


Seed

Program innovation starts from various community channels (IdeaLab, Grants, Partnerships, affiliates)




Refining the core model for change and activities for the program. Beginning to apply the program into different contexts

Recruit, Retain and Grow Community Mentors

Develop **groups of empowered community leaders** to help grow and scale programs

Potential Ideas

- Leadership development program for community mentors: Leadership curriculum, training in peer support, program learning resources
- Systematized Wikimedia skill-building resources: Pitches, onboarding program leaders, invitations
- Technical consultations with affiliates on best practices and support needed for their communities: Learning circles, site visits, survey support, program design and evaluation

Program & Learning Infrastructure

Provide needed infrastructure for "growth to scale" programs

Potential Ideas

- Global Programs and Events Dashboard
- Question/Response forum or tool for program leaders
- Connect institutional partners with community partners for stronger and more integrated programs.
- Targeted support for stronger and more integrated Education, Libraries, GLAM and other programs
- Learning platform for connecting community leaders and for curating knowledge products (case studies, research, blogs, etc.)

Communities of Practice

Facilitate **community exchange and collaborative learning** across program leaders and affiliates by connecting people to people and people to content

Potential Ideas

- Collaborative working groups for shared learning projects, focus areas, and problem-solving for growing programs and communities. (Examples: Evaluation, Community Engagement practices, understanding impact.)
- Components of the <u>Communities of Practice model</u> tested and applied to our online community building model
- Campaigns to improve documentation, knowledge sharing and identify potential new leaders in communities

Potential Ideas

- Co-created definitions and understanding of impact to give communities a
 picture of what healthy programs and communities look like
- Support use of surveys to increase learning about community needs, strengths and opportunities for growth and impact.
