Warlike Preparations. We learn that Col. T. N. JOHNSON, GOV

McDougal's Aid, has received full instructions and authority in relation to carrying on the war against the Indians, and that he will leave this afternoon, in company with Judge Marvin, for Mariposa. So far as we have been able to learn, these gentlemen propose going immediately to the seat of difficulties, where they, with the volunteers already in the field, will await the arrival of the Indian Commissioners, if deemed advisable, who, it is supposed, will leave on Saturday next, accompanied by four companies of United States troops, which are now at Benicia. The Government has a transport lying in the San Joaquin, just above the mouth of the Tuolumne river, from whence supplies are to be drawn for the United States troops during the expedition. From this point the munitions are to be packed into the Indian country on mules. The effective force in the field will then be the companies alluded to, and 200 volunteers called out by order of the Governor, on the 12th and 25th of the present month.

It is farther understood that Col. Johnson has plenary powers as to enrolling more volunteers, upon his arrival in the Indian country, should the condition of affairs demand it. We understand that Mariposa will probably be the military depot. The 200 volunteers are to be divided into four companies, three of which are to be drawn from Mariposa county, and one from Sonora, Tuolumno county. These companies will elect their own officers, who will be under the command of Col. Johnson.

If a mutually advantageous and lasting treaty can be effected with the Indians, without farther loss of blood, we shall be rejoiced to see it done; otherwise, the sooner they are severely chastised, the sooner they will crave the overtures of peace. We anticipate that the expedition will be inconvenienced, and perhaps delayed, and by the rains, which, according to all previous experience, we ought to look out for "about these days." Yet no slight obstacles or privations will deter some of our personal acquaintances concerned in the expedition from doing their whole duty. Judge Marvin's experience with the Indians and perfect knowledge of their character. will be of great service to the expedition, and those engaged in it, have acted wisely in persuading him to accompany them.

Bill to Create a Way Loan.

The Hon. THOMAS J. GREEN, from the Fi nance Committee of the Senate, reported a bill, on the 24th inst., authorizing a war loan. The bill provides, that inasmuch as there is at this time an Indian war raging on our frontier, and there being no funds in the treasury, or promise made by the Government to pay the same, that the Treasurer be authorized to issue bouds of the State, in the aggregate, not to exceed \$300,000; said bonds to be made payable to the order of the Governor, with one per cent per month interest from date. The bonds shall be re ceivable for taxes, and other State dues. together with the interest accrued thereon and from all persons and public collectors The Treasurer shall redeem said bonds, if at any time there is sufficient money in the treasury, but shall not allow them to be deposited, with a view of redeeming them at a future period. Any collector of public revenue, when having sufficient money in hand, is made liable for refusing to exchange with a fund holder.

It is made the duty of the Treasurer, as soon as sufficient money shall have been paid into the treasury, to give six months notice in some newspaper, requiring the bonds to be brought in for redemption, and all those not returned in that time, shall cease to draw interest; provided, that so soon as the Goverment of the United States shall reimburse the State in the amount of the aforesaid bonds, the interest shall cease by giving thirty days notice through the papers.

Our Senators and Representatives in Con-

gress, are instructed to use the utmost diligence, in procuring from the Federal Government any indebtedness for which the State of California has become responsible on account of Indian wars.

The Babel of San Francisco. All the world have read of Babylon, of the tower of Babel, and the confusion of tongues. Had the event recorded in Holy Writ occurred in the present day, instead of locating it in the now wastes of Asia, we should have given it a local habitation on Central Wharf, Commercial street, in San Francisco. Pass through Kearny street, to the head of Commercial, and look down through a portion of the town, which appears going out to sea to meet the shipping, in a sort of a compromise sea of heads, what a moving mass of human beings meets the view!

Most have read the passage of Bonaparte, over the bridge of Lodi, when the Austrian cannon disputed his progress, and pictured to their mind the rush of men, and the vast slaughter through that narrow passage, in that desperate attempt. Were a cannon to be placed on Montgomory street, to defend not be less, and the sacrifice of human life would equal that of the passage of Lodi. It s like the waving of a field of corn in the breeze, a crowded mass of flesh and blood. one of the main arteries of the city. A congregation of all nations, creeds and tongues - English and Spanish, German. French, Chinese, Sandwich Islands, Indian, &c., and in passing through, one hears their jargon at every corner, and sees the strange and peculiar costume of each nation-the flashy silk or muslin dresses of the embrowned Mexican senoritas---we cannot call them pretty,-bareheaded, or with a rich shawl carelessly thrown over their heads, which half hides a seeming Indian face; the sturdy German, with a heavy package nicely balanced on her head, or the neat, tidy French and American belle, tripping along with a light step and joyous countenance; or perchance the plain, honest, good natured face of the Kanaka girl, dressed in petticoats after no peculiar fashion, meets the gaze, and excites the wonder where all these women came from, and what brought them here. Handcarts, porters, dravs, now and then a fine carriage, rattle over the plank pavement, adding confusion to the hubbub, in a sound of thunder, while at points along the wharf, the thimble rigger, the French monte dealer, and low gamblers are gathering crowds around them, to practise upon the credulity of the unsophisticated. The pickpocket, the thief, of all grades, are in the crowd, and often, for want of other opportunity, a fight or excitement is got up to order, so that these light-fingered gentry can practise their vocation upon the

idle lovers of pugilistic fun. At the corner of Montgomery, and Leidsdorff, and Sansom streets, are musical gambling hells, where your loose change can be fiddled away on the turning of a card, and where your losses can be drowned, for an addlepate, in the flowing bowl. Rows, fights, and robberies are the order of the day, aye, and night, too, and to see sin and depravity in its most glaring colors, the seeker after such pleasures has only to walk from one end of Long Wharf to the other. An excitement can be got up at any moment by pretending to examine a quartz specimen, and instantly a man becomes the centre of a wondering crowd. Still as a pedestrian elbows his way, at open spaces along the dock, you see crowds of sail boats and lighters alongside, discharging vegetables -- the produce of Californiacattle and sheep for the market, wood, coal. hay, &c., while numerous wholesale and retail shops of various kinds, restaurant and cigar divans, fill up the sum of human operations on this great Babel of San Francisco.

Near the end of the wharf is Whitehall, the haven of wherrys. If you are looking around as if in search of something, a trim red shirt is at your side, and a voice enquires, "A boat, sir! Carry you out and back for two dollars." Here, on both sides. are ships, barks, schooners, steamboats and propellors, just off for Gold Bluff, Panama, Sacramento, Marysville, or Stockton, as you please; in fact, one may go to China, or eternity, for about the same price. For the one take a ship; for the other a steamboat. and in due time the port of destination will be reached. Take papers for the one from the Custom House, for the other at the Monte table

Among the incidents of Long Wharf life, leserving notice, is a little hand-wagon with a tight box, labelled "Pure Water." This means just what it reads. There is no adulteration of salt, soda, soap, sulphur or suds. Get up at the peep of day, or look down at nine o'clock at night, in rain or shine, in hot or cold, and you will see that little cart of nure water," moving along, drawn by a poor fellow with only one arm. Unobtrusive and modest in his demeanor, without a drop of hot water aristocracy in his viens, the nained water carrier pursues his daily water they want during the day. At home, we should have asked what could a man with only one arm do in the land of gold, to gain his bread? What folly for such a man to go where two hands and a pick and shovel were necessary, and hardly obtain a living with both! Undismayed at such prospects, he resolved to strive with fortune, and win her smile with one arm, and among the hardy adventurers he sought the golden shore, and is not only earning an honest living, but laying up money, in his humble calling of dispensing one of the best gifts of God to his fellow-laborers in San Francisco. Always be ready with a bit for the honest water

Such is a faint picture of the "confusion worse confounded" which greets the visiter to Long Wharf. Every day is like its fellow; no change, no cessation of the varied scenes which attract, amuse or pain. It is one of the business places of San Francisco, and every one who has had occasion to visit it, will recognize the sketch we give above. ers to-morrow.

The Mails and Mail Agents.

We would take the occasion afforded by the departure of another steamer for the Atlantic, to impress upon the Government at home the necessity of making more efficient arrangements for the transit of the California and Oregon mails across the Isthmus. The present contractor under the New Grenadian Government should either be superceded, or else forced to provide the necessary means to accomplish the desired object with less delay. Upon him rests all the responbetween the land and old ocean. What a sibility, and not upon the Mail Steamship Companies, nor the Mail Agents. The latter, generally, have displayed untiring energy and vigilance in the performance of their duties, and especially do we commend the watchfulness and care of the government agent who came through with the mail by the Oregon, WM. WHITNEY, Esq. Although his first trip up the Pacific coast, he manifested the most commendable appreciation of it from such an inroad, the slaughter could the wants of the mail depositories along the line, and especially of California and Oregon. The Department has no more efficient man in its service. He leaves in charge of the mails by the Panama, on Saturday, and we shall look for his return with the confidant assurance that in his hands the mail service will not suffer.

Our representatives in Congress should at once present the grievances of California, in regard to the Isthmus mail services to the Post Office Department, and insist upon the immediate application of the proper remedy.

SENATOR LIPPINCOTT. - There are few men in California whose excellent qualities of head and heart render them more highly esteemed than the Hon. BENJAMIN S. LIP-PINCOTT, Senator from San Joaquin District. He came to the Pacific side several years ago, before the discovery of the gold mines, and may, therefore, be regarded as one of the old settlers and pioneers of this now young but vigorous State.

Possessing an inexhaustable fund of good nature, great practical ability, and an indomitable energy, Mr. L. is just the man to aid in developing the wonderful resources of a country like this. As a member of the Senate in the first Legislature of California, he performed a prominent part in the enactment of the fundamental laws necessary to put in motion the governmental machinery of an American State; and this is an honor of which any man may justly be proud, and especially when it is considered that the temptations to legislate for private ends were never more numerous or strong than here. But Senator Lippincott is emphatically an independent, high-minded, honorable man. whom alone a sense of duty could influence in any degree. Our acquaintance with him for a year past has been agreeable, and we are rejoiced to know that a successful career lies open before him, and that he has already acquired a position as flattering to an honest pride, as it is well deserved for his talent and enterprise.

We are gratified to learn that Mr. LIPPIN-Excellency Gov. McDougal, as one of his Aids, with the rank of Colonel of Cavalry, in which gratification we are sure all his friends, both in this State and those of the Atlantic side, will share.

Murder and Lynching at Curtis' Creek.

We are indebted to Mr. Brown, of Revnolds & Co.'s Express, for the particulars of one of the most cold blooded murders, followed by summary punishment, that we have WM. WHITNEY, Esq., the popular mail agent. ever been called upon to record. The state- who sets out in charge of the mails for the ent, as we have it, is as follows

On Saturday evening, the 26th inst., WM. Bowen and Thomas McMasters had an altercation over a game of cards, when the former drew a pistol, for the purpose, as was supposed, of shooting his contestant. Mr. Bogos, formerly of Baltimore, interfered, and after some difficulty, succeeded in restoring peace between them; after which the several parties drank together and seperated, apparently on friendly terms. Early the following morning, Boggs and Bowen met at the store of Hogg & Brown, and after a few words of an angry character. Bowen drew his revolver, and on the second fire blew out the brains of Mr. Boggs. The friends of Boggs, some five or six in number, who were present, immediately seized Bowen, placed a lasso around his neck, and after dragging him about eighty rods, hung him up to a frame, used by a butcher for slaughtering

Suicide of Mr. Wm. Torrence.

Mr. WILLIAM TORRENCE, residing at the corner of Montgomery and Bush streets, committed suicide yesterday afternoon, at 5 o'clock, by blowing out his brains with a pistol. For the past two days the proceedings of the Legislature have appeared more wanting in interett than heretofore. The cause of this probably lies in the fact that the heavier work is doing in committees, and the meetings of either body merely show the machinery of law-making pro forma.

The question of the removal of the Capitol is for the first time beginning to excite the attention of the Assembly. The action of the Senate has been had, and you are informed of the result. Daily, the Journal, in a long array of empty and abusive epithets, is attempting to deny the "folly and shame" of the contemplated removal, and attempting thus to mitigate, or by villifying the many respectable gentlemen who are anxious to see the capitol located at VALLEJO.

I will not attempt to pronounce an opinion on the subject of the final result. That those in the Vallejo interest are honest in their views and feelings on this subject, I have no reason to doubt, and that they are gentle-men, and every way worthy of the consideration due to such from gentlemen, I know First and foremost amongst those in this interest, after Gen. VALLEJO himself, who, by the way, is a very estimable man, is Capt JOHN B. FRISBIE, who, by a little incident early in the session, which I am not at liberty to describe, attracted my profound admiration, which his gentlemanly intelligeocc and agreeable bonhomme, have since only made more permanent.

On the other hand, just at the present crisis, the San Jose interest is daily developing new strength, and the princely offers made yesterday of real estate, in large amounts, and ample pledges to the State, which are well guarantied by citizens here, quite cast into the background the munificence of the nabob of Sonoma. Say what you please of San Jose-and your humble servant never said but one thing of the Valley of Santa Clara, and of its towns-the value of property situated in it, notwithstanding the enormous depreciation from the fictitious values of the same; last year, has been more than quadrupled within twelve months. And this value, arising from unchanging, permanent interests residing here inherently, is constantly on the rise. It may not be discoverable in the rapidity with which John Smith or Richard Roe are make money "piles," but it can be seen in the valuation list of the Assessor, when correctly adjudged and

equalized." Notwithstanding all, the issue is doubtful and although I verily believe that nine-tenth. of the members of the Legislature came here month ago fully resolved to vote for Valle jo, I am doubtful whether, at the present writing, two-thirds or even three-fifths of them would be found willing to do it. When the question hereafter shall come to a vote, the number will probably be still less. This is an opinion, however; I do not expect or wish that it may have, if that were possible, any weight in the decision of the issue. God be praised. He has furnished sufficient attrac tions for this locality, without rendering necessary the accidental advantages of extraneous causes.

A further acquaintance with the members of the Assembly, assures me that I should by no means omit, in the list of names of those worthy of mention, that of Majer WILKINS, of Tuolumne, MURPHY, of Calaveras, Cook, San Diego, erratic and original as he is and WETHERED, of San Francisco. The Richest Specimen Yet. Yesterday, we saw in possession of Depu-

y Sheriff Powers, the richest and most wonlerful specimen of gold quartz that has vet been discovered in California. The quartz was some two inches thick, and over half a foot in length, as much in breadth. Large grains of pure gold covered it, while on one pooze from the quartz, presented the main feature of the specimen. At first sight, one would suppose that it was a work of art, instead of that of nature, the crystal portion of it twining round and taking root in the rock, and then putting out in most perfect and beautiful spires and points of nearly an inch in length, with an everness, regularity of shape, and so perfectly transparent, that the beholder would doubt his senses in being told that it was taken, just as it is, from the lowels of "mother earth." This crystal, in its points, resembles the finest work of cut glass, equally, if not more so, as brilliant and clear, and contains gold seemingly in a iquid state, while at the base or the roots, it is not so clear, being of a thick whitish color, but rich in its combination.

This remarkable specimen was found in the Mariposa mines, and is said to be of immense value. We obtained but a passing glance of this mineral production, as it was exhibited to a large crowd in the street, but we shall endeavor to learn more of it, and give to our readers further particulars.

CALIFORNIA LEGISLATURE.

Wednesday, January 28, IN SENATE.—The Finance Committee reported in favor of the bill allowing war-

rants to draw interest. Goy. McDougal returned the bill to provide for the inspection, with his veto, hoping it would "receive farther consideration in the body in which it originated, and as an admonition against acting prematurely in matters seriously affecting the interests of the public." On taking a vote, the veto of the Governor was sustained, 7 to 3.

On the question of the adoption of the reolution fixing Monday next, for the election of U. S. Senator— Mr. Van Buren moved that the resolution

e indefinitely postponed. Mr. Green was of opinion that this disposition of it might appear scarcely de-corous enough to the Assembly. He thought that the contested elections should be settled before the consideration of the election of U. S. Senator, as it might be that one of the gentlemen whose seats were contested might be declared as not duly qualified. If the election therefore of U. S.
