In compliance with Par. 2, Letter, Headquarters Eighth Army, AGMGEM 333, subject: "Inspection of Former Japanese Army Air Depot at Kagamigahara, Gifu-ken," dated 1 December 1948, report of investigation conducted by this headquarters is forwarded herewith.

1. Status of installation and equipment prior to the occupation is reported to have been as follows:

a. Before and during the war the Kagamigahara Army Air Arsenal, composed of 347 buildings, functioned as a supply depot for aircraft parts, as a repair installation for damaged aircraft and as an assembly point for aircraft parts manufactured in small factories and shops in the region. All reports agree that, during the war, approximately 550 machine tools and equipment of various types were located and used in the arsenal.

b. During the early part of 1945 orders were given by the Air Ministry to Sadao Yuhi, then brigadier general in command of the arsenal, to disperse all movable machine tools and other equipment located in the installation in order to avoid damage by allied air attack. Dispersal was accomplished during April and May 1945 to locations as listed in Inclosure 1. All of these locations in Gifu Prefecture have been inspected by this headquarters and found presently to contain none of the dispersed items with one exception: one grinding machine, in excellent condition, is located at the Maehato-cho, Tajimi City location.

2. Subsequent disposition of the machinery and equipment is summarized as follows:

Particulars of the above summary are as follows:

a. Pursuant to orders received on or about 16 August 1945 by Yuhi from the Air Ministry, approximately 139 machines were sold to the Koshinkai (an association of Japanese army air officers, formed shortly before the termination of the war) on or about 24 August 1945. The Koshinkai disposed of these items as follows:

- (1) During August 1945, 132 items (then located at Takiro, Kosohara-cho, Toki Gun, Gifu Ken) were sold to Kyuichi Miyata, president of Marumiya K.K. in Gifu and Marumiya Bussan in Tokyo, for ¥300,000.
 - (a) Miyata presently has 61 of these machines in his various factories. Physical inspection by this headquarters has verified their locations. List of these machines and their present locations is attached as Inclosure 2.
 - (b) Miyata has, between August 1945 and the present, resold 71 of the items he purchased from the Koshinkai. List of these items and their present locations is attached as Inclosure 3.
- (2) During the latter part of 1945, the Koshinkai sold seven items to the Kagamigahara Agricultural Association. Inspection by this headquarters has verified their location. List of these items is attached as Inclosure 4.

b. Approximately 297 items were removed from the original dispersal locations between July and December 1945 on orders of the Gifu Branch, Nagoya Office, Ministry of Finance, and dispersed to 93 different locations, 85 of which are in Gifu Prefecture. Operators of the enterprises in which these items are presently located pay rental for their use to the Nagoya Office, Ministry of Finance, at rates averaging between ¥1,000 and ¥2,500 per year. This headquarters has contracted 52 of the above locations and verified the existence of 185 items.

Total list of the items rented by the finance office and their reported present locations is attached as Inclosure 5.

c. This headquarters has requested the Fukui Military Government Team to attempt to determine the present location and status of the approximately 60 items reported to have been dispersed to that prefecture. They are believed originally to have been sent to a silk factory (name unknown) at Sabai-cho, Fukui Prefecture.

d. Approximately 50 items are presently located in the bombed and burned areas of the former Kagamigahara Army Air Arsenal. Most of these have suffered extensive damage thru bombing and deterioration. List is attached as Inclosure 6.

3. Investigation conducted by this headquarters to date, therefore, has established the current locations and status of approximately 546 items. Personnel of this headquarters have inspected 378 of these items and found about 70 percent of them to be in workable condition.

4. The following information regarding an alleged release of a part of the machines in question to the Home Affairs Section, Gifu Prefectural Government, by the 27th Infantry Regiment, is submitted:

a. Yuhi, former brigadier general in command of the arsenal, remained at the arsenal until March 1946. He has stated that approximately 400 out of 500 items of equipment were turned over to the occupation forces in October 1945 by former Japanese army officers under his command, altho he contends he personally had nothing to do with this transaction.

b. Hideo Hibi, who was Chief of the Gifu Branch, Nagoya Office, Ministry of Finance from December 1945 to December 1946, states that the machinery was taken into the custody of the occupation forces at a date unknown to him. Subsequently, also at a date unknown to him, the machinery was released by the occupation forces to the former Home Ministry. During or about July 1946, he states, the items were transferred from the Home Ministry to the Finance Ministry, the Nagoya Office of which subsequently ordered the Gifu Branch to rent the machines. Persons who rented the machines signed contracts in which they agreed to maintain the equipment.

c. The following records are currently in the possession of the Gifu Prefectural Government:

- (1) A Japanese-prepared inventory, dated 20 March 1946, listing 402 machine tools, shown as being at the locations listed in Inclosure 1. This document is signed on a front page by "Bernard Kazon, 2nd Lt, 27th Inf." Witnesses to the signing claim it was

signed as a release. The document is also signed "Received by K. Higaki, Chief, Home Affairs, Gifu Prefecture".

- (2) A typewritten receipt, dated 26 March 1946, bearing the heading "27th Infantry Regiment, Japanese Materials Section", and acknowledging receipt by the Home Affairs Chief of the following items. It is claimed that this is a copy of a receipt prepared by the 27th Infantry Regiment, the original of which was returned to their files.

d. The records of this headquarters contain no reference to such a transaction; nor do those of the 24th Infantry Regiment, presently occupying the site; nor was any information of this nature transferred to the 24th Infantry Regiment by the 27th Infantry Regiment, which previously occupied the site.

5. The following additional information is submitted:

a. With reference to Par. 2a above, it is understood that one function of the Koshinkai was to attempt to secure positions with local businesses for both military and civilian personnel formerly located at the arsenal. In reporting the transaction described in Par. 2a(1), Miyata states he was approached by the Koshinkai for this purpose, but refused to hire any of the former arsenal personnel. Later, a Kichio Nagoe, who had been a civilian engineer employed at the arsenal and was subsequently employed by Miyata, offered to act as agent in the purchase of some machines from the Koshinkai on the condition that Miyata would hire some of the arsenal personnel, including ex-general Yuhi. Miyata agreed to this arrangement and, after purchasing the machines, hired about 50 former employees of the arsenal, including Yuhi and four other army officers.

b. With reference to the oil storage facilities reported in Par. 4 of Inspection Report by a representative of the Reparations Section, GHQ, SCAP, nine of these tanks were placed under reparations custody 4 December 1948 in compliance with letter, File AG004-BA, subject: "Army and Navy Oil Storage Facilities", Headquarters I Corps, dated 26 November 1948. The remaining two tanks, being of smaller volume, were not included in reference letter.

c. With reference to Par. 6c of above report, the utilities shop, 24th Infantry Regiment, is currently using 17 wood-working and related machines which were allocated to them during the summer of 1948 by the Commanding General, Eighth Army. Reparatons code numbers, none of which are in the Gifu series, appear on 14 of these machines. List of all these machines is attached as Inclosure 7.

d. With reference to Par. 8 of above report, it is recommended that the Commanding Officer, 24th Infantry Regiment, be directed to return reparations items in storage at Camp Gifu to the appropriate reparations plants if their use by the occupation forces is not required.

e. With reference to Par. 13d of above report, the 15 gasoline tanks are presently rented to the concerns listed in the report by the Nagoya Office, Ministry of Finance, and are in use. They were a part of the property of the Kagamigahara Army Air Arsenal.

6. The majority of Japanese interviewed in gathering the above information have stated that they have been questioned by occupation force personnel concerning this matter several times in the past. The records of this headquarters contain no reference to such investigation or results thereof.

7. During the course of this study, signed statements have been taken by this headquarters from various Japanese interviewed and attest to most of the information contained herein. These are retained in the files of this headquarters for possible future reference. Insofar as time and available information have permitted, the information contained herein has been verified by physical inspection by personnel of this headquarters.

8. Conclusions:

a. That the Kagamigahara Army Air Arsenal meets the criteria for a primary war industry as defined in Operational Directive 21, Headquarters Eighth Army, dated 30 March 1948.

b. That preliminary investigation indicates that all or a part of the machinery and equipment of said arsenal were disposed of by officials of the Japanese government and ex-officers of the Japanese army in contravention of SCAPIN 1, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, dated 2 September 1945.

c. That incomplete evidence available at this headquarters indicates a possibility that a part of the machinery and equipment of said arsenal may have been released to the Japanese Government by the 27th Infantry Regiment, or by 2nd Lt. BERNARD KAZON, acting as an agent for the 27th Infantry Regiment. No basis for such release is known to exist.

d. That the following persons are suspect of illegal acts in connection with the disposition of the arsenal property:

- (1) Kyuichi Miyata, who purchased at least 132 items of arsenal property, rented 22 additional items (whereas most concerns were allowed to rent only a few items), and hired approximately 50 former arsenal employees, including the former commanding officer and Kichio Nagoe, a former engineer at the arsenal.
- (2) Sadao Yuki, commanding officer of the arsenal at the time of the dispersals.
- (3) Hideo Hibi, Chief of the Gifu Branch, Nagoya Office, Ministry of Finance, as the time of the dispersals.
- (4) Numerous other officials of various agencies of the Japanese Government at the time of the dispersals.

9. Recommendations:

a. That it be determined whether any records of the occupation forces indicate that any of the machinery and equipment of the Kagamigahara Army Air Arsenal was seized by the occupying unit and subsequently released to the Japanese Government by the 27th Infantry Regiment, and, if so, whether such release was in accord with directives existing at that time.

b. Subject to the findings resulting from Par. 9a, that all machinery and equipment known or to be known as property of the Kagamigahara Army Air Arsenal be placed under reparations custody and control and concentrated in several of the buildings at the site of the arsenal. Vacant buildings which, with minor repairs, would be suitable for this purpose are presently standing within the area occupied by the 24th Infantry Regiment.

c. That a competent investigative agency be directed to make a thorough examination of the facts reported preliminarily herein to determine whether violations of occupation force directives or Japanese Government laws and regulations have been committed and, if so, to gather evidence for the prosecution of the persons responsible.

1. References:

a. Letter, File AG 004-BA, Subject: "Army and Navy Oil Storage Facilities", Headquarters I Corps, dated 26 November 1948, copy of which is attached as Inclosure 1.

b. Par. 2k, Operational Directive 21, Headquarters Eighth Army, dated 30 March 1948, which reads as follows:

"k. Occupation Force units occupying facilities listed for reparations will be responsible for the security of equipment and facilities within the area occupied. Military government units responsible for custody and control will inform the occupying unit of the requirements placed upon the Japanese Government for maintenance, inventory, packaging and such other matters as may be directed. The occupying unit will render assistance to military government units when necessary to insure the compliance by the Japanese Government with current directives."

2. Confirming telephone conversation with the Provost Marshal, 24th Infantry Regiment, 7 December 1948, this headquarters will observe the following procedure:

a. It is anticipated that workmen will be engaged in bringing subject facilities up to acceptable standards of maintenance for approximately one month. Such persons will be provided reparations passes, as shown in Inclosure 2, by this headquarters.

b. Subsequent to initial work, it will be necessary for Japanese government inspectors and maintenance personnel to make periodic visits to the facilities for purposes of maintaining acceptable standards of maintenance. Such persons will be provided reparations passes by this headquarters.

c. No guards will be assigned to these facilities by the Japanese government.

3. This headquarters will make frequent inspections of the facilities to insure adequate maintenance by the Japanese government.

A study of the subject facility will be made to determine the circumstances pertaining to its status since the occupation, and if it qualifies for reparations listing under the criteria defined in Operational Directive 21, this headquarters, 30 March 1948. Upon completion of the study, a report of findings and recommendations will be submitted to this headquarters.

MEMORANDUM FOR: Chief, Reparations Section

SUBJECT: Inspection of Oil Storage Facilities at Site of Former Japanese Army Air Depot and Aircraft Assembly Plant at Kagamigahara, Gifu-ken (now site of Camp Gifu, 24th Inf Regt) on 14 Oct 48

1. This inspection and investigation was conducted in accordance with instructions by telephone from Maj Tillman, Reparations Sec, GHQ, received at Gifu, 13 Oct 48.

2. On Thursday morning, 14 Oct 48, undersigned proceeded to Camp Gifu (site of former Japanese Army Air Depot) at Kagamigahara, accompanied by Mr. S. Yakata, Interpreter, GMMT; Mr. S. Takewaka, Reparations Representative, Gifu Prefectural Govt; and Mr. S. Kaishikawa, Gifu Branch of Nagoya office, Japanese Ministry of Finance. At Camp Gifu, undersigned contacted Capt Wm R. Hambrick, S-2, and Maj J.H.P. Porter, R & U Officer, both of 24th Infantry Regiment at this station. Undersigned then personally inspected the oil storage tank location, and other facilities of Japanese origin at this location; also discussed these matters with Capt Hambrick and Maj Porter, with observations as indicated below.

3. Insofar as could be determined from local Military Government Team and other sources of information indicated herein, neither a reparations code number has ever been assigned for this former Japanese Army installation, which included an extensive aircraft finishing and assembly factory, nor has any reparations inventory been prepared; nor equipment marked with code identification numbers.

4. Oil tank installation consists of two groups of tanks in adjacent location (see Incl 2); tanks are welded steel, including sealed cover, in excellent condition; installed on reinforced concrete elevated platforms, complete with piping, valves, etc. Pumps, motors and electrical control equipment have been removed from this installation. Estimated capacity of these tanks as follows: One group of six tanks, each 25,000 gallons; one group of five tanks, each 10,000 gallons.

5. In addition to above tank installation, there were also some steel storage tanks not installed, but remaining in this area at end of war. Some of these tanks still remain, but were observed to be very rusty and dilapidated; others have been dismantled as scrap steel.

6. The following items of original Japanese Army equipment in this area were noted, none of which have been inventoried or marked as reparations property.

- a. Steam boiler plant, complete.
- b. One 400 KVA diesel powered motor generator unit, in excellent operating condition.
- c. Miscellaneous woodworking machines now being used by 24th Inf Regt utilities shop.
- d. Miscellaneous other semi-permanently installed factory equipment.

7. Also noted several items of machine tool equipment, without identification markings; stated to be property of Japanese contractors working in the area.

8. Noted in storage warehouse: A large quantity of electric utilities equipment of large capacity (transformers, substation condensers, switch gear, etc); many of which were marked with reparations code identification markings of other plants, such as:

- #01-59(a) - 96 : 200 KVA electric transformer.
- #01-58 - 1861 : electric substation condenser.

and many others. It was stated by Maj Porter that all of these items were now in process of being released to Japanese Government (Special Procurement Board) as indigenous locally procured property and supplies.

9. Maj Porter and Capt Hambrick, 24th Inf Regt, both stated that, to the best of their knowledge and belief, no instructions have ever been received regarding placing of equipment of this former Japanese Army installation in reparations custody, or preparation of reparations custody inventory. This site was formerly occupied by 27th Infantry Regiment, and no information of such matters was transferred to present occupying troop unit.

10. It appears quite evident that almost the entire removable machine equipment of this Japanese Army aircraft factory installation has been removed from this area by persons unknown, and never recorded as reparations custody equipment; that such removal was in all probability in direct violation of SCAP instructions and directives regarding safeguarding and preservation of such equipment at the time of the occupation.

11. There has been local rumor that much former military factory equipment was removed from this installation at about the beginning of the occupation through collusion between certain former Japanese Army officers and certain Japanese Government officials; that such transactions resulted in immense personal gain to individuals. The following names have been mentioned as being involved in, or having knowledge of, such dealings. All of these persons are stated to be now residing in, or engaged in business in, the City of Gifu. (See also report of inspection of Plant Code #09-15 on 13 Oct 48):

a. Mr. Yuhi, former Brigadier General, Japanese Army, stationed at Kagamigahara Air Field; now operating a construction company under name of Marumiya Kabushiki Kaisha, with headquarters in Gifu City.

b. Mr. Mitsuo Fujiyoshi, former head of military equipment dispersing section (Kun-ju-shori-bu-cho) of Gifu Prefectural Government.

c. Mr. Mitsugu Kondo, head of Inaba District Office (Inaba-gun-jimusho-cho), Gifu Prefectural Government.

d. Mr. Amemiya, believed to have been formerly connected with Kagamigahara Air Field in civilian capacity, and now connected with a construction company in Gifu City (believed to be in same company with Mr. Yuhi, former Brigadier General, Japanese Army).

e. Mr. Ogawa, present chief of Gifu Prefectural Liaison office. (Stated to be a close personal friend of Mr. Yuhi; suspected of collusion in this matter).

12. Mr. S. Yoneyama, Chief of the Gifu Branch, Nagoya Office, Japanese Ministry of Finance, was contacted in his office in Gifu City, at about noon, 14 Oct 48, and requested to furnish information as follows:

a. Statement of custodial responsibility of area, buildings and grounds, equipment of Kagamigahara Japanese Army (Air Corps) installation, at time of end of war and thereafter.

b. Information regarding oil and gas tank installations at this site, to include descriptive data, location, statement of custodial responsibility.

c. Statement as to disposition of former factory tools and equipment pertaining to Japanese Army aircraft assembly factory at this location.

13. Mr. Yoneyama, Gifu Branch, Ministry of Finance, accompanied by Mr. K. Ichikawa (Asst Chief) and others of his office, called on undersigned at offices of Gifu MG Team, at 0800 Friday, 15 Oct 48, and presented typewritten report inclosed herewith (Incl 1). These papers include a list of 91 locations where machine tools and equipment from subject arsenal site are reported to be presently located, together with statement as to date various items were moved to present location, and reference indicating place from which such items were removed on dates listed. Upon further questioning, Mr. Yoneyama stated as follows:

a. Subject plant was considered to be in custody of an organization known as "Kugun-Zan-Museirin-Kai," an organization Japanese Army officers operating under direction of Japanese Army Control, from the end of the war (15 Aug 45) until 25 Oct 45.

b. Subject plant was placed under custodial jurisdiction of Japanese Ministry of Finance on 26 Oct 45, and has remained under such custody since that time. The information as to present location of equipment as shown on attached sheets, is information copied from files of Gifu Branch, Nagoya Office, Ministry of Finance.

c. Equipment in question was removed from this arsenal location to locations as shown below, by persons unknown, prior to time of Ministry of Finance custody (presumably during period 15 Aug - 25 Oct 45). The reference numbers shown thus () correspond to those shown on attached sheets to indicate origin of movement to present location:

- (1) Maihata Cho, Tagimi Shi, Gifu Ken
- (2) Kakamiyama Sohara Cho, Inaba Gun, Gifu Ken
- (3) Kobi Cho, Kamo Gun, Gifu Ken
- (4) Kagashima Mura, Inaba Gun, Gifu Ken
- (5) Enjoji Shimohaguri Mura, Hashima Gun, Gifu Ken
- (6) Takehara Cho, Hashima Gun, Gifu Ken

d. Information by Mr. Yoneyama indicates that in addition to the gasoline tanks referred to under Par 4 and 5, above, there were 16 additional horizontal type steel gasoline tanks formerly at this site, approximately 14 ft in diameter and 25 ft long: one has been scrapped, and balance removed to following locations, on or about 2 Jul 47:

- (1) Nagoya Gasoline Transportation Co (Kitakura Cho, Minato Ku, Nagoya Shi) - 2 tanks
- (2) Higashi Gumi KK (Masago Cho, Minato Ku, Nagoya Shi) - 8 tanks

(3) Dai Nippon Wood Preserving Co (Chitose
Minato Ku, Nagoya Shi) - 5 tanks

14. Recommend this matter be referred to appropriate investigating agency, with view toward prosecution of responsible individuals, if substantiated.


