CONDITIONS OF SALE

1. Any bid which is merely a nominal or fractional advance may be rejected by the auctioneer, if, in his judgment, such bid would be likely to affect the sale injuriously.

2. The highest bidder shall be the buyer, and if any dispute arise between two or more bidders, the auctioneer shall either decide the same or put up for re-sale the lot so in dispute.

3. Payment shall be made of all or such part of the purchase money as may be required, and the names and addresses of the purchasers shall be given immediately on the sale of every lot, in default of which the lot so purchased shall be immediately put up again and re-sold.

Payment of that part of the purchase money not made at the time of sale shall be made within ten days thereafter, in default of which the undersigned may either continue to hold the lots at the risk of the purchaser and take such action as may be necessary for the enforcement of the sale, or may at public or private sale, and without other than this notice, re-sell the lots for the benefit of such purchaser, and the deficiency (if any) arising from such re-sale shall be a charge against such purchaser.

4. Delivery of any purchase will be made only upon payment of the total amount due for all purchases at the sale.

Deliveries will be made on sales days between the hours of 9 A. M. and 1 P. M., and on other days—except holidays—between the hours of 9 A. M. and 5 P. M.

Delivery of any purchase will be made only at the American Art Galleries, or other place of sale, as the case may be, and only on presenting the bill of purchase.

Delivery may be made, at the discretion of the Association, of any purchase during the session of the sale at which it was sold.

5. Shipping, boxing or wrapping of purchases is a business in which the Association is in no wise engaged, and will not be performed by the Association for purchasers. The Association will, however, afford to purchasers every facility for employing at current and reasonable rates carriers and packers; doing so, however, without any assumption of responsibility on its part for the acts and charges of the parties engaged for such service.

6. Storage of any purchase shall be at the sole risk of the purchaser. Title passes upon the fall of the auctioneer's hammer, and thereafter, while the Association will exercise due caution in caring

for and delivering such purchase, it will not hold itself responsible if such purchase be lost, stolen, damaged or destroyed.

Storage charges will be made upon all purchases not removed within ten days from the date of the sale thereof.

7. **Guarantee** is not made either by the owner or the Association of the correctness of the description, genuineness or authenticity of any lot, and no sale will be set aside on account of any incorrectness, error of cataloguing, or any imperfection not noted. Every lot is on public exhibition one or more days prior to its sale, after which it is sold "as is" and without recourse.

The Association exercises great care to catalogue every lot correctly, and will give consideration to the opinion of any trustworthy expert to the effect that any lot has been incorrectly catalogued, and, in its judgment, may either sell the lot as catalogued or make mention of the opinion of such expert, who thereby would become responsible for such damage as might result were his opinion without proper foundation.

1—BLUE AND WHITE SNUFF BOTTLE

With all-over decoration of leaves, a five-clawed dragon and the sacred symbol. Four-character mark.

2—BLUE AND WHITE PORCELAIN SNUFF BOTTLE

Cylindrical. With Chinese historical subject in dark blue. Pink crystal stopper. K'ang-hsi.

3—BLUE AND WHITE PORCELAIN TWIN SNUFF BOTTLE

With decoration of a boy feeding birds beneath a pine tree. K'ang-hsi.

4—BLUE AND WHITE SNUFF BOTTLE

Cylindrical. With decoration of boys and broken jar. Ch'ien Lung.

5—PAIR OF BLUE AND WHITE SNUFF BOTTLES

Soft paste. Jar shape. With dragon, waves and fret in blue. Fine netted brown crackle.

6—BLUE AND WHITE PORCELAIN SNUFF BOTTLE

Jar shape. With decoration of mandarin and attendants in a garden. Four-character mark of Ch'ien Lung period.

7—FAMILLE VERTE SNUFF BOTTLE

Decoration of boys playing games and flying kites, in brilliantly colored enamels. K'ang-hsi.

8—PORCELAIN SNUFF BOTTLE

Bottle-shape. With short neck. Decorated with a mountainous landscape, flying geese and a man fishing, in blue and peach. Eighteenth century.

9—PORCELAIN SNUFF BOTTLE

Gallipot shape. With decoration of a warrior with attendants, in peachbloom coloring. Eighteenth century.

10—TWO PORCELAIN SNUFF BOTTLES

One, gallipot shape, of rice color and with fine crackle; the other, flattened ovoid, with Emperor and Empress with attendants in colored enamel. Ch'ien Lung.

11—TWO PORCELAIN SNUFF BOTTLES

One, cylindrical, with decoration of a cicada in brilliant enamels; the other, flattened ovoid, with similar decoration. Tao Kuang.

12—PORCELAIN SNUFF BOTTLE

Cylindrical, with decoration of Mongolians, train of camels and rocky landscape in blue and *sang-de-bœuf*. Bands about neck and shoulder in blue.

13—TWO PORCELAIN SNUFF BOTTLES

One, cylindrical, with peachbloom decoration of fishermen beneath a pine tree; the other, with an old pine tree.

14—PORCELAIN TWIN SNUFF BOTTLE

Gallipot-shape. With dark peachbloom glaze.

15—PORCELAIN SNUFF BOTTLE

Green glaze. With carved decoration of Dog Foo in colored enamels. Ch'ien Lung.

16—PORCELAIN SNUFF BOTTLE

Imperial yellow glaze. With fine crackle. Ch'ien Lung.

17—PORCELAIN SNUFF BOTTLE

White, without glaze. With decoration of a bird on a branch. Ch'ien Lung.

18—CARVED PORCELAIN SNUFF BOTTLE

Dark blue glaze. With leaf ornamentation of phoenix and dragon. Ch'ien Lung.

19—PORCELAIN SNUFF BOTTLE

Turquoise-blue glaze. With leaf ornamentation of Dogs Foo in blue, green and red enamel. Chia Ch'ing.

20—CARVED PORCELAIN SNUFF BOTTLE

With leaf ornamentation of figures and landscapes painted and enameled. Chia Ch'ing.

21—PORCELAIN SNUFF BOTTLE

Mottled green and black glaze. With reserve decoration of immortals, pines and rocks. Ch'ien Lung.

22—PORCELAIN SNUFF BOTTLE

Gallipot-shape. With dragon in blue amid cloud forms in mottled red. Mark in blue (Made in the Hall of Careful Virtue).

23—PAIR OF PORCELAIN SNUFF BOTTLES

Square form. Dark-green glaze with decoration of flowers and scroll in green and rose and with reserved fan-shape panels with birds and branches in colored enamels. Ch'ien Lung.

24—BLUE AND WHITE LARGE SNUFF BOTTLE

Semi-soft paste. With decoration of figures in a garden in dark blue. Mark apocryphal.

25—GLASS SNUFF BOTTLE

Gourd shape. Milk-white glass, with applied decoration of gourds and vines in colors. Ch'ien Lung.

26—CAMPHOR GLASS SNUFF BOTTLE

Flattened oviform. Ch'ien Lung.

27—IMPERIAL YELLOW GLASS SNUFF BOTTLE

Flattened ovoid. Ch'ien Lung.

28—JADE SNUFF BOTTLE

Pale lavender with decoration of a single butterfly. Ch'ien Lung.

29—GREEN AND GRAY JADEITE SNUFF BOTTLE

Flattened jar-shape. With carved decoration of lotus. Ch'ien Lung.

30—JADE SNUFF BOTTLE

Flattened vase-shape. With amethyst and green spots. Ch'ien Lung.

31—GRAY AGATE SNUFF BOTTLE

Vase-shape. With high shoulder. Ch'ien Lung.

32—JADEITE SNUFF BOTTLE

Flattened oviform. With mottled colorings of green and gray. Ch'ien Lung.

33—AGATE SNUFF BOTTLE

With relief carving in the matrix of a mythical animal and bat. Ch'ien Lung.

34—CRYSTAL GLASS SNUFF BOTTLE

With intricate inner painting of distinguished travelers and a snow-covered landscape. Ch'ien Lung.

35—MOTTLED JADE SNUFF BOTTLE

With relief ornamentation of a deer beneath a pine tree and rocky landscape with figures. Ming.

36—CARVED AGATE SNUFF BOTTLE

Gourd-shape. Reddish-brown agate, with relief ornamentation of gourd, vine and bat. Ch'ien Lung.

37—MOTTLED BROWN AGATE SNUFF BOTTLE

With moss markings in slate-blue. Ch'ien Lung.

38—MOTTLED RED AND YELLOW GLASS SNUFF BOTTLE

Compressed pear-shape. Ch'ien Lung.

39—MOTTLED AGATE DOUBLE SNUFF BOTTLE

With unusual markings in dull red and brown. Ch'ien Lung.

40—AGATE SNUFF BOTTLE

Gray texture, with natural markings in brown. Carved to represent a raven on rocks.

41—CARVED PINK CORAL SNUFF BOTTLE

With relief ornamentation of boy, squirrel and flowering plant. Ch'ien Lung.

42—CARVED PINK CORAL SNUFF BOTTLE

Irregular shape. With relief ornamentation of Dogs Foo. Ch'ien Lung.

43—CARVED MALACHITE SNUFF BOTTLE

Double gourd-shape. With relief ornamentation of gourd vine.

Rich green with black markings. Vine in relief. Ch'ien Lung.
- 45—CARVED AGATE SNUFF BOTTLE
Chestnut brown with low relief carving of lotus, monster head and ring handles. Ch'ien Lung.
- 46—LIGHT-BROWN AGATE SNUFF BOTTLE
With figure of a juggler carved in matrix of slightly darker tone. Ch'ien Lung.
- 47—CARVED BROWN AMBER SNUFF BOTTLE
Melon-shape. With vine ornamentation in low relief. Ch'ien Lung.
- 48—CARVED RED AMBER SNUFF BOTTLE
With panel decoration of conventional leaf scrolls and sacred symbol. Ch'ien Lung.
- 49—AMBER GLASS SNUFF BOTTLE
With fine crackle. Ch'ien Lung.
- 50—CARVED SOAPSTONE SNUFF BOTTLE
Incised. With additional applied decoration of boys and Dogs Foo in ivory, agate and malachite. Ch'ien Lung.
- 51—FEI-T'SUI JADE SNUFF BOTTLE
Bottle shape. Mottled green and white with dark markings. Carved decoration of dragons amid cloud forms. Ch'ien Lung.
- 52—DARK-BROWN CRYSTAL SNUFF BOTTLE
Square form. With an immortal and pine carved in white matrix.

53—CARVED AGATE SNUFF BOTTLE

Flattened ovoid. Rich brown agate with an equestrian figure and flag carved in the yellow matrix. Ch'ien Lung.

54—DARK-GREEN JADE SNUFF BOTTLE

Square form. With fine black marking. Ch'ien Lung.

55—FEI-T'SUI JADE SNUFF BOTTLE

Flattened pilgrim bottle-shape. With emerald-green and clouded gray and white markings. Ch'ien Lung.

56—JADE SNUFF BOTTLE

Flattened pilgrim bottle-shape. With emerald-green and gray markings. Ch'ien Lung.

57—AGATE SNUFF BOTTLE

Green with brown markings. Grotesque animal and ring handles in low relief.

58—CAMEO GLASS LARGE SNUFF BOTTLE

With bold relief carvings of symbols, bat and grotesque animal head bands in red on a white ground.

59—CARVED MOTHER-OF-PEARL SNUFF BOTTLE

Relief ornamentation of fish and bat handles. Ch'ien Lung.

60—CLOISONNÉ SNUFF BOTTLE

Gourd-shape. Turquoise-blue ground, with butterflies and flowers in colored enamels. Ming. (Slightly imperfect.)

61—SILVER SNUFF BOTTLE

With inlaid ornamentation of semi-precious stones.

Peachbloom, with green flecks.

63—MINIATURE GALLIPOT AND COUPE

Former, metallic brown glaze; the latter with peachbloom and celadon.

Pear-shape, with slender neck. K'ang-hsi.
