CASUALTIES ON RAILWAYS

More Than Eleven Hundred Persons Killed in United States in Three Months.

Washington, July 23.—The accident bulletin, which has just been issued by the Interstate Commerce Commission, for three months ending March 31st, 1906, shows the total number of casualties to passengers and employees to be 18,286 (1,126 killed and 17,170 injured).

The number of persons killed in train accidents was 274. The total number of collisions and derailments was 2,400 (1,221 collisions and 1,179 derailments) of which 289 collisions and 167 derailments affected passenger trains.

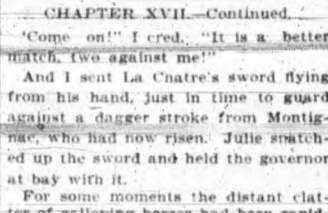
