

lectures and his sense of humor, Rao was renowned throughout the Elon community for his interest in the lives of his students. Nancy Harris, a colleague and close friend, remembers that he loved to socialize informally with everyone, students and faculty alike.

"He just had a way about him and he had a great sense of humor," remembers Harris. "He played a large role in why our Biology Department is so family oriented. He set the tone that we were a family-students and faculty. And he loved to spend time with students," Harris says.

While Rao liked to have fun, he was serious about the business of learning, too, says fellow department member Robert Vick.

"You had to tow the rope in his class; you didn't come in late to his class, or talk without being asked." But in his heart, Rao was a teacher who genuinely enjoyed his students. "He was always so interested in his students and he loved to do things with them." Vick remembers that Rao would often accompany members of the Elon football team to Zack's downtown Burlington for hot dogs.

"The department just won't be the same without him," says Vick. "He's been such a constant around here."

Farmer started out as a part-time professor at Elon. After a short time, Farmer left Elon to teach at the University of Western Sidney. He came back to teach at Elon a few years later.

This busy professor has led a full life. Farmer was born in Sydney and spent 19 years of his life in Australia before moving to the United States. He was the envy of all his friends when he received an athletic scholarship to the Univeristy of Texas at El Paso. While in Texas. Farmer participated in hammer throwing and was the number 2 junior in the world. He later graduated with a degree in health and physical education.

Farmer was a national coach in Mexico. In addition, he went to France to work as an administrator. Farmer went on to teach elementary school for over 4 years. After teaching, he reported sports for KDBC TV in El Paso. Despite his busy

schedule, Farmer still had time to train and compete in the 1976 and 1980 Olympics. He later served as a national coach in Australia.

After many accomplishments, Farmer went back to school to earn an MBA at the University of Mexico. He later earned a Ph.D from Tulane University where he was also a department chair. After Farmer came back to America, he taught at Guilford College. He eventually went back to Australia before finally settling in at Elon.

When asked about his teaching, Farmer mentioned that he enjoys being able to relate his eclectic background to his students. He also "hasn't met someone he doesn't like." Being able to help design and create the leisure/sport management program is another thing he likes about Elon.

Farmer was lucky to be selected to run with the torch before the 2000 Olympic Games. In January 2001, Farmer will be heading back to Australia. This time, he will be taking a group of Elon students on a studyabroad trip.

Most people do not consider that the ground Elon originially stood on, 87 acres purchased at \$281, was once a majestic grove of oak trees. Elon translated into Hebrew means "oak," but what actually stood in this grove? The college orginally consisted of just one building, Old Main, and one dormitory, East. Up until the addition of Koury Athletic Center and construction of the Moselev Student Center, Elon's campus was primarily located south of Haggard Avenue, something most current students could not even fathom. During Winter Term 2001 students learned about Elon's history and heritage during "Elon": Past, Present, and Future", taught by President Emeritus, Dr. J. Earl Danieley. Students were also in for a special treat when Dr. Gerald Francis, provost and vice president, and Dr. Leo Lambert Elon's president, spoke to the class. The three icons of Elon entertained and elightened the students with knowledge about Elon's humble beginnings, the catastrophic fire of 1923, and unprecedented growth. Dr. Francis spoke about the successful completion of the Elon Vision strategic plan, which was responsible for a new student center, science facility, and library. Dr. Lambert gave students a sneak peak into Elon's future, detailing the next strategic plan, NewCentury@Elon. Elon's frouth president, William A. Harper once said after the fire of 1923, "Born in poverty, nutured in sacrifice...Elon faces the future battered but undismayed." As Elon enters the 21st century, it continues to hold true to Harper's words, learning and growing as an institution. We learn about our past from great individuals like Danieley, Francis, and Lambert, in order to make our future brighter.













Brothers, Ernest A. Koury Sr. and Maurice J. Koury, were presented with honorary doctorates in appreciation of their continuous support and contribution to the Elon Vision. Convocation also celebrated the culmination of the vision, a seven year process envisioned by a group of trustees, faculty, administrators, and students. The goal of the Elon Vision was to transform a respected regional college into an institution with outstanding academic programs and state-of-the-art facilities.

He was born on June 12, 1924 in Milton, Massachusetts. On his eighteenth birthday, he graduated from Phillips Academy and enlisted in the U.S. Navy, where he became their youngest pilot. He went on to serve in the U.S. House of Representatives as an ambassador to the United Nations and as the Director of the CIA. In 1980, he became vice president in the Reagan administration and served two terms. He was elected president in 1988.

The 41st president of the United States spoke at the annual Spring Convocation for graduating seniors and academic honor students. Alumni Gym and McCrary Theatre were packed full of students, faculty, and honored guests to hear the words of

Bush was honored with an honorary doctorate degree. Gail M. Drew, chairwoman of the board of trustees, presented

this honor and Dr. Leo Lambert conferred the degree.

Many were expecting a political speech, but instead, Bush passed on words of wisdom and experience for the students and guests alike. With wit and humor, he addressed the school's

accomplishments and his wishes for students to leave college with a passion for serving others. He encouraged the students to get involved in the world and take action in causes that they supported. William S. Long

The college's first president, Long served from 1889 through 1894. He received his Bachelor of Arts at Graham College and was ordained as a reverend in 1860 by the North Carolina and Virginia conferences. Long was responsible for providing valuable leadership and guidance through the birth and early years of Elon.





William W. Staley

William Staley, the only nonresident president of the college, served from 1894 through 1905. He ws a graduate of Trinity College (later known as Duke University) and spend most of his life as the reverend of the Christian Church. Staley's presidency was long distnce because he did not want to leave his quickly growing congregation. As the second president, Staley followed in Long's footsteps by participating in the efforts to help the school grow.

William Allen Harper was the first alumnus to become president of the college. He graduated in 1889 and received his Master of Arts at Yale University in 1904. Harper began teaching until he was offered the presidency of the college. President from 1911-1931, Harper successfully began to rebuild Elon after the devastating fire of 1923.



Emmett L. Moffitt

Before Emmett Moffitt became president of Elon in 1905, he served as one of the original faculty members of the college. He received both his Bachelor of Arts degree and Masters degree at Trinity College (later Duke University) in 1889 and 1890 respectively. Moffitt served as president until 1911 and then remained a trustee of the school until his death.

Proving incredible leadership through hard times, Leon Smith served as president from 1931 until 1957. Smith successfully carried the college through the Great Depression, debt, and small class enrollment. Not only did Smith bring the college out of debt, but he also raised extra funds and facilitated the construction of five buildings on campus. At the time that Smith took over the presidency, the enrollment of was 86 and in 1957 at the closure of his presidency, 1,634 students were attending Elon.

J. Fred Young

President from 1973 through 1998, Fred Young is responsible for creating the Elon Vision which has brought great change to campus. Many new buildings, including Model and McMichael Science, have been erected under this vision. A Wake Forest graduate with a Bachelor of Science degree, Young also received degrees from UNC-Chapel Hill and Columbia University.

Leo M. Lambert

Leo Lambert assumed the presidency in 1999. As Elon's current president, he has completed the Vision and is now pursuing the New Century @ Elon. As Elon became a university on June 1, 2001, Lambert seeks to help it to grow into a nationally recognized institution and to create an even stronger learning environment for the students.
