1. Reference is made to letter, AIDLH-T from Chief, Counter Intelligence Corps, 28 June 1949, Subject: "Counter Intelligence Corps Investigator Field Manual (Tentative)", which requests comment and recommendations relative to the proposed manual.

2. All CIC District Commanders of the 441st Counter Intelligence Corps Detachment have studied the manual and their comments and recommendations were submitted for consideration. A consolidation of the reports received by the Commanding Officer, 441st CIC Detachment follows:

a. Scope of the proposed manual, overall, is broad and is believed of value as a course for definitions of terms peculiar to intelligence operations. More information of the investigative work in occupied areas should be included.

b. The manual is adequate in most respects, but a more comprehensive discussion of informants is desired. It was recommended that emphasis be placed on the subjects of payment and/or entertainment of informants, and the transfer of informants to other agents.

c. No inaccuracies of content were noted.

d. The organization is good, but a revision of the contents table, viz, arrangements of outline form so that main topics and sub-topics are placed in proper perspective, is suggested.

e. The manual is very comprehensive and will be a ready reference for the trained agent and a guide for the new agent. Distribution to all agents is desired.

f. Careful editing, to correct numerous misspelled words, is recommended. It is believed, also, that the kind of print, elite, should be changed to pica and that the number of illustrations be increased.

3. The citation of references, executive orders, laws, regulations, etc., at the close of chapters is a highly desirable feature and should be made whenever practicable. This provides an incentive for further study or eliminates undue effort and loss of time if one desires to locate a reference or more information concerning a particular subject.

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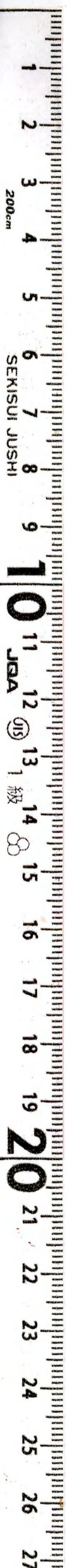

1. Reference is made to letter, AIRM-1 from Chief, Counter Intelligence Corps, 28 June 1949, Subject: "Counter Intelligence Corps Investigator Field Manual (tentative)", which requests comment and recommendations relative to the proposed manual.

2. All GIC District Commanders of the 44th Counter Intelligence Corps Detachment have studied the manual and their comments and recommendations were submitted for consideration. A consolidation of the reports received by the Commanding Officer, 44th GIC Detachment follows:

a. Scope of the proposed manual, overall, is broad and is believed of value as a course for definition of terms peculiar to intelligence operations. More information of the investigative work in occupied areas should be included.

b. The manual is adequate in most respects, but a more comprehensive discussion of information is desired. It was recommended that emphasis be placed on the subject of payment and/or entertainment of informants, and the transfer of informants to other agents.

c. No inaccuracies of content were noted.

d. The organization is good, but a revision of the contents, table, via arrangements of outline form so that main topics and sub-topics are placed in proper perspective, is suggested.

e. The manual is very comprehensive and includes many references for the trained agent and a guide for the new agent to all agents is desired.

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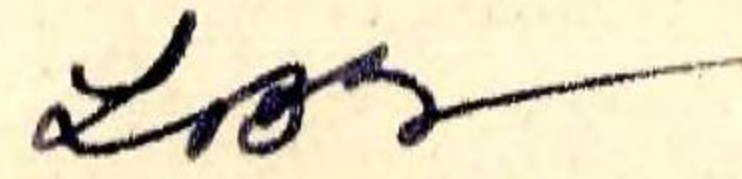
MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD:

- b. More comprehensive discussion of informants including payment, entertainment and transfer of same is discussed. Organization of manual is good and no inaccuracies noted, however rearrangement of Table of Contents suggested.

TO: Chief, Counter Intelligence Corps, Camp Holabird, Maryland

1. Reference DAGS Letter AIDLH-T, Office of the Chief, Counter Intelligence Corps, Camp Holabird, Maryland, subject: "Proposed Field Manual, 'The Counter Intelligence Corps Detachment'", dated 28 June 1949.

2. The following recommendations are submitted by the 441st CIC Detachment:

a. Reference par 23b(1)(e). A system of card file based on case classification instead of a file on informants by name and date of birth.

b. Reference par 26, page 46: Add (j) Conduct lectures as directed by command G-2, for troops and civil employees on appropriate subjects; i.e. Security of Military Information, Enemy Documents, Souvenirs.

c. Reference par 31. When field office jurisdiction is divided into sub-field offices, the recruiting, selecting and retaining of the informants and control of informant network will be performed by the personnel who make the contacts.

d. Reference par 37. Add (13) CIC targets, (14) Black, grey and white lists.

e. Reference par 48. A Counter Intelligence Officer should be made available for inclusion on G-2 staff of an airborne corps or division.

f. Reference par 52. Provision should be made for the expansion of the drop zone or airhead to include airborne CIC in sustained operation when no immediate ground relief can be anticipated.

g. Reference par 57 of the proposed manual and par 5 of the basic communication. During the combat phase, the division and corps liaison personnel will be attached from theater level in order to insure the continuity of CI coverage without disrupting the division or corps teams in the course of advance. The outline of CIC duties and functions

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of the corps or division team in staging areas or reserve positions would allow for little or no reduction in strength prior to commitment; the planning phases alone would require teams with strength as now constituted.

h. The Man Statement form, which is widely used in FEC, should be included.

i. Addition of an alphabetical index is desired.

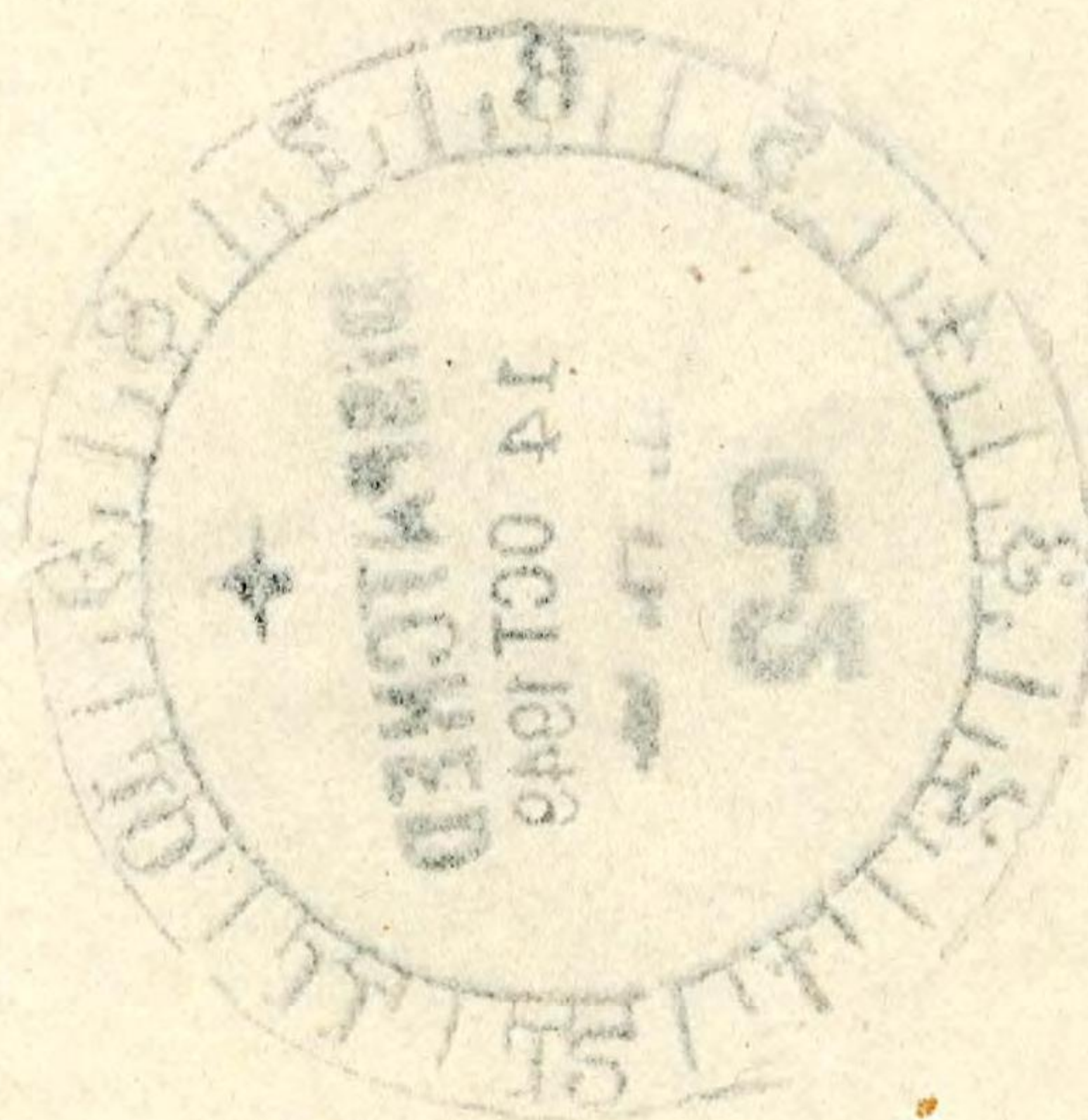

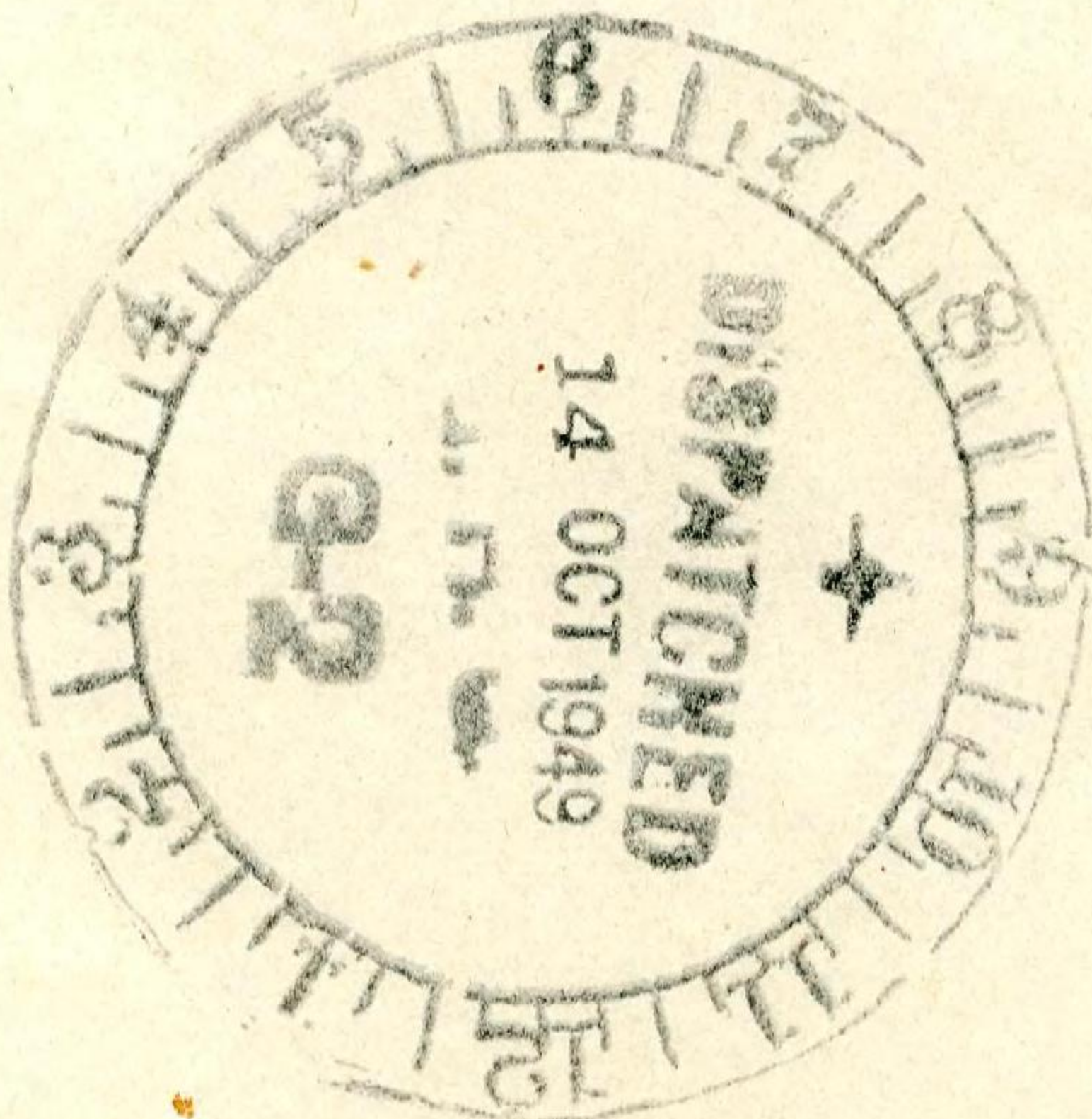

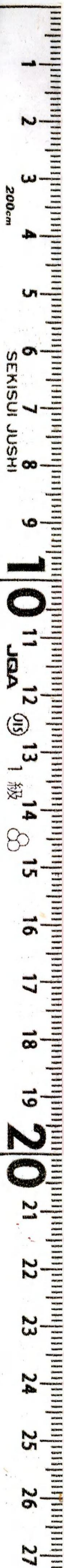

1. The CIC Center has realized for some time the urgent need of G-2's and CIC Detachment Commanders for a manual that would assist them in the organization, administration, and operation of their detachments, particularly one setting forth the employment missions of CIC detachments during combat. Consequently a project of this scope has been initiated and an early draft of the manual has been prepared in mimeograph form.

2. There are inclosed ten (10) copies of this proposed manual which are being submitted in order to achieve two purposes:

a. To elicit the comments and recommendations of all concerned so that this headquarters may expedite the final completion of a manual of this nature.

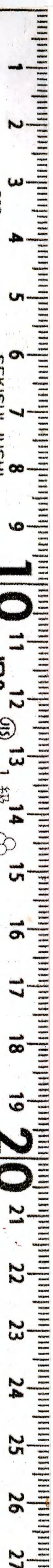
b. To serve as an interim guide to G-2's and CIC Detachment Commanders in preparing training programs for their own detachments.

3. In the preparation of the proposed manual, the basis for the organization and administration of a detachment has been drawn from TM 30-215 and T/O&E 30-500. In those chapters dealing with combat employment, an attempt has been made to collate the experiences of CIC personnel with varied CIC combat commands, formulating them into operational duties and procedures that are flexible in their interpretation so that they can be applied to future planning, training and operations. It is realized, however, that not all facets of the problem have been reached in this initial draft nor that any policy should be considered final so early in its formulation.

4. This headquarters would appreciate a review of this proposed manual and particularly desires constructive comment by G-2 and experienced CIC personnel concerning the scope, adequacy, appropriateness and accuracy of content, organization of material and any other pertinent criticism or suggestion. These comments and/or recommendations are requested on or before 31 October 1949.

However, the manual policy should be formulated early in the formation.

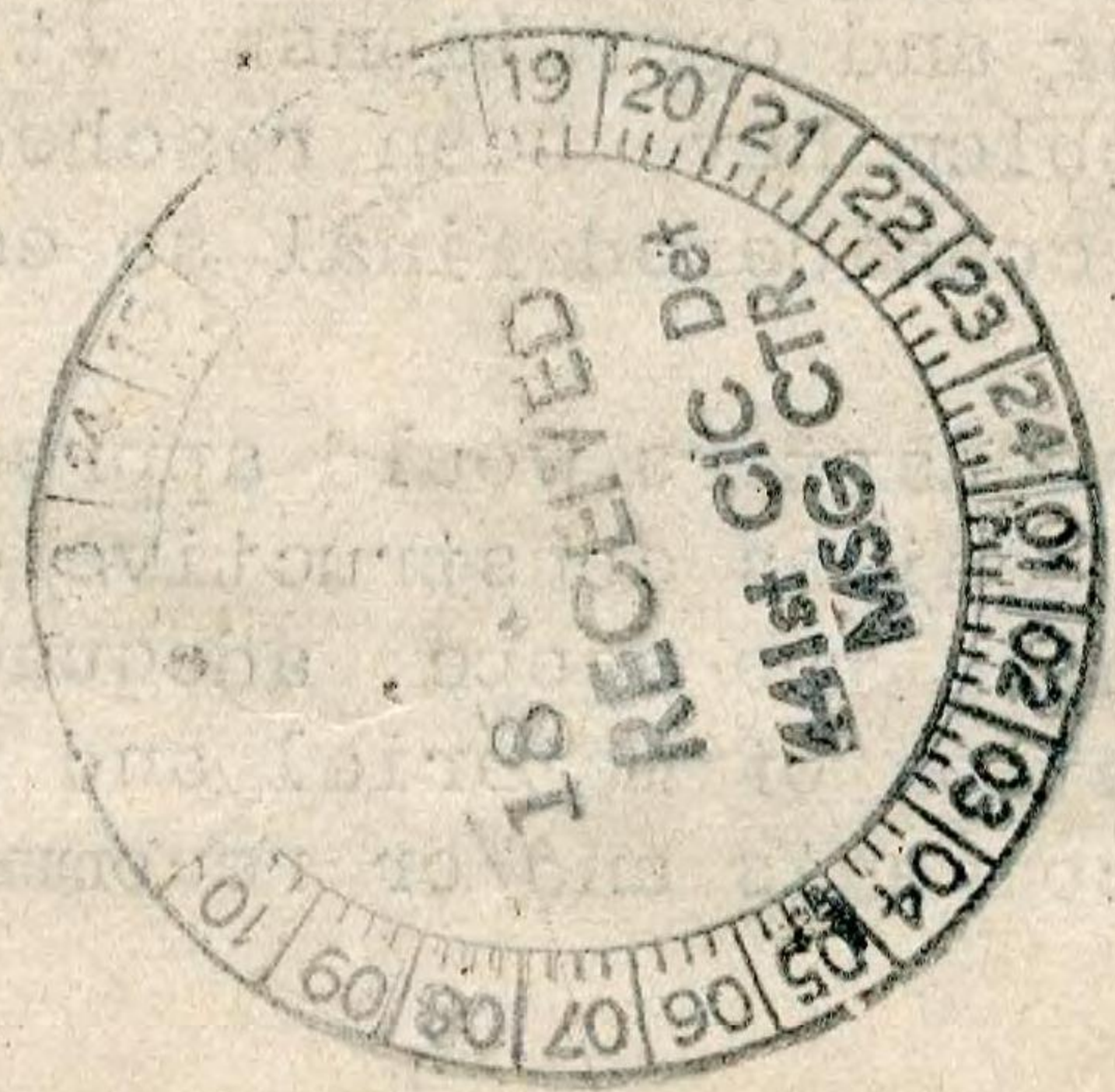
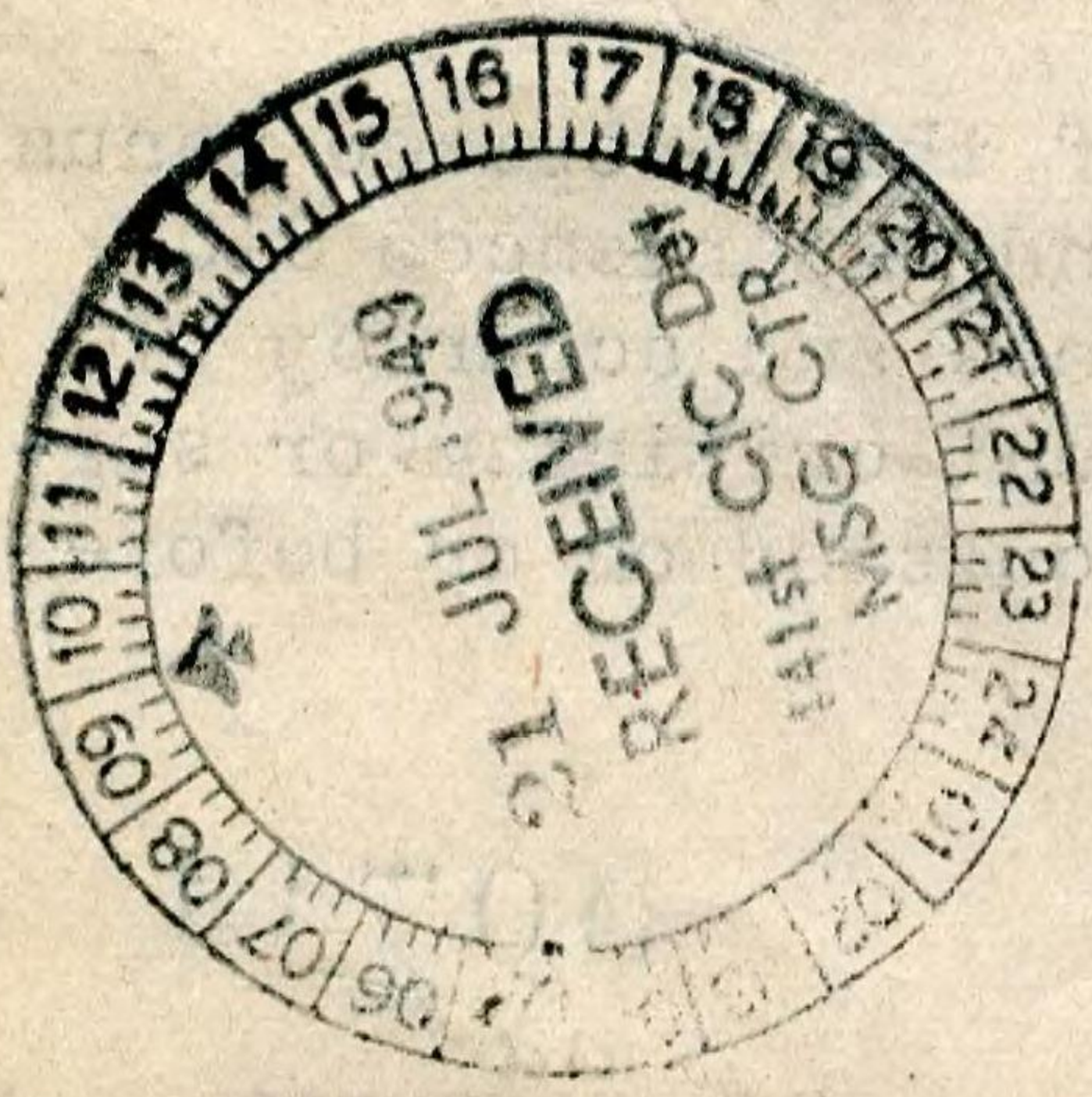

5. a. In line with the final preparation of this manual is the question of an operational employment policy for CIC detachments in combat. At the present time this headquarters is making a study of this problem and the opinions of experienced personnel will be of decided assistance. Briefly, the present combat employment policy (as carried over from World War II) embraces the following procedure: All detachments are assigned to theater headquarters from which in turn they are attached to the various commands operating within the theater. Counterintelligence coverage extends from the division front to the rear of the communication zone. The zone of responsibility is established by the area for which the command is responsible. CIC detachments operate within these zones, maintaining close liaison with detachments whether within the chain of command or laterally. A general modus operandi governs the operation of all detachments but actual operational control is maintained by the commands to which the detachments are attached. In a post-war period all detachments return to the operational control of the theater where they are redeployed to provide best geographic coverage possible. (See TM 30-215 and paragraph 35, Section II, Chapter 4 of the proposed manual, The CIC Detachment).

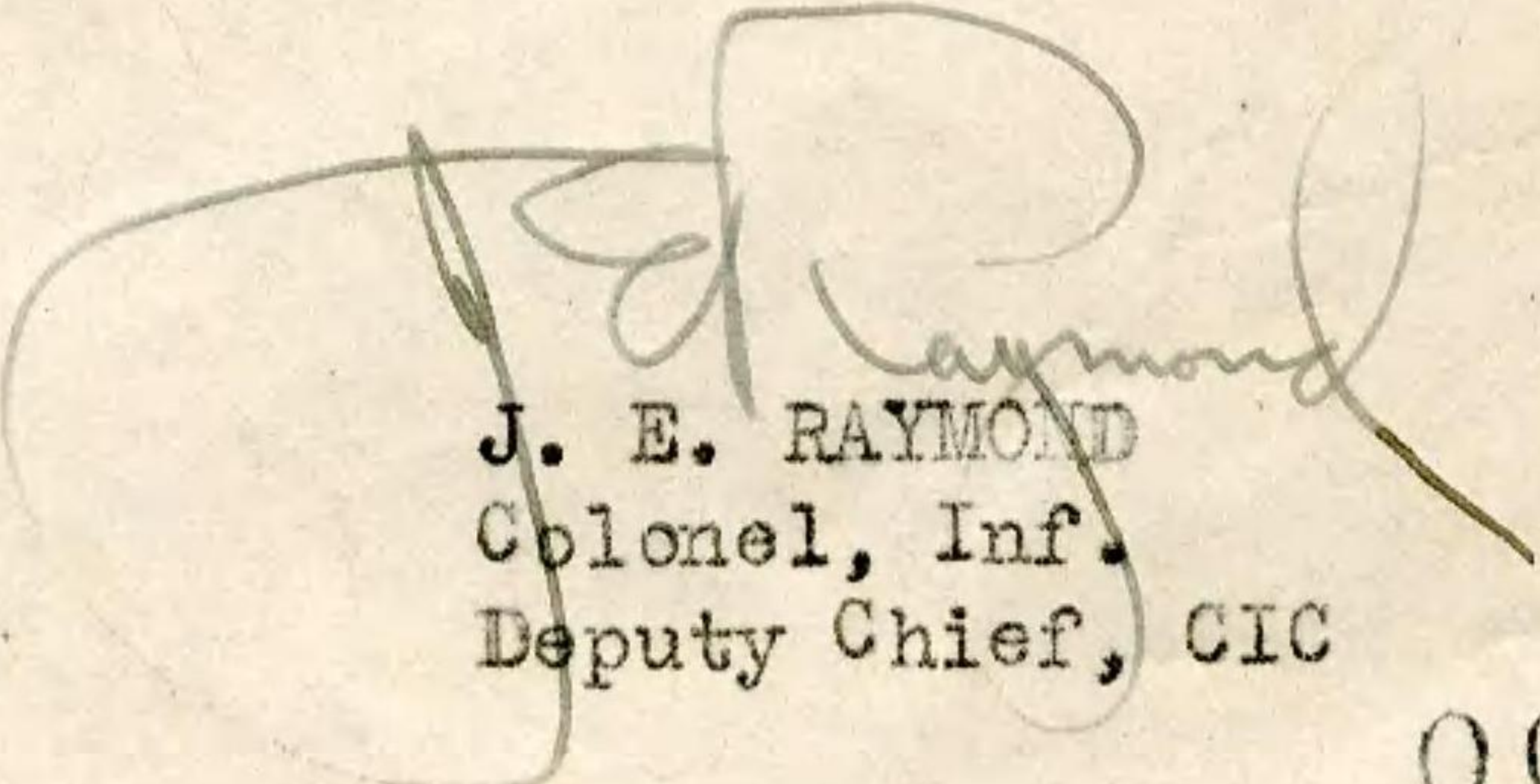
b. It has been proposed to change this employment policy by reducing the present strength of division and corps detachments, concentrating a greater strength of personnel at Army level. From this level division and corps detachments would be reenforced when such units go into the line and/or when counterintelligence activities in their areas increase to the point that additional personnel is needed. One of the suggestions for this plan has been to attach personnel from Army detachments temporarily to division and corps detachments so that as these latter commands advance, coverage will not be interrupted inasmuch as the attached personnel and pertinent records would remain in the area when it reverts to Army control. The Army detachment would then provide additional men to the division and corps detachments to permit similar transfers of area and records in subsequent forward movements.

c. It is realized that any variety of operational employment plans can be evolved. The one desired, of course, is that which will basically serve the best interest of security and continuity of coverage.

6. Any comments that will assist this headquarters in considering this operational employment plan from all points of view, will be greatly appreciated.
