailers; bus trailers; semi-trailers; fixed-load vehicles. Increases fees for certain other vehicles by up to \$20.

Bridges are priority for state's use of increased revenues. Effective October 1, 1984.

ESTIMATE OF FINANCIAL EFFECT—This measure will increase revenue to the Highway Fund by \$17.6 million in fiscal year 1984-1985 and \$23.0 million in fiscal year 1985-1986. Distribution of this revenue will be made as follows: 67.76 percent state government; 20.07 percent county governments; 12.17 percent city governments.

AN ACT

Relating to motor vehicles; creating new provisions; amending ORS 481.205, 481.210, 481.215, 481.225 and section 9, chapter ______, Oregon Laws 1983 (Enrolled House Bill 2160); prescribing an effective date; and providing that this Act shall be referred to the people for their approval or rejection.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. ORS 481.205 is amended to read:

481.205. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, the annual and biennial license fees prescribed in ORS 481.205 to 481.225 and 481.450 shall be paid to the division upon the registration or upon the annual or biennial renewal of a registration of a motor vehicle, camper, trailer or semitrailer. The fee prescribed by this section for a reflectorized plate shall be paid, in addition to any other fees, upon the registration of a motor vehicle, camper, trailer or semitrailer and at other times when a reflectorized plate is issued.

(2)(a) License fees for vehicles described in ORS 481.210(2) and (3) may be paid on an annual registration basis, or on a quarterly registration basis for not to exceed three quarters, which annual or quarterly license period shall commence at the beginning of any calendar quarter. However, license fees for vehicles registered under ORS 481.645 shall be paid on an annual registration basis from January 1 to December 31, inclusive. For the privilege of making registration on a quarterly basis, an additional fee of \$1 shall be added to the license payment.

(b) License fees for trailers for hire which are part of a fleet of trailers as provided in ORS 481.215 may be paid either on an annual registration basis or a five-year registration basis as provided in ORS 481.215.

- (3) In no case shall any registration fees, or any portion thereof, be less than [\$10] \$20, except for the registration of disaster units, as the term is used in paragraph (d) of this subsection, mopeds and motorcycles. Biennial license fees for these vehicles are as follows:
 - (a) Mopeds, \$6.

- (b) Motorcycles, \$6.
- (c) Motorcycles with sidecar, \$10.
- (d) Motor vehicles or motor trucks commonly known as disaster units which, when in use, are manned by volunteers, which are operated without profit, which are not licensed under ORS 481.125, and which are used for disaster and emergency relief only, \$2.
- (4)(a) Any motor vehicle at least one-half the age of the automobile manufacturing industry in the United States, such industry defined as having begun in the year 1900, which is maintained as a collectors' item and used for exhibitions, parades, club activities and similar uses, but not used primarily for the transportation of persons or property may be issued a permanent license valid for the life of such motor vehicle.
- (b) The fee for the permanent license provided for in paragraph (a) of this subsection shall be [\$20] \$40.
- (5) The fee for each reflectorized vehicle number or identification plate issued and for each set of two plates issued shall be established by the division by rule. The division shall establish the fee for a plate or pair of plates under this subsection by determining the cost to manufacture, including but not limited to the cost to reflectorize, and rounding to the nearest higher half-dollar. If the difference between the cost to manufacture a single plate and the cost to manufacture a pair of plates would result in a difference in the fee established under this subsection, the division shall establish separate fees for issuance of single reflectorized plates and pairs of reflectorized plates.
- (6)(a) Any motor vehicle of special interest which is maintained as a collectors' item and used for exhibitions, parades, club activities and similar uses, but not used primarily for the transportation of persons or property may be issued a permanent license valid for the life of such motor vehicle.
- (b) The fee for the permanent license provided for in paragraph (a) of this subsection and ORS 481.295, shall be [\$35] \$40.
- (c) As used in this subsection, "motor vehicle of special interest" means an American or foreign-made motor vehicle that is:
- (A) At least 25 years old at the time application is made for a permanent license under this subsection; or
- (B) Maintained and operated in accordance with paragraph (a) of this subsection and is sanctioned as a motor vehicle of special interest by an established organization that provides for recognition of motor vehicles of special interest.
- (d) A reconstructed motor vehicle may be a motor vehicle of special interest if:
- (A) The division determines that the reconstructed motor vehicle has been reconstructed with substantially original parts; and
- (B) The reconstructed motor vehicle otherwise complies with paragraph (c) of this subsection.
- (7) A person who violates any provision of this section commits a Class D traffic infraction.

SECTION 2. ORS 481.210, as amended by section 9, chapter 145, Oregon Laws 1983 (Enrolled House Bill 2033), is further amended to read:

481.210. (1) The biennial license fees for vehicles not otherwise provided for in this chapter are [\$20] \$40.

- (a) The biennial registration fee for an electric vehicle not otherwise described in this subsection is [\$50] **\$60**.
- (b) The biennial registration fee for electric vehicles that have two or three wheels is [\$20] \$30. This paragraph does not apply to electric mopeds. Electric mopeds are subject to the same registration fee as otherwise provided for mopeds under this chapter.
- (c) The annual registration fees for electric vehicles described under paragraph (a) of subsection (2) of this section are the same as comparable nonelectric vehicles described in that paragraph plus 50 percent of such fee.
- (d) The annual registration fee for an electric vehicle registered under ORS 481.225 is the same as a comparable nonelectric vehicle registered under that section plus 50 percent of such fee.
- (e) The biennial registration fee for an electric motor home is the same as for comparable nonelectric motor homes under ORS 481.450 plus 50 percent of such fee.
- (8) If there is uncertainty as to the classification of a vehicle for purposes of the payment of registration or license fees under this chapter, the division may classify the vehicle to assure that registration or license fees for the vehicle are the same as for vehicles the division determines to be comparable. The registration or license fees for the vehicle shall be those based on the classification determined by the division.

- (6) In order to register a fixed load vehicle for the minimum fee of [\$10]\$20, the owner shall declare on the application the weight of the vehicle including the cab, chassis and fixed or permanent load of such vehicle. If the owner does not declare the weight, the division shall register such vehicle for the maximum fee of [\$25]\$35.
 - (7) Registration fees for electric vehicles are as follows:
- (a) The biennial registration fee for an electric vehicle not otherwise described in this subsection is [\$50]\$60.
- (b) The biennial registration fee for electric vehicles that have two or three wheels is \$20\$30. This paragraph does not apply to

electric mopeds. Electric mopeds are subject to the same registration fee as otherwise provided for mopeds under this chapter.

- (c) The annual registration fees for electric vehicles described under paragraph (a) of subsection (2) of this section are the same as comparable nonelectric vehicles described in that paragraph plus 50 percent of such fee.
- (d) The annual registration fee for an electric vehicle registered under [ORS 481.225] section 2, chapter ______, Oregon Laws 1983 (Enrolled House Bill 2160), is the same as a comparable nonelectric vehicle registered under that section plus 50 percent of such fee.
- (e) The biennial registration fee for an electric motor home is the same as for comparable nonelectric motor homes under ORS 481.450 plus 50 percent of such fee.
- (8) If there is uncertainty as to the classification of a vehicle for purposes of the payment of registration or license fees under this chapter, the division may classify the vehicle to assure that registration or license fees for the vehicle are the same as for vehicles the division determines to be comparable. The registration or license fees for the vehicle shall be those based on the classification determined by the division.

SECTION 3. ORS 481.215 is amended to read:

481.215. (1) Except as provided in subsections (3) and (4) of this section, annual license fee for trailers (other than travel trailers and mobile homes, bus trailers and truck trailers) that are for hire and are equipped with pneumatic tires is [\$10] \$20.

- (2) Except as to trailers for hire and travel trailers and mobile homes, no license fee is required for trailers equipped with pneumatic tires and having a combined weight of not more than 1,800 pounds.
- (3)(a) Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, when trailers that are for hire and are equipped with pneumatic tires are operated in this state and other jurisdictions as a part of a fleet of trailers for hire, a number of such trailers equal to the average number of such trailers operated in and through Oregon during the preceding registration year, shall be registered with the division and fees thereon shall be paid either as provided in subsection (1) or (4) of this section. Thereafter, all trailers identified as being a part of the fleet and currently registered in any state, territory, province, country or the District of Columbia shall be permitted to operate in this state in both interstate and intrastate commerce. "Fleet" as used in this section, means two or more trailers each having a combined weight of [6,000] 8,000 pounds or less and operated by an individual, association or group of owners if all trailers operated by the individual, association or group are easily and clearly identified as being operated by the individual, association or group.
- (b) Verifiable data as to the average number of such trailers operating in and through the State of Oregon shall be filed in certified form with the division by the owner or authorized representative of the fleet. Any owner whose application for registration under this subsection has been accepted by the division shall preserve the records on which the application is based for a period of four years following the year or period upon which the application is based. Upon request of the division, the owner shall make such records available to the division at its office for audit as to accuracy of number of vehicles, computations and payments or shall pay the reasonable costs of an audit at the home office of the owner by a duly appointed representative of the division.
- (c) If the division determines that the applicant under this section should have registered more trailers in this state under the provisions of this plan, the division may deny any further benefits to the fleet until the additional trailers have been registered.
- (d) The division may make arrangements with agencies of this state or other jurisdictions administering motor vehicle registration laws for joint audits of any owner having trailers registered under this section.

- (4) If an owner of a fleet of trailers for hire elects a 60-month period of registration as an alternative to annual registration of such trailers, the license fee shall be paid as follows:
- (a) A [\$10] **\$20** license fee for the first 12 months of the 60-month period and a bond in such sum as the administrator deems reasonable and adequate in the circumstances with sufficient surety, conditioned that the owner will pay a [\$10] **\$20** license fee at the beginning of each 12-month period; or
 - (b) A [\$50] \$100 license fee for the entire 60-month period.

SECTION 4. The owner of any vehicle registered under ORS 481.215 prior to the effective date of this Act shall not be required to pay the fees prescribed by ORS 481.215 as amended by section 3 of this Act until the expiration of the current registration. All owners applying for new vehicle registrations must pay the fees prescribed by ORS 481.215 as amended by section 3 of this Act.

SECTION 5. ORS 481,225 is amended to read:

- 481.225. (1) Any farmer owning or leasing a motor truck, truck tractor, truck trailer, semitrailer or vehicle used for one or more of the purposes specified in paragraphs (a), (b) and (d) of subsection (3) of this section may apply to the division for and receive a farm truck license to operate the truck, truck tractor, truck trailer, semitrailer or vehicle for the full annual license period by paying therefor the license fees established by subsection (5) of this section.
- (2) Any farmer owning or leasing a motor truck, truck tractor, truck trailer, semitrailer or vehicle used partly for one or more of the purposes specified in paragraphs (a), (b) and (d) of subsection (3) of this section and partly for the purpose described in paragraph (c) of subsection (3) of this section may apply to the division for and receive an apportioned farm license to operate the truck, truck tractor, truck trailer, semitrailer or vehicle for the full annual license period by paying therefor the license fees established by subsection (5) of this section. A vehicle licensed under this subsection shall be subject to the provisions of ORS 767.775 to 767.905 to the extent that it is used for the purposes described in paragraph (c) of subsection (3) of this section.
- (3) A motor truck, truck tractor, truck trailer, semitrailer or vehicle shall be issued a license under this section only:
- (a) When owned or leased by a farmer and used in transporting [his] the farmer's own agricultural commodities, agricultural products or livestock (including the products of such commodities, products or livestock that were packed, processed or manufactured on [his] the farm of the farmer) that were originally grown or raised by [him] the farmer on [his] the farm of the farmer, or when used in any transportation which is incidental to the regular operation of [his] the farm of the farmer, or when used to transport supplies, equipment or materials to [his] the farm of the farmer that are consumed or used on [his] the farm of the farmer.
- (b) When owned or leased by a farmer and used in transporting forest products to [his] the farmer's own farm, or transporting for any purpose forest products originating on [his] the farm of the farmer.
- (c) When owned or leased by a farmer and used partly in transporting from the farm of another farmer agricultural commodities, agricultural products or livestock (including the products of such commodities, products or livestock that were packed, processed or manufactured on such farm and those products indicated in paragraph (b) of this subsection) that were originally grown or raised on such farm or when used partly in transporting agricultural supplies, equipment, materials or livestock to the farm of another farmer for use or consumption on such farm.
- (d) When owned or leased by a farmer and used in the transportation of agricultural products, supplies, equipment or materials for another farmer on an exchange of labor basis if such supplies, equipment or materials are to be used or consumed on such farm or are directly related to the operation of said farm.

- (4) For the purposes of paragraphs (a) and (c) of subsection (3) of this section, packed or processed agricultural products or livestock does not include products that have been transformed into a finished state on the farm.
- (5) The license fee for licenses issued pursuant to subsections (1) and (2) of this section shall be based upon the following, using the light weight of the vehicle:
- (a) Over 3,000 pounds and not over 4,500 pounds, [40] **60** cents per 100 pounds or fraction thereof.
- (b) Over 4,500 pounds, [60] 80 cents per 100 pounds or fraction thereof.
- (6) A vehicle licensed under subsection (1) of this section may be operated for the personal use of the farmer, any member of [his] the immediate family of the farmer or any person in [his] the employ of the farmer but any use of such vehicle contrary to ORS 767.030 shall subject the owner and the vehicle to ORS chapter 767. A vehicle licensed under subsection (2) of this section shall not be subject to ORS 767.005 to 767.640.
 - (7) As used in this section:
 - (a) "Farm" includes one or more farms, orchards or ranches.
- (b) "Farmer" means a person who is engaged, either as owner or renter, in a farm operation of a size to reasonably require the use of the motor vehicle or vehicles claimed under the exemptions provided by this section and ORS chapter 767, but does not include cooperative corporations or associations organized under the provisions of ORS chapter 62 or corporations, or subsidiaries of corporations, if the shares of the corporation or subsidiary are owned by more than 100 shareholders. As used in this paragraph, "shares" and "shareholder" have the same meaning given these terms in ORS 57.004.
- (8) As used in this section, "forest products" means forest materials originating on a farm or as an incident to the regular operation of a farm, but piling, poles over 30 inches in circumference at the large end, and logs over eight feet six inches in length or logs over eight feet six inches but not over 16 feet 6 inches in length when transported on any motor vehicle having a gross weight in excess of 16,000 pounds shall not be considered forest products, agricultural commodities or agricultural products within the meaning of this section.
- (9) Application for a license under this section shall be made upon forms prepared by the division and shall include:
- (a) The name, residence, specific location and post-office address of the applicant.
- (b) The specific location and approximate number of acres in the farm upon which the truck, truck tractor, truck trailer, semitrailer or vehicle is to be used.
- (c) The type of agricultural commodities, agricultural products or livestock, produced on the farm and approximate amounts produced annually.
 - (d) Number of trucks used on the farm.
- (e) A statement and representation that the truck, truck tractor, truck trailer, semitrailer or vehicle will be used for one or more of the purposes specified in subsection (3) of this section, and will not, at any time while licensed under this section, be used for any other purpose or for the transportation of any other commodities or products for hire, except as provided in subsection (3) of this section and that the truck, truck tractor, truck trailer, semitrailer or vehicle is needed in the operation of the farm.
 - (f) Any other information required by the division.
- (g) Additional information required by law or by the division in making an application for a regular annual truck, truck tractor, truck trailer, semitrailer or vehicle license.
- (10) Application for renewal of a farm license shall contain only a statement that the use of the vehicle has not changed substantially since the date the vehicle was most recently licensed.

- (11) The application shall contain or be verified by a written declaration that it is made under penalties for false swearing. No person shall wilfully make and subscribe any application which contains or is verified by a written declaration that it is made under penalties for false swearing, which [he] the person does not believe to be true and correct as to every material matter.
- (12) No person shall use a vehicle licensed under this section, or permit a vehicle owned by [him] the person and licensed under this section, to be used for any purpose other than those listed in subsections (2) and (3) of this section.
- (13) The division is authorized to procure and furnish number plates of a special design, to be used in connection with the farm truck licenses issued under this section.
- (14) Upon sale of a truck, truck tractor, truck trailer, semitrailer or vehicle licensed under this section, the number plates shall be deemed void and shall be removed from such vehicle by the new owner and surrendered to the division. However, if the new owner is entitled to license the truck, truck tractor, truck trailer, semitrailer or vehicle under this section and makes application for transfer of the license to [him] the new owner, the division shall transfer the license to the new owner upon payment of the certificate of title fee specified in ORS 481.115 and the number plates on the vehicle at the time of the sale shall be valid for the balance of the license period.
- (15) A person who violates any provision of this section commits a Class B traffic infraction.

SECTION 5a. If House Bill 2160 becomes law, section 5 of this Act is repealed and section 9, chapter _____, Oregon Laws 1983 (Enrolled House Bill 2160), is amended to read:

Sec. 9. The registration period for registration under section 2, chapter _____, Oregon Laws 1983 (Enrolled House Bill 2160), [of this 1983 Act] is an annual registration period. The registration fee for registration described under section 2, chapter

_____, Oregon Laws 1983 (Enrolled House Bill 2160), [of this 1983 Act] is for the registration period and shall be based upon the following, using the light weight of the vehicle:

- (1) Over 3,000 pounds and not over 4,500 pounds, [40] **60** cents per 100 pounds or fractions thereof.
- (2) Over 4,500 pounds, [60] **80** cents per 100 pounds or fraction thereof.

SECTION 6. The first priority for the use of increased revenue for state highway purposes from the increase in registration fees in ORS 481.205, 481.210, 481.215 and 481.225 as amended by sections 1, 2, 3 and 5 of this Act shall be for the construction, reconstruction, improvement, repair, maintenance, operation and use of bridges. This section does not establish a priority for the use of such revenue by cities, counties or other governmental subdivisions of this state.

SECTION 7. This Act takes effect October 1, 1984.

SECTION 8. This Act shall be submitted to the people for their approval or rejection at a special election held throughout this state on the same date as the next regular primary election.

EXPLANATION

This measure increases the license and registration fees for most vehicles an average of \$10 per year. The revenues from these fee increases would be deposited in the State Highway Fund.

The State Constitution limits the use of the Highway Fund to the improvement, repair and building of roads and their administrative cost. This measure sets a priority for the state's portion of the new money under the increased fees. The priority is to spend the new money on bridges. The bridge priority does not apply to the city and county share of the funds. The law gives approximately one-third of the money collected to cities and counties for local improvements on streets and roads.

This measure increases the fee for most cars and light trucks from the present \$20 every two years to \$40 every two years. The fee for most commercial vehicles will also increase \$10 per year.

There are fee increases for other types of vehicles also. These include the following:

The fee for most electric vehicles is increased by \$10 every two years. The fee for electric vehicles that are registered by weight remains 50 percent more than similar nonelectric vehicles.

The fees for trailers for hire are increased by \$10 per year.

The fee for farm vehicles is increased 20 cents per 100 pounds.

The fees for vehicles registered as antiques and used only for shows, parades and similar uses are increased from a one time fee of \$20 to a one time fee of \$40. The fee increase does not apply to vehicles already registered as antiques.

The fees for vehicles that are registered as special collector vehicles and used only for shows, parades and similar uses are increased from a one time fee of \$35 to a one time fee of \$40. This also does not apply to vehicles already registered as collector vehicles.

This measure does not increase fees for mopeds, motorcycles, private disaster units, travel trailers, campers, motor homes, mobile construction trailers or special use trailers.

This measure would take effect on October 1, 1984.

ARGUMENT IN FAVOR

The joint legislative committee appointed to prepare this statement recommends a "Yes" vote on ballot measure number 2.

Oregon is faced with ever increasing costs and problems in the repair and maintenance of its roads. These costs continue to exceed the money the state and the local governments have for dealing with the problems. The roads continue to deteriorate causing individuals to face increased costs for car repair. Also, the lack of adequate and well maintained roads is having an increasingly bad effect on the ability of this state to provide the services necessary for economic development.

One of the ways Oregon pays for road building, improvement, repair and maintenance is by using moneys collected for the registration of vehicles. The state Constitution requires that this money be used for roads. The legislature has passed laws to give almost one-third of this money to cities and counties for road use.

Registration fees were last increased in 1950. At that time, the fees were raised to their present level. Although this state now has lower registration fees than any of its neighboring states and some of the lowest such fees in the nation, the bargain is beginning to be at the expense of the roads we all use.

This measure does increase registration fees, but the increase for most people is a small amount. For most vehicles, the increase is \$10 a year. But the increase is constitutionally required to be used for roads and therefore to benefit those who pay the fee. By charging and benefiting the users and not charging the nonusers, this increase would be in keeping with the Oregon tradition of being a user oriented charge.

It is important to realize that the money raised would bring more money to Oregon than the actual increase in the fees. With this additional money, Oregon will be more able to obtain available federal moneys and will therefore increase substantially the moneys for use on Oregon's roads. The increased moneys will provide jobs for Oregonians and will provide a transportation base for much needed services and economic development in this state.



Precinct Committeeperson

STATE QUALIFICATIONS

Electors of the Democratic party may elect at the primary election a Precinct Committeeperson of each sex for every 500 electors, or major fraction thereof, who were registered to vote in the precinct on January 31 of the year of the primary election.

In any event, electors of the Democratic party in a precinct shall be entitled to elect not less than one committeeperson of each sex in the precinct. No person, however, shall hold office as committeeperson in more than one precinct.

A member of the Democratic party may become a candidate for Precinct Committeeperson of the precinct in which the person is registered, or of a precinct within the same county adjoining that precinct, by filing the declaration of candidacy described in ORS 249.031. No filing fee is charged.

A person who has been registered to vote as a member of the Democratic party for 180 days before the primary election may also be elected by write-in votes in the precinct of residence or in an adjoining precinct in the same county.

Unless a qualified person receives at least three votes, no person shall be deemed to have been elected as Precinct Committeeperson and the office of committeeperson shall be vacant.

Not later than the 17th day after the primary election, the county clerk shall mail a certificate of election to each newly elected committeeperson. Those committeepersons elected by write-in votes will also receive an "Acceptance of Office" form which must be signed and returned to the county clerk not later than the 24th day after the primary election.

The term of office for a Precinct Committeeperson is from the 24th day after the date of the primary election until the 24th day after the date of the next following primary election.

Except as provided in ORS chapter 260, a Precinct Committeeperson shall not be considered a public officer.

SPECIFIC DUTIES

Precinct Committeepersons constitute the County Central Committee of their party. This is the highest party authority in county political matters; it may adopt rules or resolutions for any matter of party government which is not controlled by laws of this state.

Precinct Committeepersons are the voting delegates to the appropriate congressional district conventions of the major political party with which they are affiliated. Delegates to national conventions and presidential electors are selected at the district conventions.

An elected committeeperson who represents a precinct which is subsequently combined, consolidated or abolished shall continue to be a member of the County Central Committee until the next regular election for Precinct Committeeperson.

A vacancy in the office of Precinct Committeeperson occurs when the committeeperson resigns, changes residence outside the precinct, changes political party affiliation, dies or is recalled. When a vacancy occurs, the county clerk shall remove the name of the person from the official roll; declare that office of Precinct Committeeperson to be vacant; and notify the appropriate County Central Committee.

The members of a County Central Committee may select a member of the major political party who is registered in the precinct in which the vacancy exists, or an adjoining precinct in the same county, to fill a vacancy in the office of Precinct Committeeperson. The County Central Committee shall make written notice of the selection to the county clerk. The person so selected shall have the same powers, duties and privileges as an elected committeeperson.

DEMOCRATIC PARTY DUTIES

A Precinct Committeeperson is a member of the County Central Committee, the highest party authority in county political matters. A Precinct Committeeperson represents the Party to the Democrats in his/her precinct and represents the Democratic voters in his/her

precinct to the Party.

Only newly elected Precinct Committeepersons will participate in the election of county party officers and delegates to the State Central Committee at the County Reorganization Meetings.

OFFICERS OF THE DEMOCRATIC PARTY OF OREGON

COMMONSENSE LEADERSHIP FOR AMERICA'S FUTURE

I believe our Nation faces a similar choice in 1984. I think it is time we elected leadership that cares a little less about ideology and a lot more about our future.

When it comes to the future of America, there are a number of goals we all share. Although the rate of economic collapse slowed significantly during 1983, as compared with 1982, at the close of 1983 the output of physical goods was about 4% below the average for 1982. Outside the U.S., it was much worse; a deep depression in world trade levels collapsed the future foreign markets for U.S. exports, which hit us slightly during 1983, and will hit our economy with major force during 1984 and 1985.

Worse, we are at the edge of a world-wide financial collapse. Most of Latin America's debts (about \$350 billion) will have to be written off the books during 1984, and similar conditions of national financial bankruptcy exist now in Africa, parts of Asia, and even among a growing number of nations in Western Europe. The threat of world-wide financial collapse during 1984 is greater than during the administration of President Herbert Hoover, at the time the world depression erupted in May 1931. Now, as then, some people are promising "prosperity is just around the corner."

In many locations within the United States, the new depression has already struck. Some communities which were formerly leading industrial centers have official unemployment rates above 20%. In the nation as a whole, unemployment rates are much higher than reported by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. As persons' unemployment benefits are exhausted, the Bureau drops them from the labor force and unemployment rolls; more than a million unemployed were "buried" by such accounting tricks during 1983. If we include all people who desire unemployment, plus those others too discouraged to seek employment, we have about 25 million unemployed. The results of this massive real unemployment stares us in the face as we look from city to city around the nation, and as we look at budget deficits and falling tax revenues at the federal, state, and local levels.

Meanwhile, the military junta which came to power in Moscow during August 1983 is using the large margin of Soviet military superiority to attempt to force the United States during 1984-1985 as Adolph Hitler frightened Britain's Prime Minister Neville Chamberlain to back down at Munich in 1938. Within some parts of the Republican Party, as among some leading candidates for the Democratic Presidential nomination, the Nuclear Freeze movement spreads the wishful delusion that Moscow is peace loving, and that we must disarm drastically.

The chief cause for the collapse of the U.S. economy and the world financial crisis is the Volcker Federal Reserve policies introduced by the Carter-Mondale administration in October 1979. The leading reason I am campaigning for the Democratic Presidential nomination is that the other leading candidates and Democratic Chairman Charles Manatt, as well as AFL-CIO President Lane Kirkland, have consistently defended Volcker and his policies against my continued efforts to eliminate the Volcker policies, since October-November 1979. I fear that the election of a Nuclear Freeze supporter who defends Volcker's monetary philosophy would be a hideous danger to the future of our nation.

We must do four things:

- (1) We must dump Volcker's Federal Reserve policies, and mobilize our economy as President Franklin Roosevelt did during the 1939-1943 period.
- (2) We must reorganize the debts of our Latin American neighbors, at low interest rates, reestablish a gold reserve dollar, as a first step toward a sweeping reform of international monetary policies—otherwise the new world-wide financial collapse cannot be stopped.
- (3) We must implement immediately the President's new strategic doctrine of March 23, 1983:
 - (a) Put a first-generation ballistic missile defense into place by 1988, and
 - (b) Continue to offer Moscow to tear down the missiles race by a shift to defensive anti-missile systems.
- (4) Make the Democratic Party once again the Party of President Franklin Roosevelt, by bringing representatives of the Party's traditionalist "silent majority" back into leadership at all levels.

To accomplish these four things, I and thousands of Democratic candidates in this year's elections are running on the same slate. We represent the "silenced majority" among traditionally Democratic voters. Enough votes for me and my slate will bring that "silenced majority" of voters back into political power in this republic of ours.

CANDIDATE'S STATEMENT: My campaign is part of a nation-wide, bipartisan slate of candidates under the auspices of the National Democratic Policy Committee. Spearheaded by the campaign of Democratic Party presidential candidate Lyndon La-Rouche, in Oregon one hundred citizens have responded to Mr. LaRouche's call for patriots to rise above party politics, run for public offices and rally fellow Americans to meet the worsening crisis threatening our nation and livelihoods. The time has come for plain talk and extraordinary action. You, as much as I, must shoulder responsibility for deciding the fate of the world.

At the root of all issues is the right-to-life principle. By this I mean the absolute commitment to the survival and quality of life of each and every man, woman and child, born and unborn, of every race, color and creed, as being society's most precious resource. Without this commitment, societies degenerate into living hells of pestilence and discontent, leading into regional wars, dictatorships and slave-labor states.

My campaign has proposed that mankind must exceed past accomplishments if it is to be blessed with economic prosperity. The Apollo project, which put a man on the moon, exemplifies a culturally uplifting program which organized the talents and resources of our nation into an economic boom. Therefore, I advocate an ambitious space program—the colonization of the moon and Mars. Also, I fully support the implementation of a beamweapons, anti-missile defense system as indispensible not only to inaugurating an era of Mutual and Assured Survival (as President Reagan has proposed), but as a science-driver to revolutionize the U.S. economy on a scale exceeding that of the introduction of electricity in the last century.

My campaign has urged the full participation of the U.S. in vast development projects—such as the greening of the Sahara Desert—as indispensible to global stability, strong alliances, the promotion of human life and the expansion of U.S. market-capabilities. If we plan it right, the Kra Isthmus Canal project in Southeast Asia (which promises to exceed the Panama Canal project) would vastly upgrade Oregon's economy. Also, the revival of the North American Water and Power Alliance is a basis for vastly irrigating central and eastern Oregon.

To counter the impediments posed by the Malthusian, or zero-growth, ideology centered in the financial mafias of the world's major banks, my campaign has urged the creation of new financial institutions to replace the bankrupt and genocidal International Monetary Fund and Bank for International Settlements, the "federalization" of the Federal Reserve to restore U.S. sovereignty over its national credit (as it was under George Washington's administration), gold backing for the dollar, and issuance of low-interest credit strictly for renovation of infrastructure, energy grid, factories and farms. I recommend this program both as a national security issue and a right-to-life issue.

My campaign has warned of a deliberate and steady Soviet war build-up; that the Communist Party has become subordinated to the emergence of the Red Army and certain collaborators in the KGB and Soviet church hierarchy. This grouping's ideology converges on a psychosis echoing Khomeini's Iran and Hitler's Third Reich. Moreover, the Soviets have entered into collaboration with what has been called the "Nazi International," which is organized around the Swiss financial enclave.

I have warned against appeasing the Soviet Union. Yet, my campaign also stresses that the Soviets are victims, as we are, of manipulation by Malthusian geopoliticians. We would not be in our present peril if it was not for anti-life traitors like Henry Kissinger, Averell Harriman, Robert McNamara, Paul Volcker and Arthur Burns. Nonetheless, the Soviet threat is real and must be faced.

Again as right-to-life and national security issues, I urge an allout war on drugs, and the renovation of our nation's public school curriculum to produce citizens who can ensure the moral progress of our republic, as befits its heritage. Every child undergoing elementary and secondary education should master the laws which govern Nature (meaning physical and life sciences) and Man (meaning history), should come to know how those laws affect nationbuilding (meaning political economics and statescraft), and should master accordingly the means to develop concepts adequate for making sensually real those laws (meaning physical geometry, classical counterpoint: part-singing, performance and composition, and grammar and speech developed according to the geometric rigors of poetry and music).

If you approve of this program, support the NDPC campaign not just with your vote. Join the National Democratic Policy Committee; set up bipartisan local chapters in your area. Also, for our young people, help me organize a student society which I have planned, which I call the Society of Prometheus.



McFARLAND MAKES SENSE

National security and economic strength depend on educated and innovative workers.

Ruth McFarland sponsored legislation establishing Basic Research Funds for Higher Education, grants to community colleges for training workers for new or expanding industries, required kindergarten in Oregon, and handicapped student service coordinators.

McFARLAND MAKES SENSE

ON SOCIAL SECURITY/MEDICARE: Ruth McFarland is committed to a fiscally sound Social Security System. Unemployment, greater life expectancy, a shift in the ratio of workers to retirees, and the addition of beneficiaries not in the original plan have posed difficulties. The current Social Security Tax is regressive.

Proposed cuts in Medicare would increase medical costs to patients, discriminate against elderly women and those whose life expectancies are lower than "average" and should be re-examined. Ruth McFarland supports a single standard benefit level, unrelated to sex and sufficient to live at an adequate economic level.

Ruth McFarland sponsored continuation of the Displaced Home-maker Program, and increased retirement benefits for members of the Public Employees' Retirement System and Teachers' Retirement System.

McFARLAND MAKES SENSE

ON THE ENVIRONMENT: Ruth McFarland's strong commitment to responsible stewardship of the environment and natural resources reflects the values of Oregonians. McFarland believes that we are caught between the need for jobs and the protection of environment but that we can conserve enough energy to maintain economic development, reduce environmental strain and seek solutions to long-range needs.

Ruth McFarland sponsored legislation which increases revenue for pollution control in industrial areas, protects shellfish on Oregon beaches, and is Co-Chair of the Statutory Water Oversight Committee

McFARLAND MAKES SENSE

ON THE NUCLEAR FREEZE: Ruth McFarland favors an immediate, verifiable, multilateral nuclear freeze. Nuclear arms production makes no sense. Ruth McFarland and the majority of other scientists agree that detonation of 10% of the world's nuclear arsenal would destroy the total biosphere of the earth. Production of nuclear arms and their delivery systems subtracts billions annually from our ability to meet obligations to children, elders, the poor, public facilities, and education systems.

Ruth McFarland co-sponsored a 1981 Senate Memorial to Congress requesting the President propose to the Soviet Union a mutual freeze on nuclear arms.



A Message To Oregon Voters From Vern Cook, Democratic Candidate For Attorney General.

Oregon's Attorney General is the chief legal officer for the people of the State of Oregon, acting through their executive and legislative branches of government. The responsibility of the Attorney General (AG) is unique. The AG is neither a judge nor a hired hand for the executive branch of government, i.e., the governor and other elected state officials. It is the responsibility of the Attorney General to advise the legislators as to the effect of legislation they propose and to advise the executive branch as to the meaning of laws which have been adopted. In addition, certain legal administrative responsibilities have been imposed upon the office. As the only statewide elected official, the AG owes a special responsibility to all of the people of Oregon.

With the high level of responsibility imposed upon the Attorney General, there is a correspondingly great need for special competence, integrity, objectivity and quality of leadership in the right direction. It is here that questions have been raised with respect to the incumbent, the present holder of that office. It is because those questions have not, but should be, answered, that I have decided to seek the Democratic nomination for Attorney General.

Here are my qualifications:

I have been a member of the Oregon Bar and of the Oregon Federal District Bar for over 30 years. I have tried cases at all levels of the court system. I have served as a city judge and as a city, water district and school board attorney. I have handled numerous appeals before the Oregon Supreme Court and the Courts of Appeals at both the Oregon and Federal levels.

In 1980, when Attorney General Redden resigned, the Oregon Trial Lawyers' Association recommended that I be appointed as his successor. I was not appointed because Governor Atiyeh, a Republican above everything else, appointed as the law mandated Democratic replacement, a Democrat who promised not to run for election. This cleared the way for the incumbent's election.

As a 24-year member of the Oregon Legislature, I had extensive experience in the making of laws which will be invaluable to me as Attorney General. During that time I chaired the Senate Judiciary Committee and co-chaired the committee responsible for the adoption of the Oregon Rules of Civil Procedure. I chaired the Senate Revenue Committee for eight years and became intimately familiar with Oregon's tax system. At one time or another, I served on almost every major legislative committee except Ways and Means.

As a forthright legislator, I made many friends and many enemies because of my candor. Honesty is a moral strength but political candor makes many powerful political enemies, especially among the greedy special interests. During my 24 years in the legislature and 31 years as a lawyer, while many have opposed my advocacy and my point of view, no one has ever questioned my honesty or integrity.

The legal competence and fairness of the incumbent in exercising the duties of his office should be the issue of this election. His conduct in connection with the recent sales tax fiasco illustrates the need for a new Attorney General.

One of the primary public responsibilities of the Attorney General is to prepare ballot titles and summaries for all state level initiated and referred measures. In 1952, Attorney General Robert Y. Thornton ran and was elected on a promise that he would prepare fair, accurate and understandable ballot titles. The title and summary of the proposed sales tax measure written by the incumbent AG for that measure was so biased in favor of it, inaccurate and deceptive, that the Supreme Court threw it out. They substantially adopted the substitutes suggested by Representative Wally Priestley and Senator Edward Fadeley.

In connection with the protracted and interminable argument and controversy over the referral of two constitutional amendments related to the sales tax, thrown out by the Supreme Court on its own initiative, the incumbent AG stood by and never questioned the obviously unconstitutional method by which the Legislature referred it. Even when supporters of the sales tax measures brought a sweetheart lawsuit, trying only to knock out certain language, but trying to keep the sales tax measure on the ballot, the incumbent raised no objection to the way the proposal was submitted. Instead, he tried to get the lawsuit thrown out on a technicality. He should have advised the legislature during its session that the referral method was unconstitutional. He should have argued before the Supreme Court that the measure should not go on the ballot. The Supreme Court ruled the measure off the ballot but with no help from the incumbent.

I fight hard for what I believe and for my clients. As Attorney General, I would be the people's lawyer, giving straight, honest answers, letting the chips fall where they may.

I want to work for you as your Attorney General and I ask for your vote.





Precinct Committeeperson

STATE QUALIFICATIONS

Electors of the Republican party may elect at the primary election a Precinct Committeeperson of each sex for every 500 electors, or major fraction thereof, who were registered to vote in the precinct on January 31 of the year of the primary election.

In any event, electors of the Republican party in a precinct shall be entitled to elect not less than one committeeperson of each sex in the precinct. No person, however, shall hold office as committeeperson in more than one precinct.

A member of the Republican party may become a candidate for Precinct Committeeperson of the precinct in which the person is registered, or of a precinct within the same county adjoining that precinct, by filing the declaration of candidacy described in ORS 249.031. No filing fee is charged.

A person who has been registered to vote as a member of the Republican party for 180 days before the primary election may also be elected by write-in votes in the precinct of residence or in an adjoining precinct in the same county.

Unless a qualified person receives at least three votes, no person shall be deemed to have been elected as Precinct Committeeperson and the office of committeeperson shall be vacant.

Not later than the 17th day after the primary election, the county clerk shall mail a certificate of election to each newly elected committeeperson. Those committeepersons elected by write-in votes will also receive an "Acceptance of Office" form which must be signed and returned to the county clerk not later than the 24th day after the primary election.

The term of office for a Precinct Committeeperson is from the 24th day after the date of the primary election until the 24th day after the date of the next following primary election.

Except as provided in ORS chapter 260, a Precinct Committeeperson shall not be considered a public officer.

SPECIFIC DUTIES

Precinct Committeepersons constitute the County Central Committee of their party. This is the highest party authority in county political matters; it may adopt rules or resolutions for any matter of party government which is not controlled by laws of this state.

Precinct Committeepersons are the voting delegates to the appropriate congressional district conventions of the major political party with which they are affiliated. Delegates to national conventions and presidential electors are selected at the district conventions.

An elected committeeperson who represents a precinct which is subsequently combined, consolidated or abolished shall continue to be a member of the County Central Committee until the next regular election for Precinct Committeeperson.

A vacancy in the office of Precinct Committeeperson occurs when the committeeperson resigns, changes residence outside the precinct, changes political party affiliation, dies or is recalled. When a vacancy occurs, the county clerk shall remove the name of the person from the official roll; declare that office of Precinct Committeeperson to be vacant; and notify the appropriate County Central Committee.

The members of a County Central Committee may select a member of the major political party who is registered in the precinct in which the vacancy exists, or an adjoining precinct in the same county, to fill a vacancy in the office of Precinct Committeeperson. The County Central Committee shall make written notice of the selection to the county clerk. The person so selected shall have the same powers, duties and privileges as an elected committeeperson.

REPUBLICAN PARTY RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. A Precinct Committeeperson communicates with neighbors in his or her precinct and tells their concerns to Republican officeholders and candidates.
- 2. A Precinct Committeeperson attends the County Organization Meeting and elects county Republican leaders. This meeting occurs not more than 50 days after the election.
- 3. A Precinct Committeeperson helps register new Republicans.
- 4. A Precinct Committeeperson helps turn out Republican electors on election day.
- 5. A Precinct Committeeperson attends the Congressional District Convention, held every four years, at which National Convention delegates are selected.
- 6. A Precinct Committeeperson helps organize the county Republican activities and works for Republican candidates at the national, state and local levels.

WHERE WE ARE

Four years ago, I began my message to Oregonians with this same heading: "Where We Are." I reported that America faced the greatest challenge in our post-war history.

Our nation's defenses were dangerously weak. We had suffered humiliation in Iran, and there was the sense that we had lost the respect of friend and foe alike.

Our nation lacked leadership. Even in Washington our elected officials failed to trust in the courage and character of Americans, attributing our problems to a national "malaise."

Worst of all, years of Government overindulgence and abusive taxation had left us in the worst economic mess since the Great Depression. Stagflation and the energy crisis, watchwords of the '70s, seemed to suggest the inevitable decline of America's economic power.

AMERICA IS BACK

We have come a long way in these last three years. Americans were ready to make a new beginning. Now there is a renewed energy and optimism throughout the land. America is back and standing tall, looking to the '80s with courage, confidence, and hope.

In the five years before I took office taxes doubled. Inflation rose to over 13 percent in 1979 and to 15 percent in March of 1980. Interest rates were over 21 percent, the highest in 120 years. Industrial production and real wages were down.

The only things going up were prices, unemployment, taxes, and the size of government. Mounting inflation and increasing taxes reduced the reward for hard work, thrift, and risk taking.

In 1980 I offered a plan for economic recovery, and we achieved what the cynics said could never be done: real economic growth AND a reduction in inflation and unemployment rates. I delivered the first across-the-board tax cut in 20 years and Americans saw an

increase in their real after tax income. The prime interest rate has been cut in half. New homes are being built and sold; consumer spending is rising rapidly. Over four million Americans found jobs last year, one of the greatest employment gains in over 30 years.

My Administration also drastically reduced inflation—the cruelest tax of all—while continuing to deliver a broad range of social services to those Americans truly in need. The 1979-1980 inflation robbed a poor family on a \$10,000 fixed income of \$2,000 in buying power. That crippling 12.4 percent rate has been cut to 3.8 percent last year.

My Administration also redirected social benefits to the neediest Americans. Combined federal and state spending for AFDC—a major welfare program—increased by some \$600 million between 1980 and 1982. More poor children received free school lunches last year than in 1980, and 2.3 million more people received food stamps. Also, there will be about 400,000 more Medicaid beneficiaries in 1984.

Because of this combination of reduced inflation and taxes, and targetted social spending, all Americans are better off now than they were four years ago.

WORLD LEADERSHIP

America is also back as a world leader. We put behind us the national tragedy of the Iranian hostage crisis. We put behind us the period of great national self-doubt that had replaced our traditional American optimism. And we began to rebuild our national spirit and our national defenses. We know the tide of the future is a freedom tide, and that America's new strength and sense of purpose will carry hope and opportunity far from our shores.

America must continue to seek international stability and peace, and to strive to remove the threat of nuclear war. We must work to achieve real reductions in both American and Soviet armaments with the long range goal of banning all nuclear weapons. We are committed to peace, but my Administration has also recognized that peace must be more than a slogan. True peace rests on the twin pillars of dialogue and defense—meaningful arms reductions talks and strong deterrent forces.

THE UNFINISHED WORK

Despite all our progress, our work is not finished. We can take freedom's next step if we unite behind four great goals to keep America free, secure, and at peace for the eighties. We must:

1. Ensure steady ECONOMIC GROWTH:

We are committed to our program of tax relief and steady economic growth. Common sense requires that government limit spending, not raise taxes.

2. Develop space, America's NEXT FRONTIER:

I have proposed initiatives to develop U.S. potential in space through the construction of a permanent manned space station, and the promotion of private sector investment in space.

3. Strengthen our TRADITIONAL VALUES:


America is enjoying a renaissance in the traditional values of faith, family, work, and neighborhood. I will support this by continuing to push for a voluntary school prayer amendment, tuition tax credits, and legislative restrictions on abortion.

4. Continue to build a MEANINGFUL PEACE:

We are committed to peaceful relations with the Soviet Union and for reductions in strategic arms. We will also help develop stable democratic institutions around the world knowing that only under democracies are peace and human rights guaranteed.

BACKGROUND AND FAMILY: Born in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, February 12, 1947. Moved to Phoenix, Arizona in 1976 and then Tualatin, Oregon in 1979. Wife Nancy and four children, Sammi, Ray, Sauny, and Roby. Active in church and community, and member of Monmouth-Independence Lions Club.

Like President Reagan and many other Republicans, I believe America has steered from sound constitutional principles. The conflict between the free agency of the individual citizen versus the "State" is stronger than ever before in our life times. There are three basic principles that we need to return to: 1. limited government, 2. separation of powers, and 3. equal protection under the law.

The basic struggle in government today is between concentration of power and separation of power. We have gone from independence and self-governing, to dependence and big brother government. Our Founding Father's plan of "informing the people so they can best solve the problem" has deteriorated to an attitude that our problems are "too complex" for the people, therefore only a select few can find the solutions.

To work at keeping state issues at a state level, and federal issues at the federal level. For instance, taxes should basically be collected by the states, not the federal government. It is not a Senator's job to take money from other states to fund federal programs.

The banner I wave is GOD, COUNTRY, FAMILY AND THE U.S. CONSTITUTION; for without the first you lose the others. I feel it's time to get back to basics in government and education. Back to the separation of power as outlined by our Founding Fathers.

BACK TO THE CONSTITUTION!

"We the people are the rightful masters of both Congress and the Courts-not to overthrow the Constitution, but to overthrow the men who would pervert the Constitution."—Abraham Lincoln.

FEDERAL RESERVE SYSTEM—an unconstitutional monopoly of our money system by private enterprise. The control of our currency belongs to Congress. If we regain control of the Federal Reserve System, the 100 billion dollars a year we pay in interest could be used to reduce our taxes and our national debt.

THE DECLARATION OF INTER-DEPENDENCE-The opposite of the Declaration of Independence in protecting our basic rights and freedoms. Endorsed by the incumbent, this document will concentrate all power to a centralized government. Property rights are totally destroyed along with National Sovereignty. The State determines your

NUCLEAR FREEZE—The issue here is not the guns, but who is running the guns. If we would simply stop the flow of technical knowledge to the Soviet block countries, there would be no arms race. The Soviet system cannot compete with American free enterprise system.





- RESTORING SIMPLICITY AND EQUITY to our loop-hole ladened IRS taxing system through adoption of a "Flat Rate Tax." The Treasury Department estimates that an 11.3% income tax, applied equally across the board, would generate the same revenue that government now receives. The present district-wide average is 16%.
- STABILIZING THE SOCIAL SECURITY SYSTEM by requiring a portion of current FICA withholdings for workers under 40 to be placed into Individual Retirement Accounts. While these younger workers are starting to build their personal retirement funds in the PRIVATE SECTOR—and thereby reducing their future dependence upon government—they are still providing a necessary contribution to the present Social Security Fund and the recipients who depend upon it.





- An executive Council on International Trade would plan to strengthen all our port facilities. Oregon's international sales can grow a billion dollars in the next 10 years if we work at selling abroad.
- More Oregon trust monies—more than 20%—should be invested intrastate. One job created within the state yields a minimum tax return to governments of \$2,000—which means other taxpayers don't have to pay that \$2,000.

David Chen says:

"The State Treasurer's job should no longer be used as a political stepping stone, nor as a simple bookkeeper of the state's revenues. This office should assist the Governor in the economic revitalization of Oregon. A major part of that work should be international trade, and as someone conversant with Asian languages and customs, I can serve Oregon well in dialogues with Pacific Rim trading nations."

With additional tools, which the legislature can provide, he will accelerate his program to move against large-scale hijacking, cocaine processing and peddling, marijuana growing and processing, and untaxed gambling which is costing Oregon millions of unreported tax dollars.

HE WORKS TO ATTRACT NEW INDUSTRY AND JOBS

As one of the state's top officials Dave Frohnmayer recognizes the need for new business and more jobs in Oregon. And he has done something about it. He has personally contacted important firms interested in settling and investing in Oregon.

To further aid in this endeavor he has instructed the staff of the Justice Department to rapidly provide all departments of state with advice on how to best avoid legal tangles and red tape which would discourage investment in Oregon.

Attorneys, by nature, practice the feudal doctrine of attornment which means that the wealthy are kept wealthy and the poor are kept poor.

This further translates into the concept that the Capital Industry will be promoted, the Goods Industry will be tolerated and regulated, and the Labor Industry will be demoted, demeaned, and exploited.

A professional attorney, as an Attorney General sees the foregoing as an unwritten obligation of his term in office and reelection, by virtue of his education in today's law schools.

On the other hand, today's lawyer must come from the ranks of the common citizens, and be professionally obligated to maintain the equal protection of the law for the rich and poor alike.

• The Attorney General, as shop foreman of the Justice Department, has an authorization for 114 attorneys and 19 investigators.

If his motives be wrong, with such a staff at his command, he has the power to promote the will of the State, the language of attorneyism, the isolation and subjugation of the common citizen, and the destruction of FREE ENTERPRISE.

• The Oregon Constitution (Article IV, Section 21) requires that every act or law be plainly worded. This means that laws are supposed to be written in the language of the people instead of the legalese of professional attorneys.

Considering the source of most of our laws, it is not difficult to understand why the laws are difficult to understand.

The Attorney General, as shop foreman of the Justice Department, if he is a professional attorney, has the unpleasant task of bruising his peers by cleaning up their language.

If he is a professional attorney, the fraternal pressures of his job perpetuate the obscurity of the law.

As long as the laws remain obscure, the common citizen will be easily conned by them and suffer.

• The perpetuation of evil and its injustice in our society goes by the formula: ELECT, PROTECT, and RE-ELECT. Which means "get them into office, protect their corrupt activities while in office, and keep them in office." This trend must be changed.

Today's courts bear the sign in their halls "no soliciting." Yet every judge, it seems, solicits for the attorneys and discourages the free exercise of conscience by denying the citizens the counsel of their choice and the right to record the words, intonations, and gestures of their own court case.

- Today the average citizen feeds the bureaucratic machine, stoking it with his life, liberty, and property; energies, substance, and whole being, as law after law is devised by the State Legislature to be imposed and prosecuted by an impassionate Justice Department.
- The Military, Justice, Educational, and Taxing Systems are too important and too sensitive to be monopolized by professionals, and special interest groups who do not have the citizen's viewpoint.

After all, in a Republic, by definition, these systems are to be representative of the people.

These systems must be kept in strict subordination to the citizen-civil power through the citizen's representation.

• Our original system of law was designed to form a more perfect union, establish justice, insure domestic tranquility, provide for the common defense, promote the general welfare and to secure the blessings of liberty to ourselves and our children. In other words—Happiness. Are you happy? Are the people in office presently doing their job? You be the judge of it! And while you are thinking about it, remember that the job of Attorney General is to see to it that the Courts don't tread upon your Happiness when you are trying to be a good citizen, live and let live.

Now, you can see why it is important for attorneys throughout the State of Oregon to be subject to citizen review and discipline.

• It is high time that a panel of Oregon citizens, using common sense and common language, did a thorough weeding job in the Oregon statute patch, and direct their conclusions to an interested legislature, justice department, and executive governor.

It is important that you have an Attorney General who will listen to what the people say and implement it.

• Today's office of Attorney General must be held by a citizen to transform the purpose of that office to that of Lawyer-General.







Justice Linde is a recognized leader in enforcing Oregon's constitution and laws. His firm, impartial devotion to the rule of law is widely respected. The Supreme Court is the highest court in Oregon. Its decisions are made collectively, not by individual judges. A CRITICALLY IMPORTANT JUDICIAL RACE FOR OREGONIANS: The Supreme Court is responsible for seeing courts run efficiently, that people are treated fairly and victims of criminal and civil wrongs receive justice. Oregonians have a right to expect hard work and common sense from their Supreme Court Judges.

DAVID NISSMAN WORKS HARD TO PROTECT YOUR RIGHTS: A vote for David Nissman is a vote for hard work and expert legal knowledge. He stands behind his record of prosecuting major crimes and protecting the rights of crime victims. Nissman is a trial lawyer with past experience in the business community. As a prosecutor, David Nissman has never represented special interest groups and owes no political debts.

An adjunct professor at the University of Oregon, David Nissman has personally trained many of this state's trial lawyers. He has written two critically acclaimed legal books and is a nationally respected expert who has advocated reform of our over-used insanity defense laws. Nissman has accomplished in a short period of time, more than most lawyers and judges have in a lifetime. He will bring vigor, hard work, and dedication to the state's most important court.

THE INCUMBENT IS OUT OF TOUCH WITH OREGONIANS: The incumbent has been a major disappointment to Oregonians. All too often his major concern has been for the criminal, not the crime victim. He has voted for decisions striking mandatory minimum sentences for murderers, restricting crime victims' restitution rights, limiting sentences for rapists and creating new rights for drunk drivers. He wrote a decision throwing out an Oregon law that made obscene phone calls a crime, arguing it violated the defendant's freedom of speech.

In another case, police had fully informed a dismemberment murderer of his rights to remain silent, and to a lawyer at public expense. The murderer told police that he did not want a lawyer, and freely confessed to the crime. The incumbent wrote a decision throwing out the confession because, unbeknownst to the murderer, his accomplice had hired an attorney for him.

The incumbent has taken a consistent stand against justifying searches by legitimate concerns for officer safety. The results have been that important evidence gets excluded because of technical rules. He has voted to strike down the death penalty, adopted overwhelmingly by Oregon voters, and has interfered with our constitutional right to initiate legislation by popular vote.

Nissman's opponent has used his judicial office to write personal political beliefs into law and has refused to discuss this issue with the Oregon voters.

OREGONIANS DESERVE A FULL-TIME JUDGE: Justice delayed is justice denied. American Bar Association Standards call for opinions to be published no later than 90 days after oral arguments. Litigants often wait eight to eleven months for the incumbent's opinions. He rarely missed an opportunity to reverse administrative board decisions. The result: litigants wait a year for Linde's decision and are told to start all over again, driving the court costs sky high.

The incumbent chose a period when the Court was short-handed to take a winter leave to teach in a sun belt school, saying he needed time to "think systematically." The SALEM Statesman-Journal observed "In our judgment, Linde owes it to the state to defer his teaching leave." (November 18, 1982) He was gone for four months.

On other occasions, brother judges have written separate opinions taking the incumbent to task for delayed decisions. In one case, a judge was moved to exclaim "this is no way to run a railroad." More and more Oregonians agree.

In addition to his writing and teaching, Nissman has tried hundreds of cases. His expertise in the area of criminal law will improve the composition of our Supreme Court. Nissman is the only candidate, judges, lawyers and police agencies call upon to bring them up to date on criminal procedure issues. He has lectured for the Oregon Law Institute, the District Court Judges Association, and the Board on Police Standards and Training. Dave lives in Eugene with his wife, Susan.



ABSENTEE BALLOT

IN STATE ABSENT VOTER

You may apply for an absentee ballot with your county clerk if:

- 1. You are a registered voter, and
- 2. You have reason to believe you will be unable, for any reason, to vote at the polling place on election day.

Your application must be in writing and must include:

- 1. Your signature. (This is imperative, for comparison purposes.)
- 2. A statement as to why you will be unable to vote in person.
- 3. Your residence address.
- 4. The address to which the ballot should be mailed, if different from your residence.

YOUR APPLICATION MUST BE RECEIVED BY YOUR COUNTY CLERK NOT LATER THAN 8 P.M. THE DAY OF THE ELECTION.

If an elector is physically handicapped, the application is valid for every election held during the calendar year for which the application is received.

The first day county clerks could accept an absentee ballot application for the May 15th primary election was March 16, 1984. Absentee ballots are delivered as soon as signatures are verified and the ballots are printed. Your ballot may be returned to the office of your county clerk by any appropriate means, but, if application is made by mail, be sure to allow enough time to receive the ballot and return it to your county clerk by 8 p.m. on the day of the election.

LONG TERM ABSENT VOTER

You may apply for long term absent voter status with your county clerk or the Secretary of State if:

- 1. You ar a resident of this state absent from your place of residence, or
- 2. You are serving in the Armed Forces or Merchant Marine of the United States, or
- 3. You are temporarily living outside the territorial limits of the U.S. and the District of Columbia, or
- 4. You are a spouse or dependent of a long term absent voter. A spouse or dependent of a long term absent voter, not previously a resident of this state who intends to reside in this state, is considered a resident for voting purposes and may vote in the same manner as a long term absent voter.

Your application must be in writing and must include:

- 1. Your name and current mailing address.
- 2. A statement that you are a citizen of the U.S.
- 3. A statement that you will be 18 or older on the day of the election.
- 4. A statement that your home residence has been in this state for more than 20 days preceding the election, and giving the address of your last home residence.
- 5. A statement of the facts that qualify you as a long term absent voter.
- A statement that you are not requesting a ballot from any other state and are not voting in any other manner than by absentee ballot.
- A designation of your political affiliation if you wish to vote in a primary election.

The U.S. Department of Defense provides Standard Form 76 that complies with these requirements. It is recommended that long term absent voters use this form—available at embassies and military installations—whenever possible.

Your long term absentee ballot application will be valid for all elections held within the calendar year for which it is received.

Special absentee voting instructions and a ballot return envelope will accompany each absentee ballot.

REMEMBER, YOUR ABSENTEE BALLOT MUST BE RECEIVED BY YOUR COUNTY CLERK NO LATER THAN 8 P.M. THE DAY OF THE ELECTION.
