




PREFACE.


In presenting this, the first edition of a Brookline Blue Book, the publishers have es= sayed to make it as perfect as posssible, so that it would be a valuable book of reference.





No poison bubbles on the brink. Its foam brings no sadness ormurder, no blood-stains in its limpid glass. Beautiful, pure, blessed, and glorious ! Give me forever the sparkling pure cold water."
