

In a paper published at Wolf City, Texas, we find the following notice of the death of Mr. A. H. Durham, a brother of our worthy tax collector, Mr. D. M. Durham. The deceased was reared in our county and has numerous friends and acquaintances here who will greatly regret his death. The paper, above referred to, gives the following account: "Mr. A. H. Durham, an old citizen of Hunt county, died at his home three miles southeast of this city, Sunday morning at 3 o'clock, after a lingering illness. Mr. Durham was a man of irreproachable character, square and upright in all his dealings, and enjoyed the respect and admiration of all who knew him. For several years he served the people as county commissioner, and in that capacity proved an efficient and earnest guardian of the general interests of the county.

The burial took place in Mt. Carmel cemetery Sunday evening at 4 o'clock, the services being conducted by Rev. R. C. Pender. There was a large crowd in attendance, showing, in some degree, the feelings of the people toward their deceased friend and neighbor. *July 13, 1893*
