Cultivating in garden  
in A.M. Rode in town

which by mistake of Mr. Es-  
tadillo was not checked  
out of my funds as direc-  
ted on the 26 of Jan'y.

Gilmor Davis came  
out to settle his note - made  
an appointment with W. G.  
W. Utts L.H. Utts  
Ordered a buggy for Mr. But-  
ler at Pacific Livery Sta-  
ble - for tomorrow -

Friday 13. March 74
