Subject: United States Requirements for Military
Rights in the Republic of Panama

Reference: SM-6332

On 30 July 1946 the State-War-Navy Coordinating Committee forwarded the information contained in SM-6332 to the Department of State with the following amendments:

On page 2 a subparagraph d was added as follows:

"d. In addition to, and separate from, the sites listed in a, b, and c above, the United States requires the long term right of naval anchorage (as defined in SWNCC 38/37 (Appendix "A" to JCS 570/64)) in the territorial waters of the Republic of Panama, including the Perlas Islands."

On page 3 after subparagraph e an additional paragraph was inserted as follows:

"The rights asked for in this paper are not to be construed as cancelling or abrogating any rights now held by the United States through treaty or other agreement between the United States and the Republic of Panama, but are to be considered as additional to any such rights."

Attached is a draft of a cable to OMSUS, Berlin, Germany, prepared by the Department of State.

The State Department requests that this message be transmitted by the Joint Chiefs of Staff to OMSUS and information addressees noted thereon, as a matter of priority.

This cable is a reply to CG 9827, CM-IN-5812 of 28 July addressed to the Joint Chiefs of Staff which in turn, was in reply to the directive issued by the Joint Chiefs of Staff with respect to restitution of Hungarian gold, WK 93630. Since the directive was based entirely upon the memorandum given to the Prime Minister of Hungary by the Acting Secretary of State on June 14, 1946 and the present cable is an interpretation of that memorandum, it is believed that further clearance for the dispatch of this message is not required.

Reurad CG 9827 on restitution Hungarian gold.

You will request Hungarian representative to sign waiver substantially as follows on behalf of his Government and the Hungarian National Bank upon delivery of gold described Oured WX 93630:

"Hungarian Government, in consideration of restitution of gold as described in annex hereto attached, waives any and all claims which it may have against Germany, Austria, and neutral powers with which agreements regarding looted monetary gold are reached, arising from losses of monetary gold through looting and wrongful removal from Hungary."

If obtaining Hungarian consent to such waiver involves changing present plans for delivery of gold you are authorized to deliver against customary restitution receipt as proposed by you and you will advise Hungarian representative that the proposed waiver nevertheless represents the understanding of your government.

By informal action on 26 July 1946, the State-War-Navy Coordinating Committee approved SWNCC 307 as amended by SWNCC 307/1 and 307/2.

A copy of the revised approved paper is forwarded herewith for information and such implementation as may be deemed appropriate.

The State-War-Navy Coordinating Committee in preparing the military and air clauses for the treaty with Austria have concluded that "the rehabilitation and operation of armaments, armament industries and military training in Austria should be limited consonantly to the same purposes to which the armed forces are restricted". No covering provisions have been included in the military clauses since the considered restriction falls in the economic category. It is recommended that an appropriate clause be included in the treaty to ensure this limitation on armament industries in Austria.



b. CCS 739/49**

With reference to CCS 739/49, the State-War-Navy Coordinating Committee note that paragraph 2 of the proposed message to SACMED is somewhat vague, is restrictive on the use of Italians, and makes no mention of the Poles. From the political standpoint it does not appear sound to interpose at this time any obstacles in the way of SACMED's planning for use of forces in the unlikely event of general Yugoslav attack. Furthermore it is politically desirable that as much of the rear area responsibility in Italy as practicable be an Italian military responsibility. Therefore the SWNCC, from the political standpoint, consider a paragraph in lieu of paragraph 2 substantially as follows is more appropriate providing it is militarily acceptable:

*Although the condition imposed on the use of Italian troops is that the Yugoslavs make the first aggressive move, any knowledge by the Italians that their troops would be used in event of trouble might result in premature Italian action and also might raise other international implications. It is considered that a general organized Yugoslavia attack is unlikely although the possibility does exist. Your plans and preparations for such a possibility should be on basis that all forces in Italy, including Poles and such Italians as you estimate can be utilized, will be available for your operations in any area. Prior to development of such a general attack you are authorized to use Italians and Poles in any areas of Italy except Zone A and the portion of Udine claimed by the Soviets for Yugoslavs; however until development of such a possible general attack you should use Poles in forward areas as

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sparingly as possible, consulting frequently with your political advisers on the problem."

This approach to the problem was agreed informally by Mr. Byrnes and Mr. Bevin in Paris. However, no information is available as to the Foreign Office's final reaction to the matter.



The United States Chiefs of Staff have considered the memorandum dated 21 April 1946 (page 72 of the enclosed copy of J. C. S. 1512/10) from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers transmitting certain enclosures, including a letter to the Chairman, Allied Council for Japan, from the United Nations War Crimes Commission, transmitting the Australian First List of Major Japanese War Criminals.


The Australian proposal to indict Emperor Hirohito as a war criminal has heretofore been considered. No new facts have been adduced to suggest revision of the United States policy, as approved by the Far Eastern Commission, directing the Supreme Commander to take no action against the Emperor as a war criminal pending receipt of a special directive concerning his treatment. Furthermore, major Japanese war criminals were indicted on 29 April 1946, and the indictment of Hirohito at this late date would therefore come as an anticlimax unless testimony adduced at the Tokyo trial clearly indicates the necessity for his indictment.

DIRECTIVE MEMORANDUM
RESTITUTION OF JAPANESE PROPERTY

1. You will take immediate steps to restore to Allied countries objects in the four categories listed below which are found in Japan and which are identified as having been located in an Allied country at the time of occupation of that country, and which were removed by fraud or duress by the Japanese or their agents. You will disregard the fact that payment was made unless there is conclusive evidence that fraud or duress did not take place. You will defer restitution of any object included in category a which follows, however, so long as its retention is required for the safety of the occupation forces. In such cases you will provide an explanation of reasons for retention and an estimated date of restoration.

a. Industrial and transportation machinery and equipment.

b. Gold, other precious metals, precious gems, foreign securities, foreign currencies, and other foreign exchange assets.

c. Cultural objects.

d. Agricultural products and industrial raw materials.

2. You will take steps to restore to Allied countries ships of all types and sizes found in Japanese waters which are identified as having been registered in any Allied country at the time of seizure or sinking by the Japanese or their agents, or at the time of acquisition by the Japanese or their agents by fraud or duress. You will disregard the fact that payment was made unless there is conclusive evidence that fraud or duress did not take place. You will accomplish restitution of such Allied vessels as rapidly as conditions permit and will complete such restitution not later than December 31, 1946.

3. Within the limits of feasibility, you will, as a matter of priority, have salvaged, repaired, or refitted, as may be necessary to permit their return in a condition substantially similar to that at the time they came into Japanese hands, ships damaged or sunk and found in Japanese waters, on the request of the claimant country. The costs of necessary salvage, repair and refitting in Japan should be borne by the Japanese Government but should be applied against the reparations apportionment to the claimant country.

4. You will not permit the processing of claims for industrial and transportation machinery and equipment found in Japan in general to delay removals of machinery and equipment on reparations account, but no item for which restitution claim has been received by you should be allocated on reparations account until the claim has been acted upon. On the other hand, you will recognize no restitution claim for articles already allocated to particular countries on reparations account.

5. The claimant government should take delivery at a point in Japan designated by you except that in the case of Allied vessels subject to restitution you may at your discretion make delivery at Western Pacific points outside Japan whenever delivery will thereby be facilitated. Expenses incurred after delivery to the claimant government should be borne by that government, except that in the case of delivery within Japan, relevant transportation expenses within Japan and any dismantling, packing and repairs necessary for proper transportation, including the necessary manpower, materials and organization, should be borne by Japan and be included in restitution. The recipient government should indemnify you against all claims made in respect of the property received.

6. Restitution claims for property other than ships should be made by the government of the Allied country from whose territory the property claimed was removed; and restitution made to that government. In the case of ships restitution claims should be filed by, and restitution made to, the government of the country whose flag the vessels were wearing or on whose register of shipping the vessels were borne at the time of sinking, seizure or acquisition as specified in paragraph 2.

7. No items should be included in Japanese export programs which you consider as probably subject to restitution as defined above. If items later found to be subject to restitution should be exported, equitable compensation should be made to that country to which the items exported should have been restored.

8. Without prejudice to other arrangements which may be made between the interested parties, the foregoing restitution policies, especially those in paragraph 6, are not intended to give the Allied government concerned the right to withhold from a person who is a national of another Allied Power any property as to which he may establish a legitimate title.

For your information the Far Eastern Commission also recommended to the Government of those countries within whose territories may be found looted objects such as:

- 1. Industrial and transportation machinery and equipment;
- 2. Gold, other precious metals, precious gems, foreign securities, foreign currencies, and other foreign exchange assets;
- 3. Cultural objects;
- 4. Agricultural products and industrial raw materials;
- 5. Ships;

that bilateral arrangements be drawn up providing for restitution according to these principles. The Far Eastern Commission also requested the U. S. Government to forward the above statement of policy through the usual channels to States which are not represented on the Far Eastern Commission and within whose territories such looted objects may be found.

STATEMENT OF POLICY REGARDING
RESTITUTION OF LOST PROPERTY

1. Immediate steps should be taken to restore to Allied countries objects in the four categories listed below which are found in Japan and which are identified as having been located in an Allied country at the time of occupation of that country, and which were removed by fraud or duress by the Japanese or their agents. The fact that payment was made should be disregarded unless there is conclusive evidence that fraud or duress did not take place. Restitution of any object included in category a which follows should be deferred, however, so long as its retention is required for the safety of the occupation forces. In such cases the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers should provide an explanation of reasons for retention and an estimated date of restoration.

- a. Industrial and transportation machinery and equipment.
- b. Gold, other precious metals, precious gems, foreign securities, foreign currencies, and other foreign exchange assets.
- c. Cultural objects.
- d. Agricultural products and industrial raw materials.

2. Steps should be taken to restore to Allied countries ships of all types and sizes found in Japanese waters which are identified as having been registered in an Allied country at the time of seizure or sinking by the Japanese or their agents, or at the time of acquisition by the Japanese or their agents by fraud or duress. The fact that payment was made should be disregarded unless there is conclusive evidence that fraud or duress did not take place. Restitution of such Allied vessels should be accomplished as rapidly as conditions permit and should be completed not later than December 31, 1946.

3. Within the limits of feasibility, ships damaged or sunk and found in Japanese waters, on the request of the claimant country should as a matter of priority be salvaged, repaired, or refitted as may be necessary to permit their return in a condition substantially similar to that at the time they came into Japanese hands. The costs of necessary salvage, repair and refitting in Japan should be borne by the Japanese Government but should be applied against the reparations apportionment to the claimant country.

4. The processing of claims for industrial and transportation machinery and equipment found in Japan should not be permitted in general to delay removals of machinery and equipment on reparations account, but no item for which restitution claim has been received by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers should be allocated on reparations account until the claim has been acted upon. On the other hand, no restitution claim should be recognized for articles already allocated to particular countries on reparations account.

5. The claimant government should take delivery at a point in Japan designated by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers except that in the case of Allied vessels subject to restitution the Supreme

Commander may at his discretion make delivery at Western Pacific points outside Japan whenever delivery will thereby be facilitated. Expenses incurred after delivery to the claimant government should be borne by that government, except that in the case of delivery within Japan, relevant transportation expenses within Japan and any dismantling, packing and repairs necessary for proper transportation, including the necessary manpower, materials, and organization, should be borne by Japan and be included in restitution. The Secretary General of the Far Eastern Commission requests that the Joint Chiefs of Staff, in transmitting the enclosed draft directive to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, inform him that in approving the statement of policy on which the enclosed directive is based, the Commission recommended that in connection with this policy decision, the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers should be informed that the Far Eastern Commission has currently under consideration additional policy with respect to extraordinary taxation designed to meet war costs or other charges falling on the Japanese as a result of the war, such as the Increased Property Tax Law and the War Profits Tax Law as Imposed on Juridical Persons.

DIRECTIVE REGARDING JAPANESE TAXATION OF ALIENS

The following statement of policy, adopted by the Far Eastern Commission on 18 July 1946, under the provisions of paragraph II, A, 1 of its Terms of Reference has been received from the State, War and Navy Departments for transmission to you as a directive for your guidance in accordance with paragraph III, 1, of those Terms of Reference. You should take appropriate steps to insure that any tax laws adopted by the Japanese conform to the principles set forth in this statement:

1. No Japanese taxation should discriminate against aliens.
2. No capital levy should be levied by the Japanese authorities in respect to property in or outside Japan owned by United Nations nationals. Any capital levy on corporations and unincorporated associations should be so devised as to exempt from the effects of the levy, the shares and interests in the said corporations and unincorporated associations held by United Nations nationals. If in your opinion exceptional circumstances justify the imposition of any such capital levy, you should refer the matter for consideration of the Far Eastern Commission.

STATEMENT OF POLICY
REGARDING JAPANESE TAXATION OF ALIENS

1. No Japanese taxation should discriminate against aliens.

2. No capital levy should be levied by the Japanese authorities in respect to property in or outside Japan owned by United Nations nationals. Any capital levy on corporations and unincorporated associations should be so devised as to exempt from the effects of the levy, the shares and interests in the said corporations and unincorporated associations held by United Nations nationals. If in the opinion of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, exceptional circumstances justify the imposition of any such capital levy, he should refer the matter for consideration of the Far Eastern Commission.

During the period 11 - 20 July 1946, the State-War-Navy Coordinating Committee cleared informally 13 papers. One meeting (42nd) was held, at which one paper was cleared.

MEETING CLEARANCE

Responsibility for Cost of Restitution of Property from Austria to Allied Nations and Ex-Enemy Nations (SWNCC 104/10)

The Committee approved the proposed draft message for transmittal by the Joint Chiefs of Staff to the CS, USFA, stating:

After considering change proposed in previous War Department cable insofar as it applied to Austria, it is concluded that no distinction be made between restitution to Allied Nations and restitution to ex-enemy nations in re costs of administering restitution program. Decision is based upon general principle that governments of countries holding looted property must pay for internal expense of return.

Hope that expenses restitution not be shifted to non-occupation cost part of Austrian budget since Austrian Government budget position already difficult. If in your opinion it is necessary to attempt shift, you are authorized to do so. Advise whether this would require quadripartite action. Restitution program should not be interfered with or delayed in any way pending such arrangements as you may attempt.

INFORMAL CLEARANCESOver-All Examination of U.S. Requirements for Rights of Military Air Transit and Technical Stop in Foreign Countries (SWNCC 38/38)

The Committee approved the recommendation of the Joint Chiefs of Staff that the Secretary of State be informed as follows:

"Because of the very remote possibility that the U.S. will either need a complete air route through the eastern portion of the South Pacific Ocean or would develop and maintain such a route during peacetime, the Joint Chiefs of Staff recommend that all mention of Nuku Hiva in the Marquesas Group (France) and Aitutaki in the Cook Islands (New Zealand) be deleted from SWNCC 38/30."

U.S. Requirements for Military Rights which Require Negotiations with Members of the British Commonwealth of Nations (SWNCC 38/39)

The Committee approved the recommendation of the Joint Chiefs of Staff that the study be transmitted to the Secretary of State, covering revised U.S. military requirements in territory under sovereignty of or under mandate to members of the British Commonwealth of Nations; also indicates the probable peacetime status and use of each area.

United States Requirements for Military Rights which Require Negotiation with the Portuguese Government (SWNCC 38/40)

The Committee approved the recommendation of the Joint Chiefs of Staff that the Secretary of State be informed of their revised views on U.S. requirements for military rights which require negotiation with the Portuguese Government, covering the maximum rights desired and the minimum requirements in the Azores and Cape Verde Islands, along with the probable peacetime status and use of each area.

Review of U.S. Requirements for Military Rights which Require Negotiations with the Governments of Iceland, Denmark, Cuba, Ecuador, Peru and Brazil (SWNCC 38/41)

The Committee approved the recommendation of the Joint Chiefs of Staff that the Secretary of State be informed of

their revised views on U.S. requirements for military rights which require negotiation with the Governments of Iceland, Denmark, Cuba, Ecuador, Peru and Brazil, covering the maximum rights desired and minimum requirements for each area. Also they indicate the probable peacetime status and use of each area.

Strategic Areas and Trusteeships in the Pacific (BWNGC 89/2)

The Committee approved the recommendation of the Joint Chiefs of Staff that the paper be transmitted to the Secretary of State with the request that he present it to the President. The Joint Chiefs of Staff reaffirm their previous determination that vital security interests require permanent retention by the U.S. of exclusive strategic control of the Japanese Mandated Islands, Marcus Island, and parts of the Nansei Shoto and Nanpo Shoto.

Division of German Naval Vessels (BWNGC 208/16)

The Committee approved, on behalf of the U.S. Government, the proposed plan of the Tripartite Naval Commission of 1 June 1946, which covered the following points: (1) British Government would withdraw its objection to the division of Naval harbor servicing craft; (2) U.S. and U.S.S.R. representatives agree to retention in British Zone of Occupation of certain harbor craft from their provisional allocation on a loan basis; (3) All ex-German floating docks considered former German property to be awarded on that basis; (4) U.S.S.R. to accept as its share of floating docks those located in U.S.S.R. Zone of Occupation; (5) Remainder of floating docks equally divided between U.S. and U.K.; (6) Each Government provide docks needed for occupational forces; (7) U.S. and U.K. withdraw objection to equal division of newly found ships.

Provisions for the Coordinated Exploitation of Japanese Intelligence Targets of International Concern (BWNGC 210/2)

The Committee approved the following policy: "Coordination of and action upon requests received from other nations for intelligence and intelligence material under U.S. control in Japan or in areas in the Far East and Pacific formerly occupied by the Japanese and now under American command should be effected by CINCPAC or CINCPAC, each in his respective area of authority, acting under policy guidance of the State, War and Navy Departments".

Five rules are cited in the paper for general guidance in implementation.

United States Policy in Regard to the Adoption of a New Japanese Constitution (SWNCC 226/8)

The Committee approved the policy statement to be forwarded to the U.S. Member on FEC for guidance in the preparation of a statement for the Commission. Briefly the policy states:

The Far Eastern Commission has the right to pass upon the new Japanese Constitution to determine whether it is consistent with the provisions of the Potsdam Declaration and of pertinent policy decisions of the Far Eastern Commission.

British Request for Publications Regarding the Atomic Bomb Tests (SWNCC 248/8)

The Committee approved the draft memorandum for the British Joint Staff Mission stating:

The information requested in your memorandum of 4 April 1946 is an integral part of the operations plan of Joint Task Force One. Accordingly, the Joint Chiefs of Staff have directed the Commander, Joint Task Force One, to furnish the British Joint Staff Mission with four copies of his Operations Plan, including Annexes.

Interim Procedures for Supplying Yen to Representatives of Allied Governments in Japan (SWNCC 259/8)

The Committee approved the proposed message to SCAP by the Joint Chiefs of Staff as an interim directive and the transmittal of the paper to the U.S. Member, FEC, for information.

This directive cancels previous instructions, leaving SCAP to determine appropriate amounts for issue to representatives of Allied governments. He will also maintain a detailed record of all yen advances and submit monthly report to the Joint Chiefs of Staff containing detailed statement of amounts of yen currency furnished.

Applicability of Proposed Japanese Extraordinary Tax Laws to Non-Japanese Individuals and Corporations (SWNCC 281/8)

The Committee, after reconsideration of a previous approved policy on this matter, because of the unfavorable reception from all of the other members of the FEC, approved a policy statement

for presentation to the FEC by the U.S. Member and the forwarding of the paper to SCAP by the Joint Chiefs of Staff as a statement of the U.S. Government's position in this matter. The policy states:

a. No Japanese taxation shall discriminate against aliens.

b. No capital levy shall be imposed by the Japanese authorities on property in or outside of Japan owned by United Nations Nationals. Any capital levy on corporated and unincorporated associations shall be so devised as to exempt from the effects of the levy the shares and interests held by United Nations Nationals.

c. If, in the opinion of SCAP, exceptional circumstances justify the imposition of capital levy on specific United Nations Nationals' property, he will refer the matter for consideration by the FEC.

d. There is no objection to proposed Japanese extraordinary tax laws, other than the capital levy, and which are designed to capture profits and other increments arising out of the war from being applicable to non-Japanese individuals and corporations, including property vested in the German External Property Commission, except that property, regardless of the nationality of its owner, the title of which rests with SCAP and which will be removed for reparations, shall be exempted from the tax law in question.

WAR BOOTY (SWNEG 210)

The Committee approved the following:

a. No distinction should be made between war booty and other types of Japanese external assets as they may be applied to the fulfillment of recognized and approved national reparations claims, providing that simultaneous agreement be reached that:

- (1) All countries at war with Japan may retain all types of Japanese property, under their administrative control, existing within their territories on the date of Japanese capitulation, or removed to their countries prior to 1 June 1946, and that no unilateral removals will be made by any country after that date.

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- 5 -

(2) Japanese external assets cited above should be offset against total national percentage shares of total Japanese assets, both those within Japan declared available for reparations and those outside Japan; and

(3) All countries at war with Japan should supply to the reparations agency for Japan inventories of all types of Japanese property held by them except for military supplies and equipment actually destroyed.

(4) The proposals here made shall be limited in their application to Japanese assets and not be construed as a waiver of claim to property of United Nations Nationals seized as war booty.

5. Prior to submittal of above proposals to FIC, State Department should secure agreement of U.S.G.A. that above propositions be accepted as policy of the two governments and that all Japanese assets at present in Korea are to be retained there and held in trust for the Korean people. After reaching this agreement U.S. member of FIC should present this policy to the Commission.

Consular Establishments in the U.S. Zone of Korea (RUCS 314)

The Committee approved the dispatch of a message by the Joint Chiefs of Staff to General MacArthur and General Hodge notifying them it has been decided that in appropriate instances foreign Battalions will be authorized to establish consulates in Korea under Theater Commander's control and with reduced staffs. British and Chinese Governments would be notified by the State Department. Other foreign governments would be handled individually only after being referred to the Theater for comment.





Subject: Resumption of French Customs and Frontier
Control over United States Personnel.

With reference to your SM-5844, dated 25 May 1946, the Department of State has informed the State-War-Navy Coordinating Committee as follows:

"Insofar as it may be affected by the proposal, the Department of State is in agreement with the views of the Joint Chiefs of Staff on the resumption of French customs and frontier control over United States personnel insofar as they approve the suggestions contained in CM-IN-3881 and call for additional exemptions with respect to bearers of official documents and to official United States shipments. This would appear to be largely a military matter, since such civilians as enjoy immunities of this nature by the terms of the French Civil Affairs agreements of 1944 are attached to our military forces. Where Department of State personnel is concerned, no necessity is perceived for such of those as may be assimilated to the armed forces to receive special immunities which they do not already receive under existing non-military arrangements.

"With respect to the reservation of the Joint Chiefs of Staff concerning the permanent surrender of immunities secured by the terms of the French Civil Affairs agreements of 1944, the Department of State believes that this point might perhaps be satisfactorily covered by the inclusion in the new agreement of a stipulation to the effect that it is operative until further notice."

"As Rear Admiral Roscoe E. Schuirmann, U.S.N., has relieved Vice Admiral Glasford of his naval duties in Germany, it is now requested that the designation of Rear Admiral Schuirmann as senior U. S. Representative on the Tripartite Naval Commission be confirmed and that the Department of State inform the other governments concerned of the change in the U. S. representation on the Commission and furnish Admiral Schuirmann, for his guidance, the agreed principles as listed in Article IV of the Protocol of the Conference of Berlin."

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**IV. - Disposal of the German Navy
and Merchant Marine**

A.

The following principles for the distribution of the German Navy were agreed:

- (1) The total strength of the German surface Navy, excluding ships sunk and those taken over from Allied Nations, but including ships under construction or repair, shall be divided equally among the U.S.S.R., U.K., and U.S.A.
- (2) Ships under construction or repair mean those ships whose construction or repair may be completed within three to six months, according to the type of ship. Whether such ships under construction or repair shall be completed or repaired shall be determined by the technical commission appointed by the Three Powers and referred to below, subject to the principle that their completion or repair must be achieved within the time limits above provided, without any increase of skilled employment in the German shipyards and without permitting the reopening of any German ship building or connected industries. Completion date means the date when a ship is able to go out on its first trip, or, under peacetime standards, would refer to the customary date of delivery by shipyard to the Government.
- (3) The larger part of the German submarine fleet shall be sunk. Not more than thirty submarines shall be preserved and divided equally between the U.S.S.R., U.K., and U.S.A., for experimental and technical purposes.
- (4) All stocks of armament, ammunition and supplies of the German Navy appertaining to the vessels transferred pursuant to paragraphs (1) and (2) hereof shall be handed over to the respective powers receiving such ships.
- (5) The Three Governments agree to constitute a tripartite naval commission comprising two repre-

representatives for each Government, accompanied by the requisite staff, to submit agreed recommendations to the Three Governments for the allocation of specific German warships and to handle other detailed matters arising out of the agreement between the Three Governments regarding the German fleet. The Commission will hold its first meeting not later than 15th August, 1945, in Berlin, which shall be its headquarters. Each Delegation on the Commission will have the right on the basis of reciprocity to inspect German warships wherever they may be located.

- (3) The Three Governments agreed that transfers, including those of ships under construction and repair, shall be completed as soon as possible, but not later than 15th February, 1946. The Commission will submit fortnightly reports, including proposals for the progressive allocation of the vessels when agreed by the Commission.

B.

The following principles for the distribution of the German Merchant Marine were agreed:-

- (1) The German Merchant Marine, surrendered to the Three Powers and wherever located, shall be divided equally among the U.S.S.R., the U.K., and the U.S.A. The actual transfers of the ships to the respective countries shall take place as soon as practicable after the end of the war against Japan. The United Kingdom and the United States will provide out of their shares of the surrendered German merchant ships appropriate amounts for other Allied States whose merchant marines have suffered heavy losses in the common cause against Germany, except that the Soviet Union shall provide out of its share for Poland.
- (2) The allocation, manning, and operation of these ships during the Japanese War period shall fall under the cognizance and authority of the Combined Shipping Adjustment Board and the United Maritime Authority.

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- 3 -

- (3) While actual transfer of the ships shall be delayed until after the end of the war with Japan, a Tripartite Shipping Commission shall inventory and value all available ships and recommend a specific distribution in accordance with paragraph (1).
- (4) German inland and coastal ships determined to be necessary to the maintenance of the basic German peace economy by the Allied Control Council of Germany shall not be included in the shipping pool thus divided among the Three Powers.
- (5) The Three Governments agree to constitute a tripartite merchant marine commission comprising two representatives for each Government, accompanied by the requisite staff, to submit agreed recommendations to the Three Governments for the allocation of specific German merchant ships and to handle other detailed matters arising out of the agreement between the Three Governments regarding the German merchant ships. The Commission will hold its first meeting not later than September 1st, 1946, in Berlin, which shall be its headquarters. Each delegation on the Commission will have the right on the basis of reciprocity to inspect the German merchant ships wherever they may be located.
