Community Colleges Spotlighted

The establishment of a Coordinating Council on Two-year College-RIT Articulation and the reorganization of the Center for Community College Faculty Development have been announced by Dr. Todd H. Bullard, provost and vice president for Academic Affairs.

The council on two-year college-RIT articulation will act as a referral body to solve articulation problems, establish guidelines for visits to two-year college campuses and for two-year college personnel visiting RIT, act as a sounding board within the Institute and elsewhere to identify the needs and implications of RIT-community college relations, and aid in the development and evaluation of research activities relating to Community Colleges.

The name of the Center for Community College Faculty Development is changed to the Center for Community Junior College Relations. Two offices will operate within the Center: The Office of Faculty Development and the Office of Community Junior College Articulation. Dr. Richard Rinehart will become director of the Center and of the Office of Faculty Development. Dr. David E. Hooten will direct the Office of Community Junior College Articulation, in addition to his duties as director of the Summer Session.

The membership of the Coordinating Council will include: Rinehart; Dale F. Gibson, College of Business; Silvio DeCristofaro, College of Continuing Education; Douglas M. Marshall, College of Engineering; Neil Hoffman, College of Fine and Applied Arts; Leona Irsch, College of General Studies; David A. Engdahl, College of Graphic Arts and Photography (SPAS); Andrew V. Johnson, College of Graphic Arts and Photography (Printing); Thomas P. Wallace, College of Science; E. Ross Stuckless, National Technical Institute for the Deaf; John F. Adams, School of Applied Science; E. Louis Guard, Admissions and Records; Richard D. Zakia, Instructional Research & Development; John L. Gunter, Department of Computer Science; Major David Root, Department of Military Science, and Paul Kazmierski, Reading & Study Clinic.

Ex official members will include: Todd H. Bullard, provost and vice president for Academic Affairs; Thomas R. Plough, coordinator of Academic Advisement; W. Douglas Hoover, director, Student Aid, and Hooten.

Members of the council will become familiar with the two-year college, its academic, fiscal, and administrative structures, its goals and philosophies, and types of courses and curriculum. Arrangements will be made through the Office of Community Junior College Articulation to keep council members abreast of these matters. An important outgrowth of the work of the council will be to broaden the number of RIT faculty and staff who understand the two-year college and its mission.


'The Coordinating Council is of great potential importance to the Institute as we attempt to relate to the two-year college phenomenon. I urge strong support of this new agency," Dr. Bullard said.

This reorganization does not call for additions to the staff of RIT, but will permit the better utilization of talents now available.
