ASTER Wilt Resistant Giant Comet Illusion. A soft pastel shade of apricot pink, especially fine for cutting and most effective when used in combination with some blue flower, such as Cynoglossum (Chinese Forget-Me-Not). Plants are two feet tall, upright growth. Since the individual stems are short, it is customary to cut a whole plant as a unit when using flowers. ## NEW MARIGOLDS

Tom Thumb Golden Crown. This is a dwarf form of the well known Guinea Gold. Plants grow only 10 in . high with bright golden yellow flowers, flushed with orange and of the same elegant shape and firm substance and are produced in great abundance, often 25 to 30 on a full grown plant. ## LILIES FROM SEED

The seed can be sown almost anytime, in flats, pans or pots. The soil should be a porous loam of good fertility with no raw manures. A compost of rotted sod and sharp sand, with well rotted organic matter, cannot be improved upon.

For indoor culture, the seed is not to be covered more than $1 / 4$ inch with a sandy soil. When large enough to handle, the seedlings should be pricked off into 2 inch pots, and then set out after danger of frost is over.

Some lilies have the habit, under somc circumstances, of waiting until the second year before top growth takes place. Often germination takes place the first ycar with no growth above the surface.

Lilies can be transplanted at almost any stage of development. They are not exacting in the types of soils to which they are adapted, except that it be porous. They do not like a baked, plastic clay, or lean, loose sands, unless such soils are ameliorated by the incorporation of an abundance of organic matter which changes their substance.

## ACHIMENES

This is closely related to the gloxinia. Plant 6 to 7 bulbs in a 5 -inch pot, or 9 to 10 in a 6 -inch pot. The soil used for potting should be rich in humus and of an open, porous nature, allowing perfect drainage. A good mixture to use is equal parts of loam, leaf mold and sand. About one-third of the depth of the pots or pans should be occupied with drainage. After the young growth appears, great care should be taken to keep the soil moist, for a single severe drying will ruin the plant. Blooming time 8 to 10 weeks after planting.
