



The 12 Lots Bounded with Yellow, numbered from 1 to 12 on the East Side of Council St. are to the 3 Lots bounded with red and lettered B.C.D. on the West side of Council St. as $\frac{1}{5}$ to $\frac{2}{5}$ in quantity. But the irregular form of the latter makes them less valuable than the former, and it is deemed reasonable to annex the lot 1 to the B.C.D. which would then be in the proportional value of $\frac{3}{5}$ to $\frac{2}{5}$.

The Lands between Gibbes St. and Ashley River has been divided as follows, the three lots bounded with yellow and numbered 13, 14 and 15 are the two lots bounded Red and lettered E.F. as $\frac{3}{5}$ to $\frac{2}{5}$ in quantity. So that by this plan the Lots bounded with Yellow and numbered from 1 to 15 are in valuable proportion to the 6 Lots lettered A.B.C.D.E.F. as $\frac{3}{5}$ to $\frac{2}{5}$.

With regards to the subdivisions of the $\frac{3}{5}$, the Solicitor representing them will explain the same.

As relates to the subdivisions A.B.C.D. - A+B are equal in quantity, as are C+D.
