Articles in Warrant for Annual Town Meeting, March 1, 1915.

Article 1. To choose a Moderator.

Art. 2. To choose a Town Clerk.

Art. 3. To hear and act on all reports presented at said meeting.

Art. 4. To choose all necessary Town Officers to serve the town the ensuing year.

Art. 5. To vote "Yes" or "No" on the question: "Shall License be granted for the sale of intoxicating liquors in this town.

Art. 6. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges the ensuing year.

Art. 7. To see if the town will raise and appropriate a sum for the observance of Memorial Day

Art. 8. To see if the town will vote to change the date of the Annual meeting.

Art. 9. To take action in regard to the collection of Taxes.

Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Treasurer with the approval of the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of the revenue of the current financial year.
