Condition of Sale.-1. When stock is to be boxed or bailed we charge for cost of labor and material.
2. We deliver all Goods Free of Drayage to Railroad or Express Offices after which our responsibility ceases.

## GRADES

We grade carefuily. In some cases by caliper and others by height. When by both, the caliper must govern. The lower number is included, but the higher number excluded. For instance in a grade of 4 to 5 feet trees, 4 feet trees are included, but five feet trees go into the next grade higher and likewise where calipered. If plump five feet trees are wanted, the order must be for five to six feet.
