**D**URING the past summer we built a new packing house which doubles the packing space at our nurseries. A new concrete platform, three hundred feet long and thirty-six feet wide, enables us to handle boxes from house to cars in the shortest possible time.

You will find that these improvements will work to your advantage when you want stock in a *hurry*. Some-time during the year you will find that your stock of fruit trees or ornamentals is running low—usually this comes in the busy season, when you want the stuff and want it quick. When such a time comes our facilities will enable us to supply your needs in the very shortest time possible. *There will be no delay*, and you can continue to *fill your customer's orders* without serious loss of time.

### TERMS, ETC.

Our Responsibility We are careful to label all stock, check it and pack it correctly. Except for our own mistakes, we cannot assume the responsibility of stock reaching destination safely. We do assume the responsibility for the true names of all our stock and will replace or refund the cost of any not proving true.

Claims Should errors occur, please advise us as soon as they are discovered. All claims must be filed within ten days after arrival of shipment.

Terms Cash on delivery to forwarding agent. However, we will extend credit to responsible parties by agreement—invoices to be due December 1 or June 1. All prices are f. o. b. Berlin, Md.

Orders All orders will be accepted with the understanding that, should our stock be injured by any cause beyond our control, we shall not be compelled to make delivery. We ship from October 1 to May 1, with a few weeks intermission in mid-winter.

Health Inspection All our stock is inspected by the Maryland Department of Agriculture and with each shipment we will send a certificate from them saying that the stock has been examined and found entirely free from all dangerous insects and fungi. We are prepared to fumigate any nursery stock when desired by customers.

Packing The greatest care is used in digging, storing and packing. For packing material we charge as follows: Boxes, 12x12x10 feet, \$1.00; 16x16x10, \$1.25; 18x18, \$1.50; 24x24, \$2.00; 28x28, \$2.25; 32x32 \$2.50; 36x36, \$3.00. Bales, according to size, 10c to \$1.00. We want shipping directions, but in their absence will use our judgment.
